Monmouthshire Beaten at the Oval.

Although Monmouthshire batted very consistently at the Oval on Friday and succeeded in averting the innings defeat, Surrey Second Eleven won by ten wickets.

An innings apiece having been completed on the opening day, Monmouthshire entered upon the concluding stage of the game, requiring 223 runs to save the innings defeat. At first it seemed that the task would not be a difficult one, for Lawday and Hodges made so light of the Surrey bowling that the opening partnership produced 61 in half an hour before Lawday was snapped at the wicket. Moreover, the 100 was on the board before another wicket went down. However, after Poulton left, the batting was not so solid, and only the steadiness of Hodges enabled the visitors to put Surrey in again. AN EVEN DRAW AT NEWPORT.

Cardiff Bowler's No-Balls: Raikes and Riches Bat Well.

Perhaps the most remarkable feature of the Newport-Cardiff cricket match at Newport on Saturday was the fact that Trevor Arnott bowled twelve no-balls. He started badly, with four in the first over. Newport batted first, and they scored 201 for seven before they declared. The batting was not sensational, but it was sound and not without enterprise—it always provided entertainment for a good crowd of spectators. K. C. Raikes was top scorer with 41 (not out), and he now has played six innings for Newport, and only once has lost his wicket (against Llanelly), so that his average is 120.

The Cardiff innings opened with Riches and Mathias so apparently masters of the situation that it looked as if they need never get out. Riches was especially strong on the leg side, and showed himself a good judge of the possibilities of short runs, so that 50 went up in 32 minutes. Hodges and Abraham displaced Raikes and Sadler, and the rate of scoring was reduced. At 76 Mathias just touched a ball from Hodges, and was well caught low down in the slips by Sadler. Victory seemed within reach for Cardiff, but with the exception of Riches and Taylor no one did anything noteworthy with the bat, and the game was left drawn in favour of Newport, Cardiff having scored 171 for eight.

Monmouthshire had no easy task in their game against Oxfordshire in the Minor Counties' Championship at Monmouth. The Oxfordshire captain (Captain B. J. Rogers was well caught at silly leg by Lawday, and Lee then joined Walker. Runs came well, and Harris relieved Dolman, and Sadler was taken off for Hodges, the Monmouthshire skipper, who was acting in that capacity on account of the absence of Baikes.

Oxfordshire had put on 100 after an hour and a half's play for the loss of only one wicket.

The Ross cricketer, R. W. P. Roff, who bowled so well last Saturday in his club match, relieved Dolman. Walker was making a great stand, and he hit Sadler to the leg boundary. Lee played patiently, and got runs all round the wicket.

Harris later again went on at the opposite end from where he had bowled earlier. Walker and Lee both batted well, and the latter hit Harris splendidly to the Pavilion walls. Roff clean bowled Walker with a well-timed ball which took the middle stump. Walker had made 45. Oxfordshire had two wickets down for 120.

CURIOUS CATCH AT MONMOUTH.

Oxford Man Caught on the Boundary.

Monmouthshire continued their match with Oxfordshire at Monmouth to-day. On the previous day Oxfordshire had scored 178, and Monmouthshire 135. Oxfordshire had opened their second innings, and had scored 63 for three wickets. To-day H. Walker and E. Hartley faced the bowling of Sadler and Harris. In quick time 70 was on the board, and the pair looked like settling down.

Dolman relieved Harris, and 100 was up by 11.35. Sadler bowled E. Hartley when he had made 28, and later Roff and Harris took over the bowling. Walker scored his half-century by splendid batting. Hartley hit Harris over the ropes for six, and soon afterwards Walker was bowled by Harris when he had made 52.

Another Six.

F. Hartley hit another six when he sent one from Roff into the Pavilion enclosure. Eventually Hartley's wicket was claimed by Harris after he had reached 37.

Harris and Sadler dismissed the tail cheaply, and Oxfordshire were out for 170.

An unusual incident took place when Ingo was caught on the boundary line—the umpire consulted the spectators, and gave the batsman out. The question was whether the sub. was over the boundary line when Ingo was caught.

After lunch Hodges and Lawday carried the score from 34 to 50 before they were separated. Hodges scored quicker than Lawday, chiefly through well-judged shots on the leg side and good wrist work. Lawday was clean bowled by Rogers with a ball which rose quickly. Roff opened slowly, but obtained nine runs from F. Hartley's first over. Runs came slowly, but two wickets fell in quick succession. Hodges offered an easy catch to Henry, who was fielding close in, and immediately afterwards Roff, in attempting to hit Hartley, was well caught by Walters at mid-off.

