The Surrey second string had the better of Tuesday's play at the Oval, and, passing the visitors' score for the loss of three batsmen, held at the drawing of stumps an advantage of 114, with six wickets in hand. Wiltshire put together 230 in two innings and a quarter, after losing at one for 34, Stancomb and Matthews adding 81 for the fourth, whilst Davenport and Cowlishaw (of Bradford, a recruit for the county) were responsible for 53 for the sixth. Davenport hit a 5 and seven 4's. Blackidge, with six victims for less than a dozen runs apiece, was easily the most successful of the five bowlers tried.

Upon Surrey batting, Harrison left at 37, but then W. J. Abel resisted Myers to increase the total by 410 for the second wicket. Surrey maintained their overnight advantage on Wednesday, and defeated the visitors by an innings and 10 runs. With six wickets in hand and leading by 114 the remaining Surrey batsmen were not disposed of until the total had reached 489, Sandham being responsible for a carefully compiled 104, which included one 5 and twelve 4's. Wiltshire, on a half-hearted fashion, only Taunton and Davenport showing form and meeting the attack with confidence. Abel secured six wickets for 54. Scores—
