

ALDERSHOT COMMAND C.C.

THE SEASON'S AVERAGES.

The Aldershot Command Cricket Club, which has just finished its season, can claim to have been as successful as last year. Seventeen matches were played, the majority under the captaincy of Col. A. C. Johnston, seven were won, three lost and seven drawn. The total number of runs scored was 5,487, a striking testimony to the excellence of the wickets prepared by Mr. G. C. Collins.

The most memorable match of the season, and the one that produced the biggest number of runs, was the game against the Adastrians, who scored 358 and 156 while the Command replied with 492 and 23 for two wickets. The Command United Services also yielded high scoring—956 runs—the second highest total of the season.

Only once was the weather adverse enough to curtail play at all, and this was in the Command's fourth game of the season against the M.C.C., when each side played only one innings.

Five players made centuries during the season and Lieut. E. S. de Brett, R.E., had the honour of hitting up 101 not out against the Southern Command, and the same total against the United Services. Col. Johnston (A.D.C.) made 100 against the Free Foresters and Major J. G. Halstead (Loyals) knocked up 114 in this match. Lieut. C. R. Tuff (The Buffs) scored 146 not out against the Harlequins, and Lieut. H. P. Miles (K.S.L.I.) 166 against the Adastrians.

Against the Command: the Nawab of Pataudi 100, and C. E. Awdrey 103 for the Harlequins. F. Officer Huddleston and L. A. C. Bates 103 and 101 respectively for the Adastrians, Lieut. R. H. Stokes-Rees 117 not out for the Royal Navy and Marines, J. Arnold 103 for Hants Club and Ground, and J. H. Carter 112 not out for the Southern Command.

Lieut. de Brett, who batted six times, had the splendid average of over 77 runs for each innings, while Lieut. H. P. Miles was second with an average of 58.87 for 12 innings. Last season Miles headed the averages with 62.5, and he can justly claim to be the Command's most consistent batsman.

THE BOWLING.

Coming to the bowling averages Capt. F. G. Arnold and Lieut. Miles were again the main forces of the Command's attack, and these players bowled 258 and 268 overs for averages of 12.9 for 55 wickets, and 18.04 for 49 wickets respectively. Capt. C. Wells-Cole and Lieut. A. J. D. Turner bowled over 160 overs each and most maidens of the season were sent down by Wells-Cole, who had 55 to his credit. As last season, his slow left-hand balls were always treated with respect by visiting batsmen.

The best bit of bowling of the season was Arnold's 9 for 68 against the United Services at Portsmouth; also, against the Yorkshire Gentleman, he captured seven of their second innings wickets for 66, this feat following Capt. H. M. Hinde's dismissal of six batsman for 76 in the visitor's first innings. Against the M.C.C. Capt. M. B. Burrows came out with the splendid figures of 8 wickets for 26, this being, as already stated, a one-day match. Other good performances with the ball were Capt. Wells-Cole's 6 for 30 against the R.N. and R.M., Cpl. Davies' 6 for 34 against the Free Foresters and Lieut. Miles' 6 for 43 versus the Quindames.
