

CAMBS. BATTLING BREAKS DOWN

Beds. Win by Nine Wickets

Cambs. were beaten by nine wickets in their opening match of the season in the Minor Counties' Championship at Bedford on Friday and Saturday.

Winning the toss, Cambs. opened with Hart and Bell to the bowling of Ward and Sims. Both opened cautiously, and found Sims's slow left hand deliveries difficult. Bell was bowled by Ward after scoring a single, but with the advent of Covill, the rate of scoring improved. Lamont was brought on for Ward, and dismissed Hart, who was at the wicket 40 minutes for his 15. Covill had a life when ten, but afterwards played in convincing style. Taylor and he hit well to leg, and the 50 was soon up. Covill was out at 65 to a good catch by Sims off Lamont after compiling 38.

Ward displaced Lamont, and with his fourth ball Taylor was out leg before, four wickets being down for 63. Hobbs was joined by Parfitt, who was stumped with the score at 96.

Hobbs was dismissed in the second over after lunch from a brilliant throw from mid-off by Cook. Sims and Ward, bowling well, pegged the batsmen down. Ayres defended stubbornly, but lost Rumsey and Cockell in consecutive overs. Lamont gave Ward a rest. Ayres immediately took to him, taking 11 off his first over. Ayres again went for Lamont, hitting four boundaries and a six in one over to complete his half-century. A last wicket stand added 33 in 20 minutes.

Ward took four wickets for 40 runs, Sims two for 60, and Lamont three for 58.

Starting steadily, Beds. made 173 for the loss of six wickets before stumps were drawn.

Bedfordshire batted three quarters of an hour on Saturday and added 57 to their overnight total. Pask proved a troublesome bowler and took four wickets for 65. Covill also bowled well with five for 55, but McMillan was expensive with one for 90.

Opening their second innings 51 in arrears, Cambridgeshire began disastrously, Hart being bowled with the third ball without any on the board. Covill had two "lives" before being well bowled for 17. Bell was fifth out for 21, after playing cautious cricket, and eight wickets were down for 69 at lunch.

The Bedfordshire bowling, well managed by Rawlins, kept on top after the interval. Parfitt was missed stumping off Sims before the same bowler hit the top of his leg wicket. McMillan made several nice strokes before Sims beat him with a curler and Poole caught him at backward point. Bedfordshire fielded much cleaner than the previous day.

Bedfordshire were left to get 39 to win, and Ainscough and Poole began scoring at a good pace against Covill and Pask. Five runs were wanted when Covill, with a breaking ball, bowled Poole. Ainscough knocked off the runs with a boundary drive off Pask, the game ending at 3.30 in a nine wickets' win for Bedfordshire.

Ward took five wickets for 32 runs and Sims three for 28.

SPORTING NOTES.

CAMBS. AT BEDFORD.

The batting of Cambs. in their Minor Counties' match at Bedford was somewhat disappointing, especially when it is realised that 128 of their total of their first innings total of 189 came from three men. Chief honours, of course, went to R. J. Ayres, who was undefeated for 55. Ayres was quiet for a start, but when he began to hit out runs came quickly, and McMillan helped him in a lively last wicket stand. Previously J. Covill had batted in convincing manner for 35, while E. Hobbs, who made a similar score, also gave a good display.

Beds were given a good start by Poole and Ainscough, but nevertheless had three wickets down for 60 runs. Covill, Pask and McMillan each kept a good length on a wicket that gave them little assistance. Cockell had a bad day, missing three men at the wicket, but otherwise the Cambs. fielding was excellent, and much better than Bedfordshire, which was very loose after luncheon. Towards the end of the first day Rawlings and Southgate scored freely, and Beds wound up with arrears of only 16 and four wickets in hand.

The second day's play saw Beds well on top. Their remaining wickets added 57 runs, and they then proceeded to skittle out Cambs. for 89. Left to get only 39 to win, Beds won by nine wickets. Thus the old trouble of Cambs.—batting weakness—has recurred, and also they were below full strength, the meagre second innings total against a side they have been able easily to defeat in the past few seasons is, to say the least of it, disappointing.

BRIGHTER CRICKET!

By 3.30 on Saturday Beds had won, but rather than disappoint the big crowd that had by then assembled, the teams decided to play a friendly, and have 75 minutes' batting each. This supplementary game produced some exhilarating cricket—124 runs being scored in just under two hours and a half. Bedfordshire, batting first, hit up 203 before the innings closed in 70 minutes, and Cambs. replied with 221 for nine wickets. Some idea of the "fireworks" may be gauged from the fact that four balls were hit out of the ground and lost. The individual best was the 69 of Sims in half an hour, this number including seven sixes and four fours. Brighter cricket with a vengeance!

CRICKET ASSOCIATION TRIAL.

