

KENT 2nd XI v. SOUTH AMERICANS

This match, played on the St. Lawrence Ground on Monday and Tuesday last, resulted in a win for the home side by six wickets.

South America won the toss and elected to bat on a firm, easy-paced wicket, but had one wicket down without a run being scored. Stuart and Marshall then came together and by careful batting put up the 100 against the bowling of Lewis and Ashwell. At 114 Stuart was brilliantly stumped by Levett off Ashwell, his innings of 57 including six 4's. Paul batted well and was most unfortunate in being run out when the score was 174. Soon afterwards Marshall got out, his flawless innings of 83 being terminated by Lewis, who tempted him out of his crease for Levett to stump him. After this wickets fell steadily, the innings finishing with a total of 259.

Both Lewis and Wright bowled well in taking 4 for 59 and 4 for 95 respectively, the former keeping an excellent length.

Fagg and Honey opened the batting for Kent against the bowling of the brothers Ayling. Honey was soon out, but Pearce and Fagg, by careful batting, increased the total to 50. Fagg was bowled by one of the best balls of the match, which pitched just outside the off stump and turned back to take the leg ball. Pearce was enterprising all the time he was in, and was only out through making the mistake of flicking at a rising off ball. Simpson hit the ball very hard in making 33. The innings closed at 181, Kent being 78 runs behind on the first innings. The brothers Ayling both bowled well, D. Ayling taking 5 wks. for 73 and C. Ayling taking 3 for 36.

South America had 4 wickets down for 42 runs, when Knox and Ayling got together and put on 25 runs in quick time. C. H. Gibson was the only other batsman to offer any resistance to the bowling of Lewis and Crawford, the former taking 4 wks. for 31 and the latter 3 for 42. The innings closed at 113, leaving Kent with 222 runs to get.

In Kent's second innings, with only 16 runs on the board, Fagg was unlucky to be out to a brilliant catch at short leg when trying to punish a short ball from D. Ayling. Honey and Pearce then pushed the score along slowly to 67, when Honey put his foot in front of a straight ball from Paul. Pearce and Mitchell then took the score to 131, before the latter was caught at the wicket. Pearce played a brilliant innings, scoring all round the wicket. In his score of 117 he gave only one chance, a catch to first slip, when his score stood at 63. His innings, which took 2 1/2 hours to make, included fourteen 4's.

E. B. Pettit's Great Bowling

Splendid Batting by
R. F. G. Hews, Supt. Goldsmith
and Det.-Sgt. Kitchingham

An interesting and most enjoyable match was played on the Herne Bay ground on Friday, between the County Police and a team composed chiefly of members of the Press from Canterbury and Herne Bay. Fortunately, after persistent rain, the weather turned fine in the afternoon, and play proceeded without interruption until 7.15 p.m. Against the fast bowling of Pettit the Police made a rather disastrous start, losing two wickets with very few runs scored. Then, however, Supt. Goldsmith, who had been showing an impregnable defence, was joined by Det.-Sgt. Kitchingham, and a fine stand was made. Both batsmen played attractive and vigorous cricket, and the score had been taken to well over three figures before a separation was effected. Kitchingham, who was the first to leave, was smartly snapped in the slips by R. F. G. Hews off the speedy Pettit. To the general regret he just failed to reach the half-century. His "knock" had been marked by clean, vigorous hitting, combined with a watchful defence, his chief scoring strokes being a six and seven fours. Supt. Goldsmith left shortly after to another fine catch in the slips. He played uncommonly good cricket in a sterling innings and hit no less than ten fours. Subsequently the Police wickets fell rapidly, Pettit bowling in superb form. He took the first eight wickets that fell, and in all he secured 9 wickets for 52 and had the satisfaction of performing the "hat-trick." R. F. G. Hews took the other two wickets at a cost of 22 runs.

The Press side also made a disastrous start, F. W. Day and E. B. Pettit being dismissed with very few runs on the board, and Millen and Taylor also left with but little addition to the score. P. Paine kept his end up stubbornly, and S. H. Jennings (who had kept wicket very creditably) also made a capital effort to stop the rot. There was, however, over half-an-hour to go when six of the Press wickets had gone, and the odds were then all against the Press side saving the game. R. F. G. Hews, who had baffled confidently from the start, was then joined by G. R. Hews, and the pair put on 50 runs and resisted the attack until the close of play. R. F. G. Hews, who was out to the last ball of the day, had played through the innings for a meritorious 71, which included nine fours. For the Police, Kitchingham secured 3 wickets for 28 runs and Huggins 3 for 29. Score:

KENT 2nd XI v. SOUTH AMERICANS.

