CAMBS. WIN AT GRANTHAM.

After four consecutive defeats, Cambs, won their first match of the senson in the Minor Caunties' Championship at Grantham on Tuesday, and incidentally avenged the detect which Lines, inflicted on them at Fenner's last month. With the greatly strengthened team that they were able to field, Cambs, were confident of turning the tables, although their first innings score was somewhat disappointing.

The first day's play was full of interest. The game fluctuated in a remarkable manner, fer first one side and then the other promised to make a big score, but at the close honeurs were about even, Cambs, being 28 behind with three wickets to fall at the drawing of stumps. Lines, met with an early reverse, but a steady stand by Searby and Dods added nearly 70 for the second wicket. Another wicket fell cheaply, and at lineh Lines, had 88 up for the loss of three wickets. Searby, who had batted well, was caught soon after the resumption, and this saw the beginning of the end. The Rev. H. Mack was the only other batsman to make anything of a show, and the innings closed at 149.

Cambs, tried seven bowlers, of whom Smith, making his first appearance of the senson, was the most successful with seven wickets for 58 in 27 overs, 10 maidens. Rose's wicket cost five runs, and Covill's 15. Ridgeon bowied without success for 74, Wilkinson for 13, Ayres for 19, and Saxon for 15.

Cambs, were given a good start by Rose and Saxon, the pair sending up 69 before Rose was caught Saxon left a little later, and although Covill batted steadily. Carnegie-Brown and Ayres were disposed of cheaply. Ridgeon and Hobbs stopped a threatened rot, and Taylor and Smith were in possession when time was called with the total at 121 for seven wickets.

When play was resumed on Tuesday there were prospects of a close fight for first innings lead, and disposing of Cambs, for 148, Lincolnshire gained the advantage by one run. Going in a second time, Lines, had to fight hard for runs, Smith again bowling exceptionally well, and Cambs, were left to get 139 to win.

Saxon and Rose were dismissed fairly cheaply, but Covill and Carnegie-Brown made a splendid third wicket stand that completely turned the game in favour of Cambs. Carnegie-Brown was in brilliant form, and he had the satisfaction of leading the side to victory with his innings of 84. It was a real captain's effort, and his batting was a joy to watch.
