DURHAM v. NORTHUMBERLAND.

R. Harrison, more successful in gaining runs for the county eleven than he has been this season for North Durham, the club to which he is attached as professional, played a fine innings for the Durham eleven, on Monday, at Chester-le-Street, in the opening day's play of the return match with Northumberland. The Duncelmians, for whom Proud tossed in the temporary absence of C. Y. Adamson, had the good fortune to gain the choice of innings. Though he may have had some doubts about taking his men in first on a wicket well saturated with rain on the two previous days, he adopted the really wisest policy in deciding to take first innings. In the opening play the wicket played easily, and continued to do so until the luncheon interval, but it always had the appearance of being a pitch bound to turn treacherous in the warm weather and sunshine, and expectations in this respect were realised before an eventful day's play was finished.

The Duncelmians fared famously in just under two hours' cricket before the luncheon interval, 199 runs being scored by them with only four men dismissed, a rate of run-getting mainly showing most attractive play. H. Brooks and Hendren ran up 50 for the first wicket, and it was then that Harrison, joining Brooks, commenced his great display. The second wicket might have been captured shortly after the fall of the first, Brooks being missed when he had made 25 by Bell at point off the bowling of Milne. The century had been passed by seven runs before Brooks was dismissed, his 52 being the sixth score in succession he has made for his county ranging from 50 to 99.

Harrison, next partnered by C. Y. Adamson, was hitting out in lively style, and he reached his 50 with a 6 off Norbury after being in an hour, with the score then 147. At 167 he lost Adamson, and was not long assisted by H. L. Dales, who was fourth out at 183. At the luncheon interval, when the score was 190, Harrison had made 87, and his partner then, A. P. Ashley, 7. Afterwards Harrison reached his century with the score advanced to 317, and now hitting out recklessly he succeeded in running up 145 before he was fifth out at 270. At the wickets two hours and five minutes, a period showing how quick had been his rate of scoring, Harrison altogether hit eight 6's (five off Milne, one off Skinner and two off Norbury) and fifteen 4's. All the wickets up to this stage had fallen to the bowling of Milne, who sent down 32 overs before being given a rest. Except that A. P. Ashley stayed until the score had travelled to 322, when he was eighth out, his capitally played 44 including eight 4's, there was no feature of consequence in the remainder of Durham's innings, which in three hours and a quarter realised 230, a winning foundation on a wicket looking certain to become tricky before the day's play was done. The Northumberland fieldsmen bore their outing well, some good catches being effected, Anderson brizzing about the dismissal of Harrison with a well-held catch in the long field, and making another clever catch at deep slip which dismissed J. J. Common.

Expectations were that Northumberland would have a stern tussle to avert a follow-on when going in shortly before 4 o'clock in response to Durham's fine total, but surely not even Durham's most ardent admirers anticipated anything in the nature of the complete change in the play that followed. When C. F. Stanger-Leathes was clean bowled at 10 by Morris, and S. Anderson and J. S. Nesbit with successive balls by Thackeray at 16, troublous times were seen to be in store for Northumberland. Recovery was never made from these early disasters, and Morris proving quite unplayable, as he has often done at Chester-le-Street, the innings realised but 82 runs, Morris claiming eight of the wickets for 23 runs.

Following on, Northumberland did better, but not to a sufficient extent to make their position any other than a hopeless one, for with five wickets down for 108 runs they are still 160 behind. Norbury, in his second innings, relieved the monotony of failures with some free hitting, his principal strokes in his innings of 45 being two 6's and five 4's.

A collection was taken on the ground in the afternoon on behalf of Thackeray, the Chester-le-Street professional, whose annual benefit game on Saturday last had to be abandoned owing to rain, and a sum of £11 6s was realised. Scores:—