Kent 2nd XI defeated the South Americans on the St. Lawrence Ground, Canterbury, on Monday and Tuesday. Kent was left at the end of the first innings with a deficiency of 78 runs, but thanks to some good bowling by Lewis and Crawford, the visitors only managed to increase their lead by 143. Kent was left to score 222 runs in nearly four hours and these were obtained with the loss of only four wickets.

The South Americans' first innings was opened by R. L. Latham and H. W. Marshall against the bowling of Lewis and Ashwell, and before a run had been scored Latham was dismissed by a full toss from Lewis. Marshall was joined by R. L. Stuart and runs came slowly for a time, but gradually the pace quickened, and when Stuart was stumped by Levett after being missed at 49 by Crawford, the pair had brought the total to 114. J. H. Paul, who followed, scored 17 before the lunch interval. Paul was the first to leave, being run out when the score was 171. When only eleven more runs had been added, Marshall, having contributed 81, was smartly stumped by Levett. D. Ayling soon followed him, being stumped when only 3, and when the total had just passed the 200, Knox was clean bowled by Wright. The next two players were also victims to Wright, Keen and Grass being out lbw. Jacobs was also out lbw to Lewis, and the South Americans' innings closed at 259 by Gibson being bowled by Wright.

Fagg and Honey opened the Kent innings against the bowling of C. Ayling and Gibson. Honey was lbw to Ayling with 21 on the board and Fagg left after the tea interval when the score was 60. Crawford had a lucky escape before he had opened his account as he was missed by Knox. When Mitchell had obtained 22 he was caught in the deep by Stuart. Crawford was again missed at 26, but was caught after he had added only one more run, to his total. Lewis was next out lbw to Gibson at 120.

When play was resumed on Tuesday, Simpson, Levett and Ashwell were quickly dismissed and the innings closed at 181.

The visitors lost their first three wickets quickly in the second innings. H. W. Marshall played on from Crawford's bowling. Latham soon followed at 24, and Stuart was bowled by a yorker from Ashwell. J. H. Paul also played late to a ball from Crawford and hit it into his wicket. D. Ayling was next to leave, being caught by Simpson off Lewis. Knox was out lbw to Wright when the score was 91, and at 100 Simpson caught Grass. A. Ayling, playing back to a half-volley, was bowled, and the two remaining wickets brought the total to 143.

In Kent's second innings Fagg was well caught at square leg early on. Runs came slowly and Honey left at 27. After the tea interval Pearce soon passed his 50 mark. Mitchell was caught by Latham when he had made 31, and Crawford was dismissed by a smart catch in the deep field for 18. Neame and Pearce carried the total to 222 when stumps were drawn, Pearce's 117 not out included fourteen fours.

CENTURY FOR SURREY II

HIGH SCORING IN MINOR COUNTIES' MATCH.

With 30 on the board, however, he was clean bowled when he had made 22. The 50 came up with a four from Honey in 40 minutes. Summers then took the place of Merrell at the Pavilion end, and off his first ball Hewetson was missed.

Kent reached their first 100 just before the close of play for the day without any further loss.

KENT 2nd XI's BAD LUCK

Winning, But Lose Points

FAST BOWLER'S FIREWORKS.

Spectators were treated to some exciting cricket after lunch on Saturday in the second day of the Minor Counties match at Folkestone between Kent 2nd XI, and Surrey 2nd XI.

Kent had applied to Surrey's total of 379, with an overnight score of 120 for 1 wicket on Friday, but before lunch there had been a minor collapse, and the ninth wicket had fallen at 50. After lunch, Kent's first wicket pair, Blunden and Ashwell, added 108 runs in 50 minutes, bringing the total to within three of Surrey's score. Ashwell hit four all round the wicket, and was not out at the end of the innings with 69 runs to his credit. Blunden played a steady, but never slow innings, and his 40 was a really plucky effort.

Honey and R. H. Hewetson resumed the Kent innings on Saturday, having scored 20 and 41 respectively. Hewetson began to score freely off the bowling of Merrell and Lock and reached his individual 50 after 15 minutes' play. Owen replaced Merrell at the south end, and with the third ball he found Honey out, but when the batsman had obtained 56, with T. F. Mitchell, Hewetson livened the scoring still further, making three 4's in one over off Owen. He gave a second chance at 84, but went on to register his century with a boundary off Owen, having taken 45 mins to make the additional 50 required. At 113, the total being 205, he hit out to a shooting ball from Merrell, who had replaced Lock at the north end, and was bowled. He had taken a little under two hours to get his runs, which included 14 4's, and, despite the two difficult chances that he gave, it was a very creditable display. This was the first time that Hewetson had appeared for his county in any match.

