

NOTTS. II. v. LEICESTERSHIRE II.

The two days' match between Notts. II. and Leicestershire II., which commenced at Trent Bridge yesterday, was in a large measure spoilt by rain. Batting first on a slow wicket, Notts. were dismissed by lunch for 94. The highest scorer was Dr. Gauld, who hit all round the wicket for a well-played 27. Weston, for Leicestershire, took four wickets for 25, and was always troublesome.

Leicestershire fared no better than their opponents, and had lost five wickets for 65 at six o'clock, when rain stopped play. Score:—

NOTTS. II. v. LEICESTER II.

Heavy rain overnight had made the wicket so soft at Trent Bridge that it was impossible to resume the two days' match yesterday between Notts. II. and Leicester II. until 2.30.

Leicester, having dismissed Notts. for 94, had scored 65 overnight for the loss of five wickets. Continuing their innings they were soon in trouble, C. A. M. Brown, the only man who had offered resistance, being out in the first over for a well-played 27. The remainder were dismissed for the addition of 29 runs. Notts. only made 65 at the second attempt. This was largely due to the fact that G. O. Gauld was compelled to retire when 13 not out, through being called away on business, and to Beadmore having to catch a train. Left with 71 to get to win the visitors lost eight wickets ere reaching that total. The best bowling of the day was that of Hale, for Leicestershire. He took five wickets for 29 runs; and B. Flint (Notts.), three for 21. Score:—