COUNTY MATCH.

OXFORDSHIRE'S VICTORY AT MONMOUTH.

POULSON'S GOOD DISPLAY.

For the second time in the history of the Monmouth cricket, a county match has taken place in Monmouth, when the home county played Oxfordshire, in a two days match, on Thursday and Friday of last week. Oxfordshire defeated Monmouthshire by 107 runs.

An enormous amount of work had to be carried out in connection with arrangements etc. but everything ran smoothly. The Rev. W. J. Stuart Crump (Chairman of the Monmouth C.C.), with the committee, undertook the arrangements, and should be congratulated upon the manner in which they dealt with every difficulty.

The wicket did not wear so well as last year, although no labour was spared in connection with its preparation. Floods were responsible for this and the wicket commenced to crumble upon the second day's play. Fine weather favoured the match throughout both days, and it was remarkable that after the last Monmouthshire wicket had fallen there followed a deluge which did not last for any length of time.

Monmouth were interested more than usual in this match because of the fact that two of the club players, H. L. Poulson, who has appeared in the county side on several occasions, and E. W. Colwell, the Monmouth captain, figured in the county eleven. R. W. P. Roff, of Ross, who has many club centuries to his credit was also included.

Upon winning the toss the Oxfordshire captain, B. J. Henry, decided to bat and opened with Walker and Rogers who scored 49 before they were separated. Sadler and Dolman opened the attack and Rogers fell to Sadler, being well taken by Lawday, at short leg. With Lee and Walker at the crease a change was necessary and Harris and Hodges came on but they could make no impression.

Runs came at a fair rate and the former bowlers were once more put into action. Lee gave a chance to Watkins which was not taken. A hundred runs had been scored in 1½ hours play. Roff relieved Dolman but Walker continued to bat well and was exceptionally severe with anything on the leg side. Lee batted quietly but possessed a variety of strokes. At 129, Walker's wicket was claimed by Roff, after scoring a valuable 45.

Soon afterwards Lee was dismissed when the score stood at 133. The opposition provided by the remainder of the side was very weak and except for Walters, who remained not out with 18, Sadler and Harris made merry and dismissed the side for 178.

Monmouthshire fared badly before Rogers and Walters and could only obtain 135. Were it not for the invaluable stand made by Poulson and Roff, Monmouthshire would have been in a bad plight. Poulson remained not out with 39 and with Roff they appeared to be the only players able to deal with Walters, the Oxfordshire fast bowler. The Monmouth player showed a straight blade, while Roff took a guard outside the leg stump and chopped at Walters successfully.

Walker's innings was the backbone of the Oxfordshire batting in the second innings. Sixty-three runs had been obtained overnight (Thursday) for the loss of three wickets. Walker and E. Hartley appeared comfortable and carried the score to over the century. Success attended Sadler and he bowled E. Hartley, who had obtained 28.

Roff and Harris bowled well but Walker obtained his 50 by means of splendid batting. F. Hartley was exceptionally severe and hit vigorously. A magnificent hit off Roff sailed into the pavilion enclosure and Harris was dealt with similarly, when his delivery was sent over the ropes. He was dismissed when at 37—lbw to Harris.

Then came the collapse. Harris and Sadler took command and the Oxfordshire wickets fell with rapidity. Walters was caught by Sadler, and that bowler claimed Cotton's wicket, when he stepped in front of a straight one. Inge was dismissed as a result of a magnificent catch on the boundary by a sub. There was an element of doubt as to the genuineness of the catch because it was thought that perhaps the fieldsman was over the boundary when in the act of catching. The umpire consulted the spectators and being satisfied, gave Inge out. Oxfordshire were dismissed of 170 runs.

Monmouthshire were left with 214 runs to win. Hodges and Lawday settled down and took the score to 50 before they were separated. The runs came steadily with Hodges scoring quicker than Lawday. Walters was not bowling with his former speed, but made the ball come up awkwardly. Eventually Lawday was bowled and Roff occupied the pitch with Hodges. Hodges, the Monmouthshire captain was caught in two minds and gave an easy catch to Henry, who was fielding at short leg.

