**EXCITING FINISH.**

**MONMOUTHSHIRE'S FINE WIN.**

**WILTSHIRE DEFEATED BY SIX RUNS.**  
 There was a most exciting finish to the Minor Counties match between Monmouthshire and Wiltshire at Newport today. Overnight, Wiltshire led by 10 runs on the first innings, and Monmouthshire, who had lost four wickets for 25, had carried their score to 35 when stumps were drawn. Upon resumption Monmouthshire could only total 107, which left Wiltshire to get only 98 to win. This task, however, proved too much for them. Gordon Phillips and Kenneth Raikes bowled unchanged, lunch intervening, and when within 7 runs of victory, Raikes again bowled Pinfield, who had hit out badly, and made a gallant effort to win. Raikes took five wickets for 52, and Gordon Phillips five for 30.

**Wiltshire v. Monmouth.**

**Wiltshire lose by Six Runs.**

The cricket match between Wiltshire and Monmouth terminated as Newports on Wednesday. At one period Wiltshire appeared to be getting well on top in the early part of the game, as Monmouth's seventh wicket fell with the score only totalling 81, but the tall wicket fell merrily, and their innings closed for 171. Mitchell took seven for 72, and Overton bowled better than his analysis indicated. Wiltshire made their usual poor start, Awdry being caught with one on the board, and Trotman being bowled one run later. Taunton played prettily for a time before being caught and bowled by Newman, and Perkins made a short stand until the former was bowled by Raikes. Overton opened with a good promise, and runs came at a rapid rate, 50 being added in a short time. Mitchell, the last man, eased the Monmouth total to be passed; but the innings closed just after, with Wiltshire leading by 10 runs on the first innings.

Monmouth, in the 50 minutes' remaining play, made a very poor show.

On resuming play on Thursday Wiltshire further improved their chances by Mitchell dismissing Diver with but 1 run added to his score. The innings closed for 107 runs, leaving Wiltshire 98 to win.

Awdry and Whittaker commenced the attack, and after giving a chance Awdry was caught for 7, and the new man, Newman, was dismissed with only 1 to his credit. Wickets fell rapidly, Taunton and Whittaker retiring before 30 was signalled. Perkins stayed for some time, but did not appear to be comfortable. He gave a chance when 7 in the slips to Silverlock. The 50 was recorded with six good wickets down, and the game was veering round in Monmouth's favour, with prospects of an exciting finish.

Trotman was the next to go with a cypher on the score-sheet. Pinfield stayed until lunch time with the "tail" showing 98, which left Wiltshire with 30 to get and two wickets to fall.

This they failed to accomplish, as Pinfield was dismissed when matters had reached a high pitch of excitement, and Wiltshire thus lost by 6 runs. Phillips and Raikes bowled remarkably well for the winners, the former capturing five for 30, which on a hard wicket was a capital performance. Scores:—

is of similar length. Warwickshire's revival has been the event of the season, and, should they finish at the top of the table, great would be the rejoicing all over the country.

It was a delightful match at the Oval last week-end. All the Yorkshiremen in town were there and some I met who had actually journeyed from the North for this match. There is nothing like such enthusiasm in the South. Yorkshiremen do believe in Yorkshiremen. And the crowd rolled up just as if the two counties had been in the running for the Championship. It was a sincere pleasure to me to exchange a few words with Surrey's old leader, John Shuter, who was an "ideal captain" if ever there was one. And I had as neighbour an old cricketer whose name did not transpire, but who had known the Oval almost from the day when it was transformed from a huge kitchen garden into Surrey's head-quarters. How we did travel over the years of long ago. If this should meet his eye, I should like to thank him for a most delightful afternoon. The feature of this match was the batting of the older hands on both sides. Hayward I have already mentioned; as in all his greatest innings every ball was played hard along the ground, save when he three times lifted it out of the field. Hayes is another "old-un," as cricketers go; and so are Rhodes, Hirst and Denton, who were Yorkshire's chief scorers. None of these men can be spared yet. Denton's catch which got rid of Hayward was worth going miles to see. Fancy Hayward scoring nearly two runs to Hayes's one! The Yorkshire batting on the first day was laboured, as if their recent failure at Leicester haunted them. It was a triumph for Surrey to go in against a total of 372 and pass it by 163. Yorkshire were very fortunate last week to carry home two points from their matches with Middlesex and Surrey, for in another hour both these points would have been cancelled.

Query. If Warwickshire beat Lancashire by an innings and 40 runs, and in the same week Lancashire beat Middlesex by 83 runs, then may not Middlesex thank their stars that they have not to play Warwickshire?