The Cambs. Cricket Association trial match between teams selected by Mr. H. C. Richford and Mr. E. H. Church, which was begun on Parker's Piece on Monday, produced some interesting cricket. Mr. Richford's side batted first and scored 218. A sound and stylish innings of 43 was played by Coombes, of Camden, who was one of the opening pair.

Poulter, of Sawston, was unfortunately obliged to retire after making 65. Kerridge, who was captaining Mr. Church's side, bowled extremely well, taking five wickets at the small cost of 17 runs, but the other bowlers were not very convincing. Brans at the wicket was, as usual, very good.

The match was concluded on Tuesday, when Mr. Church's eleven replied with 154. There was no batting performance of outstanding merit. Goodman played a valuable and steady innings of 32 and Briant made some splendid drives in his 34—one stroke for six being as fine a hit as anyone would wish to see. These two added 56 for the fifth wicket. The high standard of wicket-keeping set by Brans on the previous night was more than maintained by Cornwell (Old Perownians). His was county form.

Butler was given a long spell of bowling and his six wickets cost only 21 runs. He was fast, and his balls could not have been very easy to see in the deepening shadows of the late evening. Coombes' slow bowling—he took two wickets in his first over—and, indeed, his all-round cricket

produced a very favourable impression. Altogether the match, although devoid of excitement, was quite interesting, and fulfilled its purpose of bringing some of the younger cricketers into prominence and giving them confidence. Another trial game will be played on July 27th and 28th, but only the captains of this week's sides will take part.

Y.M. WIN AGAIN.

Y.M.C.A. gained another easy Senior League victory on Parker's Piece on Saturday, when they defeated St. Andrew's-the-Great by eight wickets. Batting first, St. Andrew's made a disastrous start, losing Shearer, Edwards and Stubblings with only seven runs on the board. Fred Lilley was batting confidently, but he, together with Ladman and Ablett, was out with the total standing at 21. Lilley was somewhat unfortunate to play on the first ball he received from Abbs, after making 16.

A stand by Horn and Golding enabled St. Andrew's to recover, and with Darnell making a useful contribution, the total reached 109. Ablett bowled exceptionally well throughout, taking five wickets for twelve runs in twelve overs. Y.M. opened with Edwards and Brans, and although Edwards was caught for eight, Brans continued to hit soundly. Buttress gave him good support, and a winning stand resulted when Ablett went in. Brans carried his bat for 69 out of 118.

MILLS' BIG WIN.

Whatever quains Sawston Paper Mills may have had about entering the Senior League must have been settled by the displays they are giving in their new sphere of cricket. They gained a big victory on Saturday, when entertaining College Servants, thanks mainly to a century by James. The Mills had lost Vaughan for a "duck," but when James was joined by Chalk a lively stand resulted.

Both scored at a good pace, and defying bowling change, they added over 100 runs before Chalk was dismissed for 54. Joined by Poulter, James completed his hundred, and the Mills were able to declare with the total at 254 for six wickets. The Servants made a fair start, O. Cousins, who opened the innings, batting soundly. Apart from Bryan and Barker, the remaining batsmen offered little resistance, and the innings closed at 135.

HEAVY SCORING AT HISTON.

There was a heavy scoring match at Histon in the Senior League, St. Giles' being the victors. Nearly 400 runs were scored, which is pretty good going for an afternoons cricket. Histon won the toss and on a perfect wicket and in splendid cricket weather, took first knock. They were given a good start by S. Handcomb and R. Rogers, 58 being on the board before Handcomb was out for a careful 29.

Histon's second wicket put on another 35 runs, and the third produced 47. Rogers was eventually bowled by Hobson for 72. The later Histon batsmen did not score many, with the exception of A. Peck, who batted well for 32, and the Histon innings closed for 192. Hobson was St. Giles' best bowler, taking five wickets.

St. Giles' started carefully but attractively, P. Wolf and J. Brown keeping together until 88 were on the board. Later Wolf was unfortunately run out when apparently well set. Histon tried eight bowlers, none of whom was effective, and the villagers are certainly not so strong as of yore in attack. H. J. Rose and G. Barrett were together when Histon's score was passed, and none of the bowlers caused them any concern. When stumps were drawn St. Giles' had scored 200 for two wickets. Altogether, though, a very enjoyable afternoon's cricket.

ST. ANDREW'S THE GREAT C.C.

The draw for the cricket bat, personally selected and autographed by Mr. J. B. Hobbs, took place on Parker's Piece on Saturday afternoon. The draw was made by Mr. E. H. Church, who kindly presented a match ball as a second prize. The

The winner of the bat was a lady, who asked for it to be sold, and it has been purchased by one of the club members. The Club wish to thank all those who purchased tickets, and especially to thank Mr. E. H. Church for the help he gave in connection with the draw.