Roff opened quietly, but nevertheless appeared comfortable. He obtained 14 but hit one direct to Walters at mid-on. The steady batting of Watkins improved Monmouthshire's total, and the last wicket fell when he was caught off Walters. Sadler remained not out and the side were all out for 100. Oxfordshire thus won by 107 runs.

Henry, fielding at short leg, claimed three catches. Poulson was unable to bat owing to a severe attack of lumbago, with the result that Monmouthshire's batting strength was weakened considerably.

County Cricket.

Effort to Assist the Mon. Club.

A DISTRICT ORGANISATION.

There was a good attendance at a meeting held at Pontypool Town Hall on Wednesday evening to consider what steps could be taken to assist the County Cricket Club in their financial difficulties.

The scheme was proposed by Councillor Ivor Jones (Jewell) and Mr. H. G. Barwell and Mr. J. R. Payne, and the response by County well-wishers has been very encouraging.

Mr. A. Brown (a popular member of the Pontypool Club) was elected to the chair, and the agenda prepared by Mr. Barwell (secretary pro tem) was enthusiastically discussed and a number of decisions arrived at.

An effort is to be made to arrange games between Pontypool and Panteg (to be played at Panteg) and with a team designated the Eastern Valley, versus Newport, to be played at Pontypool Park.

Further, it is the intention to hold a meeting at the Viaduct Hotel, Crumlin, on Tuesday evening next for the purpose of creating a similar interest in the Western Valley, and possibly to arrange a game between representatives of the Eastern and Western Valley clubs.

HEAVY DEBT.

Another suggestion is that a shilling membership scheme shall be started.

The chairman at the outset said that 25 good many people had read in the Press some time ago that the County club was in debt to the extent of £400, and he believed that this had created a stir amongst some of the supporters of the club. A large number thought that they deserved more support than they were really getting.

A suggestion had been made that some effort should be made to assist the club in inviting other clubs to participate in a scheme for the purpose. As a consequence a certain amount of interest had been created in the proposal, which had resulted in the convening of the meeting that night. He had been in touch with a few leading lights in Monmouthshire cricket, including Mr. Edgar Watkins, of Ebbw Vale, and Mr. Malby, of Tredegar, who had promised, with the assurance of their clubs, that they would support anything done there that evening. Personally he thought that some efforts should be made to stimulate cricket in Monmouthshire and put the County club on a better footing than it was a present.

NOT FLINGING MONEY AWAY.

Mr. Raikes said that as a matter of fact they ran their county side better than any other and they had curtailed their expenses as far as possible. He wished to stress that point in order that they would not go away from that meeting with the feeling that they were flinging money about. It was only through the kindness of the players that they had been able to carry on as they had done. He did not want anyone to think that they were spendthrifts.

The club had been in existence for about forty years, and it would be very regrettable if the side went out of first class cricket. They were exceptionally popular wherever they went to play. If anything could be done to help them it would be very gratefully received.

IN THE NECK!

Dr. J. P. Jenkins, Griffithstown, thought something should be done to assist the club. It had been left, as far as he could see, to a few people to run the County side for the last ten years. At any rate there had been a feeling that the County side did not necessarily represent the County as a whole. A keener interest should be taken in the club by the various clubs in the district. That was the task which lay before them. They were too prone to look in the papers and say "Poor old Monmouthshire is getting it in the neck again," taking no further interest. (Laughter.)

The chairman said the condition of the subscription list was entirely due to the fact that the clubs had not got into touch with them. He thought that there were heaps of people who would subscribe if they were approached.

NUCLEUS COMMITTEE.

On the motion of Dr. Jenkins, it was decided to consider ways and means of assisting the County club.

The meeting then proceeded to the election of officers. Mr. A. Brown was appointed chairman, Mr. E. H. G. Barwell, secretary, and Mr. K. C. Raikes treasurer. It was decided to form a skeleton committee with power to co-opt representatives from all clubs in Monmouthshire.

All the delegates present were appointed on the committee, viz.; Dr. J. P. Jenkins, Messrs Hugh L. Jones and F. Stone, Pontypool, C. A. Penhorwood, Pontnewynydd, Hugh Jones, Griffithstown, J. R. Payne, "Free Press," C. Williams, Brynmawr, G. Hutchings, Newport, E. Evans, Garn-diffaith, Councillor Ivor Jones, Pontypool.