A COLLAPSE

After this good start, a partial "ret" set in. Lewis was caught 29 by Fishlock off Merrell, and at 22 Mitchell turned a ball from Merrell into the hands of Lock, at slip. At 234 Crawford, who had made only three, skied one of Lock's fastest balls to Wilson.

G. H. Simpson, Kent's skipper, hit four 4's in his 21 in an effort to stop the procession, and the 250 went up in 80 minutes, but he was soon out lbw to Lock. With Wright and Sumnucks in the scoring stopped almost entirely, and they had added only 10 when Sumnucks gave Woollatt an easy catch off Merrell.

Wright was soon out after lunch, with the score at 268 for 9 wickets, and it seemed that Kent would not reach the 300 mark, but Ashwell and Blunden took entire command of the bowling for 50 minutes, and in that time took the total to 376. Ashwell delighted the crowd with the spectacular boundaries which he hit to all parts of the ground, and Blunden, although he never looked quite as safe as his partner, did not allow the scoring to slow down at all. It was very unfortunate that this merry partnership should have been dissolved when Kent wanted only 4 runs to pass their opponents' first innings total. Blunden misjudged a ball from Merrell when he was caught by Mobery.

A SURREY PROCESSION

Surrey's second innings partook something of the nature of a procession too. It was partly due to Blunden and Ashwell, who kept the ball inclined to produce "throw-aways" on the hard wicket. Ashwell, in particular, was practically uncatchable for the first hour, and he clean bowled Wilson and Summers within four overs, his analysis is at the end of the day's play read 200-20-5.

Mobery and Wilson opened the innings, but 19 only had been scored when Ashwell bowled Wilson. Seven runs later Mobery touched a high bounding ball from Ashwell's next over into Simpson's hands.

Woollatt scored two, and then his wicket was shattered by a "can't-walk" from Blunden. Summers and Cook showed fight, but, when the score had been taken to 47 (which had occupied 60 minutes) Ashwell sent Summers' balls flying. Wright and Lewis replaced Blunden and Ashwell after tea, bowling a few overs each, and neither Surrey man could score off either of them.

At 65 Ashwell accepted a straight catch from Cook off Wright, and two runs later Fishlock fell to Ashwell, Simpson taking an easy catch. Before another run had been added Maxwell was also out, being caught by Wright in the same over.

It was left to Owen to show fight. With 68 for 7 on the board, he went in and commenced to score freely in comparison with the preceding batsmen. The hundred went up in just under two hours, and Owen made 57 in fifty minutes, but at 159 he was run out through an exceedingly smart return by Blunden, who was fielding near the pavilion.

Merrell also became aggressive, and helped Watts, who was then 19, to take the total to 190, before he was caught by Hewetson off Mitchell, bringing the innings to a close because of bad light at 190 for 9 wickets.

MINOR COUNTIES CRICKET.

KENT v. SURREY.

HEAVY SCORING MATCH ENDS IN DRAW.

In the two days' match on the Folkestone Cricket Ground on Friday and Saturday, Kent second eleven entertained Surrey second eleven in the minor counties championship. This attractive fixture between the two neighbouring counties was favoured with excellent weather and produced some bright cricket.

Included in both teams were players who had made an appearance in the first elevens of the respective counties.

In the Kent side, which was captained by P. A. Simpson, were G. A. Crawford, T. F. Mitchell, Blunden, and Lewis, all of whom have played in the premier side.

There were only a handful of spectators present when play commenced on the first day on a wicket which gave every indication of yielding a good number of runs.

Surrey won the toss and batted first, the Surrey opening pair, Mobey and Wilson, facing Ashwell and Blunden. Mobey opened the scoring with a single off Ashwell. The last ball of the over Wilson got Ashwell excellently to the leg boundary. With only eight runs on the board, Kent met with an early success, Ashwell sending Mobey back to the pavilion lbw, after the latter had made four. R. J. E. Woollatt then partnered Wilson and there was some bright hitting from the newcomer. After nicking a couple of singles Woollatt twice drove Ashwell to the off boundary. Wilson, who was extremely quiet, left most of the scoring to his more prolific partner. Blunden was bowling very well, keeping a good length. Woollatt treated him generally with respect. The Surrey man, however, played Ashwell with confidence and in one over pulled him to the leg boundary three times consecutively. Runs came freely and the 50 was hoisted after 40 minutes' play. Of this number Woollatt's share was 32 and Wilson's eight. After Woollatt had driven Blunden to the boundary, T. A. Crawford displaced Ashwell. The new bowler slowed the scoring pace and made Wilson miss badly once or twice. Woollatt punished Crawford for four however, and then put 70 on the board after 55 minutes by getting Blunden over the ring for six. A partnership which had yielded 69 runs, was broken when the score had reached 77, Lewis making an easy catch off Blunden to send Woollatt back.

