Cambridgeshire also had the worst of the game with M.C.C. at Lord's later in the week, being defeated by an innings and a small margin. Against so powerful a side as the M.C.C. put into the field the visitors hardly cherished the hope of victory, but they ought to have made a better show with the bat. Cox, of Sussex, for the M.C.C., did deadly work with the ball. Relf, likewise a Sussex man, also rendered valuable aid on behalf of the M.C.C. W. R. Collins, who carried out his bat with 103 to his name, was the most useful batsman for the winners, who in the first innings gained a lead of 156. It was futile to hope that Cambs. would make up this deficiency, and it was almost true to anticipation, as they were got rid of a second time for a moderate score—152. Ling, who put together 59 runs, was the only batsman who showed any likelihood of mastering the bowling.

MIDDLESEX v. SURREY.

Played at Lord's on August 31, September 1 and 2 and won by Middlesex by 353 runs. Surrey were outclassed in all departments of the game and were deservedly beaten. They made many blunders in the field and their batting on a good wicket was inexcusably weak. Tarrant hit ten 4's in his freely-hit 68, but was missed three times, whilst Warner, whose 121 was a masterly innings, should have been out when 23. The latter and Mann put on 83 together. When Middlesex went in the second time they showed that Surrey's collapse was not due to the state of the wicket, for they ran up 330 for five wickets in two hours and three-quarters. Tarrant and Douglas made 128 for the first wicket in 70 minutes, the former, who hit fourteen 4's, claiming 89 of the number. With the younger Hearne in 81 were added for the second wicket, and Mann afterwards made 73 in 42 minutes and carried out his bat. At one period Mann and Hendren put on 54 in 15 minutes. Surrey were given a good start in their second innings, Hayward and Hobbs making 94 for the first wicket, but the rest could do little against Hearne (J. W.), whose nine wickets cost but 82 runs.
