BUCKS v. CARMARTHEN.

A CENTURY BY N. D. C. ROSS.

This match was played on the Slough ground on Friday and Saturday, G. Fisher, the groundman, providing another splendid wicket. Bucks made two alterations from the team which did so badly against Kent Second, W. L. Jackson, of Wycombe, and N. D. C. Ross, of Slough, taking the places of C. H. Alison and H. Jennison. Carmarthen also had two changes from the side which Berks beat at Reading by over an innings on the previous day, C. S. Trubshaw and S. Mills coming in for P. Rees and Boar. W. B. Franklin captained the Bucks eleven, and beat C. P. Lewis in the toss, the Carmarthen captain having failed to call correctly once this season. Dr. E. Weaver-Adams and W. L. Jackson gave Bucks a good start by putting on 68 for the first wicket. Dr. Adams was then caught at mid-off, having made 33 of the total. Two runs later E. J. Leat was out to another smart catch by Lewis at mid-off, but on N. D. C. Ross joining Jackson a prolonged stand was made, and 100 appeared as a result of 67 minutes play. At the luncheon interval Ross and Jackson were still together, the total being 181 for 2. Jackson had made 73 and Ross 53. Jackson completed his 50 in an hour and 20 minutes, and 150 appeared on the telegraph after an hour and a half's play. After the luncheon interval runs continued to come freely, and 200 were obtained in just two hours. At 217 Jackson's fine innings was ended by Mills securing him off Trubshaw. He had obtained 86 runs by stylish cricket, and played all the bowling with confidence. While showing a stubborn defence he hit any loose balls with great vigour. He was at the wickets two hours and five minutes, his figures including ten 4's and five 3's. With P. W. Le Gros as a partner Ross completed his century with a fine cut, the score being 249. He had been batting an hour and 38 minutes. Three hundred was signalled when the innings had lasted three hours and three-quarters, but as 314 Ross was secured in the long field. He had been at the wickets just over two hours for 144, and had sent the ball to the boundary twenty-five times. Although giving three chances he obtained his runs by hitting freely and confidently. A run later Le Gros left, and half the side was out for 315. T. R. Kent, B. H. G. Shaw, and P. L. Frith all helped the total along, and M. Wright and W. B. Franklin were together when the 400 went up after three and a half hours play. At the tea interval they had each made 28, and the Bucks innings was declared closed with the score 435 for 8 wickets. After their long day in the field Carmarthen gave a weak batting display. H. S. Lockyer and H. Howell put on 36 for the second wicket, and Davies (W.) and E. Gee also reached double figures, but when stumps were drawn eight men were out for 82. Dr. Adams' lobs puzzled the batsmen greatly, while Wright kept a splendid length. On Saturday morning W. B. Franklin, the Bucks captain and wicket-keeper, was unable to play owing to illness, and B. H. G. Shaw, the younger brother of the Marlborough captain, son of the celebrated "E.D.," kept wicket, H. G. Hogarth fielding as substitute. Carmarthen failed to increase their overnight total, Dr. Adams dismissing S. Mills and J. R. Melhuish with successive balls. J. T. Davies and H. Howell batted well in the visitors' second venture, and the last wicket made an unexpected stand, but the innings closed at 2 o'clock for 158, leaving Bucks victorious by an innings and 195 runs. Bucks failed to win a match last season, but this year they had already secured three points for leading Monmouthshire on the first innings. Both these successes were obtained on the Slough ground. **CARMARTHEN'S BAD TIME.
BUCKS RAISE A BIG SCORE AND
DECLARE.**

Continuing their English tour, Carmarthenshire had a firing day in the field against Buckinghamshire at Slough on Friday. Bucks sent up their first 50 after thirty-five minutes' play, but at 68 Adams was finely caught at mid-off by C. P. Lewis. Two runs later Leat fell to another splendid catch by Lewis. Ross was missed off Mills when 56, and the 159 went up. Jackson gave three chances in making his score of 86, and after his dismissal Ross reached the century. Despite the intense heat, Carmarthenshire fielded well, but Ross was at home to all the bowling, and scored with great freedom. He was caught at the wicket after a stay of two hours, for 144. Holland, one of the umpires, was overcome by the heat, and retired, and during the tea interval Bucks declared, with the total of 435 for eight.

Carmarthenshire gave a poor batting display, and seemed quite worn out after their long day in the field and the hard games of the week. Two or three of the side were suffering from injuries, and C.