W. G. Cook joined Wilson at the wicket and though the latter continued to bat with restraint, runs continued to come fairly freely. Wright displaced Blunden at 88 and Lewis was put on for Ashwell. These two bowlers reduced the scoring pace but the 100 was reached after 85 minutes. With only 16 more added Cook was caught at second slip by Lewis off Wright, his 30 including four fours. Summers, who joined Wilson, did not stay long, being bowled lbw by Lewis after he had made a single. With Fishlock partnering Wilson, the score was taken to 135 for four wickets before lunch, Wilson being 41 not out, and Fishlock six not out.

Facing the bowling of Lewis and Blunden after lunch, both batsmen found run-getting fairly easy. Fishlock scored twice as fast as Wilson, principally by strokes all round the wicket and being particularly heavy on Blunden. The 200 was signalled 20 minutes later, when the Kent attack was changed, Blunden crossed over and Crawford displaced Lewis. Fishlock had 50 to his credit in as many minutes. The partnership which had added 100 runs was broken when Wilson was cleverly caught by Simpson in the slips off Blunden, when within six of his century. He had taken three hours to score 94.

Watts next joined Fishlock and runs came fairly easily again, Fishlock hitting Blunden to the leg boundary three times successively. Kent made a change in their attack again,

Mitchell displacing Blunden. At 299 Mitchell had Watt caught by Hewetson in the deep-field, after he had made 24. Fishlock went on to complete his 100, which had taken him two hours and forty minutes. Immediately afterwards a swerving ball from Wright wrecked his wicket. After this the Kent bowlers met with more success and the innings closed at 379.

Fagg and Honey opened the Kent innings but with 90 on the board Fagg was bowled by Lock after he had made 22. Honey was joined by Hewetson and there was some attractive hitting. Stumps were drawn with the score at 120 for one wicket. Honey being 50 and Hewetson 41 not out.

When play was resumed on Saturday, Honey and Hewetson took the score to 145 before being parted, Honey being bowled by Owen for 56. Mitchell then joined Hewetson. Mitchell was extremely slow, though Hewetson was heavy upon the Surrey bowlers and when the 200 was hoisted his share was 110, while Mitchell had only four to his credit. Hewetson in his century hit nine fours. At 205 Merrell had Mitchell caught and the same bowler secured Hewetson's wicket with the score at 219. With Blunden and Wright at the wicket runs came slowly.

Wright after only making five was stumped when he came out to try to drive a ball from Lock. Ashwell, who followed Wright, proceeded to treat the bowling with same contempt and hit out well although he put up an easy chance near the boundary which was not held, when the score was 308. Following this, Ashwell continued to hit out and completed his half century in 30 minutes. Shortly after he put up another but rather difficult catch, when the score was 353 but it was not held.

Blunden, who by this time had scored 92, played a careful game until he was caught by Mobey off Lock, when he had made 40. The innings then closed with the score standing at 376, only three runs behind the Surrey total. The last wicket partnership between Ashwell and Blunden added 108 runs in 50 minutes, Ashwell having made 69 not out, including a six and ten fours. Blunden in his knock of 40 hit five fours.

Blunden and Ashwell shared the bowling against Mobey and Wilson, who batted cautiously, on the Surrey side commencing

their second innings. When the score had reached 19, Wilson was clean bowled by Ashwell, having only made six. In Ashwell's next over he succeeded in taking the wicket of Mobey, who was caught by Simpson. R. J. E. Woollatt after only having made two runs was then clean bowled by Blunden, the total score standing at 27. W. T. Cook and L. A. H. Summers then batted carefully and scored at a very slow rate. When the score had reached 47 Wright came on to bowl at the north end. In the next over Ashwell bowled L. A. H. Summers, when he had scored 19. Fishlock and W. T. Cook then batted carefully and at the tea interval the score stood at 66 for four wickets, Cook having made 21 and Fishlock six. Cook should have been dismissed when his score was 28, as Wright failed to hold a fast catch. Following this incident play became very slow and runs were very scarce, the batsmen not seeming to be able to play the bowlers with much confidence. When the total reached 85 Cook was dismissed by a smart catch by Ashwell off a good ball from Wright. Following this both Fishlock and T. A. O. Maxwell played carefully until Fishlock sent a ball from Ashwell into the hands of Simpson. Before another run was added to the score T. A. Maxwell was dismissed by a good catch by Wright off a ball by Ashwell.