A DRAWN GAME.

Over 400 runs were scored in the Junior League match between Bottisham and Y.M.C.A. II. on Parker's Piece, the outstanding features of the game being the innings of Pettit for the villagers and Harinnings by Pettit for the villagers and Barnard for the Y.M.C.A. Pettit, going in when Bottisham had lost one of their opening batsmen for a "duck," hit up an excellent 85, and the consistency of the side's batting is indicated by the fact that eight men reached double figures. Next to Pettit, the village batting honours went to Butler and Marsh, who, being concerned for the eighth wicket made over 50 between them.

The Bottisham innings closed at 212, and Y.M. made a fighting reply, scoring 190 for the loss of five wickets in the time left for play. Barnard, one of the opening pair, carried his bat for a valuable 90. Pauley gave him a good support for the second wicket, and after two more men had been quickly disposed of, Darkin and Jones rendered great assistance. Jones, like Barnard, was unbeaten when time was called.

EASY FOR OLD PEROWNIANS.

Another big innings by R. Game enabled Old Perownians easily to defeat Trumpington on Parker's Piece. Trumpington, after a poor start, made a recovery when H. Andrews and G. Smith became associated for the third wicket. G. Seekings and A. Haggis each made a useful effort, and the total reached 93. Hunt bowled well, taking six wickets. Foundations for an easy victory were laid by Game and Webster, and with steady batting following, the Old Perownians ran up 156 for the loss of only four wickets before the drawing of stumps. Third out, Game made a splendid 80.

Visiting Quy, New Chesterton Institute II. were defeated by 25 runs, in a game of erratic batting. Against a well-varied attack, the Institute batsmen made a poor show, and only Stearn reached double figures in a total of 44. The home side began badly, but Rolph and G. Watts temporarily stopped the rot. Another collapse occurred after this pair were separated, but Allen and Peck made a winning stand for the ninth wicket.

GOOD FIELDING.

Good fielding kept scores low in the Junior League match between Comberton and Coton, which Comberton won by eight runs. Batting first, Comberton were saved from collapse by P. Rogers, who made 24 out of 36. Cousins bowled exceptionally well. Coton batsmen also failed against Papworth and Doewra, and an extraordinary catch by O. Custeron proved invaluable when a close finish was in prospect.

A fine innings of 53 by J. Bird was the feature of Little Shelford's home game with Sawston Paper Mills II. Bird practically dominated the scoring, making his total out of 135. Andrews bowled well when Sawston went in, and Webb and Harvey were the only batsmen to make anything of a show, the innings closing for 51.

INSTRUMENT CO. FAIL.

The Instrument Co. were skittled out for 22 runs at Papworth, Fisher taking seven wickets for 10 runs and Sergeant three for 11. Papworth soon knocked off the runs and went on to score 70. Moreland, Sholtok, Sergeant and Maitland all batting well.

CAMBS. BATTING BREAKDOWN.

SPORTING NOTES.

A FINISH WORTH WATCHING.

The second day of the Cambs. v. Beds. match on Saturday provided an unexpected thrill in the shape of one of those finishes against time which cricket yields. Beds. just forced the draw, and no one will grudge them their point. Until Rawlins succumbed to a not very deceptive ball from Covill, it certainly seemed as if the visitors might even yet snatch the game out of the fire. W. Keer, W. Papworth and S. Chapman. The Instrument Co. made a bad start, but recovered well through Varley, Orchard and Thompson. The later batsmen failed, however, and the innings closed for 73. Papworth played havoc with the tall, his five wickets costing only three runs.

NEWMARKET WIN AT BURY.

Visiting Bury St. Edmund's on Saturday, Newmarket gained a decisive victory, for after declaring with six wickets down for 155 they disposed of the home side for 78. Newmarket made only a moderate start, but T. Waugh and Course made a timely stand for the fourth wicket, and later Pat Robins made a useful contribution. Even a more productive partnership resulted when Stokes joined Waugh, and the pair were undefeated when the closure was applied. Waugh, who made 51, is a promising youngster.

Bury started badly against Stokes and Dawson, and it was not until Shipsey and Pawsey became associated for the seventh wicket that any sustained resistance was offered. Hunt, coming on as change bowler, broke this partnership, and then quickly finished off the innings, his four wickets costing only five runs. Stokes had four for 37 and Dawson two for 36.

FORMER CAMBS. WICKET-KEEPER.

G. E. Livock, who did so well for the Tramps against Mr. Comber's XI. at Fenner's on Tuesday, is the wicketkeeper who played for Cambs. for a year or two after the war, and did well, both behind the stumps and with the bat. He is now in the Air Force, and has just completed his tour of duty abroad. He is now permanently in England. At the moment he is on leave without having been posted to a station, but as he has a qualification for the county no doubt if the club is continued they will wish to avail themselves of his services. He may be a third wicket-keeper, but from all accounts he is well worth playing for his batting alone.

