WILTS v. DORSET.

The ill-luck which has dogged the steps of the Wilts team this season continued with them in their match with Dorset, which was played at the County Ground, Trowbridge, on Friday and Saturday. On the first day the visitors were disposed of, after some bright cricket, for a total of 171, the largest contributors to which were A. M. Harrison, with 77, J. W. Hardy, with 55, and R. D. Bolton, with 48. Wilts had lost one wicket for 88 at the call of time. Resuming on Saturday morning the "not-out" Warrilow and Whitaker, were soon separated, the former getting his leg in front of a straight one after the pair had added 74. Five were out for a total of 123, but Newman, after being given a hit by Gordon on the boundary, shaped admirably, and Trotman keeping his end up well, runs came freely, the score being taken to 228 before Trotman was caught at the wicket for a valuable 58. At 231 Newman was bowled for a splendid 122. The last wicket fell at 248, thus giving Dorset an advantage of 25 runs. Scores:—

WILTS v. DORSET.

This match was commenced at Trowbridge on Friday on a splendid wicket. Goodden had the good fortune to win the toss, but Dorset lost two wickets for 25. Then Hardy and Bolton made a useful stand, putting on 70 before the latter was caught. Hardy took two hours to make 53, but seven were down for 202. With Manser and Harrison together, however, a lengthy partnership ensued, the pair adding 153 and taking the score to 355. Both men hit hard, but both were let off early. The innings closed for 371. Wilts lost Awdry at 13, but Dorset met with no further success overnight. Warrilow and Whitaker playing carefully, and raising the score to 86 without being separated. On resuming on Saturday morning, however, they were both quickly dismissed, and six wickets were down for 167. When Newman was joined by Trotman, they defied the bowling for two hours, and added 131 before the latter was sniped at the wicket for a splendid 56, made without a chance. Newman, who was badly missed on the boundary by Gordon when 20, continued to bat well, and was deservedly applauded when he reached his century. Runs came freely, and with three wickets in hand Wilts wanted 51 to pass the Dorset total. Soon after, however, Newman was hit, and the total fell 25 short of the visitors, who thus got three points for leading on the first innings. About an hour and a half remained for play, but little interest was taken in it, and when two Dorset men were dismissed stumps were pulled up.

The Wilts fielding was none too good, just enough runs being given away by poor placing of the field to lose the points. The team, too, suffered through the absence of a fast bowler. To play three slow left-hand bowlers—Farebrother, Mitchell, and Overton—on a perfect batsmen's wicket is courting defeat. Surely there is one fast bowler in the county somewhere. Scores:—

and 50, but he bowled with wonderful steadiness, taking wickets in every match but one, and having sixty-six in all at under 25 each. In 1907, though his batting fell off a bit—82* v. Worcestershire, 75 v. Warwickshire, and 52* v. Lancashire were his chief scores—he bowled with great effectiveness. Twelve wickets fell to him for 137 in the match v. Hants at Portsmouth; against Gloucestershire at Taunton he had ten for 107, including five for eight in the second innings; and among his other analyses were seven for 84 v. Worcestershire, six for 42 v. Kent, and six for 82 v. Lancashire. Altogether he had eighty-two wickets at under 21 each.

Beginning 1908 with 11 runs in five successive innings, he never quite ran into his best batting vein, though he scored 102 v. Middlesex at Lord's and 60 against the same side at Taunton, with 57* v. Surrey at the Oval. But he did a lot of fine bowling, achieving a marked success v. Warwickshire at Leamington, where he took fourteen wickets for 161 runs. The 80 wickets he took were more costly than his eighty-two in 1907, though, averaging 27 each.

About this time it looked as though his hard work at the bowling crease might spoil his batting. In the first three months of the 1909 season, he only once topped 50, making 67* v. Gloucestershire at Taunton, when he and Robson hit up 150 runs in 50 minutes. In the same match he had seven wickets for 40 in Gloucestershire's first; and up to August 11th he had done so consistently well with the ball that fifty-five wickets had fallen to him at a cost of less than 15 each. Then, at Taunton, Kent ran up 468, punishing him for 124 runs with the offset of only one wicket, and made the home side follow on nearly 300 in arrears. But Somerset was not beaten. Lewis played the innings of his life. In four and a-half hours he scored 201, gave no chance until he had made 128, and fairly saved the game for his side.

Last season he was always making runs and taking wickets, fighting up-hill fights as if he enjoyed them, and establishing the reputation which led to his being, none too early, accorded a place in a representative team, for the Rest v. England at Lord's a few weeks ago. He did not make a century in 1910, but he played five innings of over 50, and eight more of from 20 to 50; and he took seventy-nine wickets, including fourteen for 141 v. Kent at Tunbridge Wells, and eight for 107 against the same side at Taunton. This season he has made 126 v. Gloucestershire at Taunton, 93 v. Hants at Bath, and 69 v. Yorkshire at Taunton, and has bowled well, taking six for 76 v. Yorkshire at Leeds, nine for 58 v. Hants at Bath, five for 33 v. Middlesex at Bath, and six for 65 v. Gloucestershire at Bristol. But illness hampered him in July, and he has had to stand down for two or three of the August matches owing to an injury to the muscles of his right arm—a sad loss to his side, which could the less be afforded because Robson also was crocked.

There is nothing particularly unorthodox or unusual in Lewis's methods either as batsman or bowler. He scores in most directions, and makes his strokes well; his bowling is fast medium, getting up quickly from the pitch, and with plenty of spin. Up to date (August 31st), he has totalled 7,691 runs in first-class cricket, with an average of 21.72, and has taken 505 wickets at 21.86 each. He has never reached four figures in runs or taken a hundred wickets in a season; but then he has been playing for a side that always has a comparatively brief programme.

Honour to the man who wins matches for his side by pluck and nerve and skill, but higher honour still to him who puts up a great fight in game after game for a team on whom Dame Fortune consistently frowns—and Lewis is a man of that sort, beyond all doubt.