When E. A. Watts and Owen got together the rate of scoring increased and Owen piled on runs at a good pace, getting his 50 in about as many minutes but after adding only another two runs to his fifty he was run out, the result of a good return by Blunden. Following the dismissal of Owen, Watt began to score at a faster rate, and in one over he knocked three fours in succession off T. A. Crawford. The match closed with the dis-

missal of P. E. Merrell with the score standing at 190 for nine wickets.

KENT 2ND XI. LOSE TO BUCKS.

Fagg's Brilliant Innings on the Nevill.

(By "The Onlooker.")

At the Nevill Ground, Tunbridge Wells, on Friday, Bucks showed they had a liking for the bowling of Kent 2nd XI., for they scored runs all over the ground. Brooke and Stephenson were to the fore in this direction, each reaching the 70 mark. There had been only twenty minutes' play before the first wicket fell for 21, but there were 170 runs on the board before the second batsman was out. Nor was that all, for when the fourth wicket had fallen, 222 runs had been scored. Peters and Skinner gave a lively display, and both found the boundary fairly frequently, but their partnership was broken when Levett caught Skinner behind the wicket from a delivery by Ashwell. Frankline and Powell were dismissed with the addition of 19 runs, and when four more had been scored, Peters left. Ashwell and Davies were responsible for the chief onslaught, and Raffety had only scored two when the former had him caught at slip by Fagg.

CLEVER EFFORT BY LEVETT.

With the score at 275 for eight, the players adjourned for tea, and in the first five minutes afterwards, Fletcher was stumped by Levett when he overbalanced in playing forward to Lewis. It was a smart and clever piece of work, and soon afterwards Wright made a brilliant but futile attempt to catch Rutter in the slips. It was a pity he was not a few inches taller. A little later Edwards was bowled by Ashwell, and the innings closed at 294. It was an example of Levett's wicket-keeping that there were only three byes and one leg-bye.

Fagg and Chalk opened Kent's innings, and made steady progress in the matter of run-getting, so much so that when Fagg was l.b.w. to Edwards in five minutes under the hour, there were 60 runs on the board. This success was not continued, however, for when stumps were drawn for the day, only five runs extra had been added and two other wickets had fallen.

A DIFFICULT PROPOSITION.

When the game was resumed on Saturday, Kent only batted for 90 minutes before being dismissed for 160. They found Edwards, the googly bowler, a difficult proposition, and he gathered most of the wickets. Not one player could play him with ease, and in 29 overs he had only 53 runs scored from him. Christopher-son made a good effort, and succeeded in getting 23 before being caught at the wicket by Franklin, while Lewis put 20 against his name.

When Bucks went in for the second time they again showed they could do what they liked with the Kent bowlers, but Wright was very successful with his tricky deliveries. Although on not a few occasions he was forced to the rails, he took four wickets, and all were leg-before. Eventually, when Bucks had 149 runs on the board, Franklin declared, after five wickets had fallen.

MERRY BUT BRIEF.

Simpson opened Kent's second innings, and this happy-go-lucky captain hit two boundaries, and was then caught. It was a brilliant catch that dismissed him, and one that a good many fieldsmen would not have attempted. Soon after that Chalk, in hitting a high ball, caught it on the hand, and had to leave the field. Fagg took his place, but with 45 on the board, Rutter held a stinging drive from Ashwell that got rid of a good man.

With the score at 77, Fairservice was l.b.w. to Edwards, and when Christopher-son was caught at the wicket by Franklin without having scored, Chalk went out to complete his interrupted innings, but without adding any more to his 17, he was l.b.w. to Aubrey-Fletcher.

When Lewis joined Fagg there was some good scoring strokes to be seen, and between them they made the figures mount. They were parted when Skinner caught Lewis in the deep, but Fagg carried his bat to the close, with 57. His was a clever and careful innings, and although he took no risks, he made the cricket interesting. It was a pity he could not get a partner to support him in the way he was playing.