ELY CITY COLLAPSE.

St. Giles' turned the tables on Ely City on Saturday, when they met on the King's School ground, Ely. The pitch was in a soft condition, and Ely collapsed in surprising manner, being dismissed in just over an hour for the small total of 42. St. Giles', who were without the services of F. A. Ridgeon, Smith and H. J. Rose, who were assisting the County, and incidentally, fielded only ten men, passed this total before tea. After the interval the innings was continued and closed for 77.

The City, who included three second string men, were skippered by C. C. Broker, who, with P. L. J. Oakey, opened the batting. Both found runs difficult to obtain off the bowling of Coots and Hobson, and neither was at the wicket long before being caught and bowled by Hobson. In a quarter of an hour Ely had lost three wickets for 13 runs. Skinner and Doggett followed, and both made some nice strokes, but the former, in playing a deceptive ball, was easily caught by Barker in the slips. His partner soon followed, being well caught by Richardson, who later brilliantly caught Ruane.

P.S. Morton contributed a useful 11, the highest score of the side, but the remaining batsmen offered little resistance. L. Hobson took six wickets for 18 runs and H. Barker took four wickets for 16. J. F. Richardson and H. F. Fuller opened the St. Giles' innings. The former gave a splendid display and scored 30. The only other batsman to reach double figures was C. Coots, who was unbeaten for 18.

RABBITS AT FULBOURN.

Cambridge Rabbits visited Fulbourn on Saturday, when they were entertained by the Cambs. Mental Hospital, the Hospital winning a most enjoyable game by 21 runs. Winning the toss, the Hospital batted first, and scored 159 for the loss of seven wickets before declaring. Of this number, Leaworthy was responsible for 45. He played a very good innings, and was undefeated on his side declared. Wheatley also made a useful 36, while Dymott had considerable luck with his 26. Of the Rabbits' bowlers, F. E. Haynes was most effective, and took four wickets for 29 runs.

It is some years since a match was played for the benefit of the above institutions, and the Cambs. Cricket Association, therefore, decided that these two institutions should receive the proceeds of this match. Tickets are now issued (price 6d.) and can be obtained from any member of the Council of the Cambs. Cricket Association. These institutions are very deserving of support, and it is hoped the general public will do all they can to assist them. Consideration has already been given to the constitution of the Cambridge side, but no player will receive a definite invitation until early in September.

It might be well to mention here that the team will probably consist of several of the younger cricketers in Cambridge. Batting and Bowling Averages

MORE SUPPORT WANTED

After a disastrous start to their Minor Counties Championship campaign—the first four matches resulted in heavy defeat—the Cambs. County Cricket Club wound up the season in splendid style, gaining 16 points out of a possible 20 in their last four games, and finishing with a percentage of 80.

The lesson that the past season taught was that Cambs. must play as many matches as possible towards the end of July and during August, for it is only in that period that they can field a fully representative side.

MORE SUPPORT WANTED.

At a time when the club is literally struggling for existence it should do everything possible to command support, and although the public have shown a deplorable lack of interest, there is a likelihood that with a winning side better attendances would be attracted. Support, not only monetary but personal, is essential for the encouragement of those who are endeavouring to save the Club from disbanding. The public have one year's grace in which to help the Club to keep its head above water, for unless additional support is forthcoming the prospects of carrying on are remote.

It would be a pity if the Club, which is one of the oldest in the county, should pass out of existence at a time when there is a wealth of playing talent and many promising young cricketers developing.

SEASON'S PERFORMANCES.

During the past season, or the latter part at any rate, the team was particularly strong in all departments. The batting, which in the past has been unreliable, was steady, the bowling was distinctly above the average, while, generally speaking, the fielding reached a high standard.

Five batsmen had an average of over 20, while one was only a fraction under, and some remarkably good bowling figures were returned. Covill and Smith, whose professional status is recognised with only a nominal fee, have again borne the brunt of the bowling, and they occupy the leading position in the averages. Smith, unfortunately, was not available for every match.

This pair played a great part in Cambs. victory over Leicestershire II., the Minor Counties champions. Cambs. were the only side to defeat the Midland eleven, and this success must rank as the outstanding event of the playing season.

Another fine performance was the display against Hertfordshire, and only bad weather prevented Cambs. from gaining a victory over their old rivals. Time also enabled Bedfordshire to save the game in the last match of the season.

Altogether Cambs. scored 2,088 runs (which included 123 extras) for the loss of 133 wickets, while opponents obtained 2,167 (138 extras) for 118 wickets.
