SURREY 2nd v. WILTSHIRE.

Wiltshire made an inauspicious commencement to their 1032 programme by sustaining defeat to the tune of 10 wickets, at the Oval on Monday and Tuesday. Surrey were strongly represented, several of their side having done duty for the first eleven, but Wiltshire were hardly up to previous strength, G. F. Butler and W. Lovel Hewitt being notable absentees.

The weather was ideal for the game, but Wiltshire, batting first, soon allowed their opponents to claim a wicket, only 16 runs being on the board when this occurred. Fourteen runs later two more wickets fell without any addition, and it subsequently fell to the lot of E. M. Nash (primarily recognised as wicketkeeper) and R. W. Awdry (who skippered the Wiltshiresmen) to bring the score within the region of 100. The grand aggregate only exceeded this number by 18, however, so that Surrey's task looked simple.

Wilson and Mobey opened soundly, and 91 runs had been registered before wicket No. 1 was captured by Fitzgerald. Mobey reached his half-century, and Whitfield, who followed, was within one of that honour when an extra good one from W. Smith rattled his bails to the ground. W. T. Cook, who has troubled Wiltshire bowlers so much in the past, was again in tip-top form. He opened quietly, but upon getting "his eye in" gave the spectators an example of how far he could hot the ball when opening his shoulders. Cook completed a beautiful century, but was clean bowled by Fitzgerald nine runs later. With the score at 300 for 6 wickets Surrey made a declaration, which made them practically immune from defeat at any rate.

Wiltshire opened their reply even more disastrously than in the first innings, an "express" from Gover compelling E. H. F. Fuller to bid "au revoir" before he had scored. Two runs later down went another wicket, and at 8 Wiltshire were further in the doldrums, and it looked as though Surrey were going to have matters completely their own way. But we had not reckoned with J. A. Wheeler, who received a "duck" in the first innings. This time, Wheeler showed that he possesses an abundance of skill with the bat, and try as they would none of Surrey's bowlers could tempt him into making a mistake. E. M. Nash again gave a stolid display, and from a position of 5 wickets down for 27 runs the score gradually mounted until 124 for eight gladdened the hearts of the Wiltshiresmen considerably, for there was at least a good chance of saving the innings defeat. Wheeler was still batting soundly and eventually completed his century, a feat upon which he richly deserved the applause he received. J. Smith, last man in, also hit well for 28, and the final wicket fell with the grand total 205, which left Surrey 25 to get to win the match. This was accomplished without loss by Mobey and Whitfield. F. Fitzgerald, the ex-Trowbridge High School lad, was Wiltshire's best bowler, claiming 4 wickets for 63 runs. Detailed scores:-

WILTS v. SURREY 2nd XI.

A fine day's cricket, full of interest, with the batsmen always struggling against fine bowling, marked the opening of the Minor Counties Championship match against Surrey 2nd XI on August Bank Holiday. There was a fair crowd, but the changeable weather undoubtedly prevented many ardent enthusiasts from attending. As far as Bemerton was concerned, the weather was kind, and there were only a few short hold-ups for showers, play continuing till the advertised time. Surrey fielded a strong team, only two amateurs, Cook, the captain, and Hadingham, the Cambridge "blue," being in the side. Cook won the toss, and banking on the wicket being tricky, sent Wilts in to bat. Wilts started rather well, and Lovell-Hewitt showed that the bowling could be hit by taking 13 in one over from Gover. Two wickets were down for 76, and then smart work by Mobey, behind the stumps, changed the story. Butler and Fitzgerald both falling victims. Wheeler, who in his opening match for the county at the Oval scored a century, was dismissed without scoring, and then Nash came in to temporarily check the "procession." He and R. W. Awdry appeared to be well set; Nash sent the ball to the rails twice off Gover, and Awdry driving a delivery from Lock over the bowler's head for four. Owen came on at 113 in place of Gover, and with his fourth ball he got Nash. Later Awdry was bowled with a similar delivery, the innings closing for 137. Surrey opened in a subdued manner, and with the score at four Barling had a life, Wheeler failing to take a hot one in the slips. This mistake threatened to prove costly, but with the score at 27 Barling, in attempting to hook Smith to the boundary, got his leg in front of a straight one and was out lbw. Whitfield, the incoming batsman, failed to score, and Cook, who never settled to play the bowling, was caught as the result of a half-hit shot. The tussle between bat and ball was intensely interesting, and at 46 Awdry made his first bowling change, Fitzgerald coming on at the top end. The change at once proved effective, Mobey being clean bowled. Hadingham and McMurray took the score over the half-century, but neither was ever comfortable. Hadingham should have been dismissed with the score at 52, but C. E. Awdry dropped the catch. When stumps were drawn Surrey had lost four wickets for 34 runs.

When the game was resumed on Tuesday morning the fight for the lead on the first innings became most interesting and so well did Wilts bowl that when Buss, the last man, went in 27 runs were still wanted to top the home side's total. A glorious chance to run one of the batsmen out was lost by loose fielding, and this error proved expensive. Four byes (the first in the innings) brought the scores level and then came the odd run to put Surrey ahead. Almost directly afterwards Owen was caught and bowled without any addition to the score. It seemed that a finish was unlikely, and that Surrey would take the points for the first innings lead, but Wilts, batting again, got out the mark well and 67 runs were on the board before Butler fell a victim to Lock, ruler carried on the good work and was fourth out with an individual total of 54. Runs came steadily, but the Surrey fielding was exceptionally keen. Owen dismissed Fitzgerald in spectacular style, flinging himself bodily at a sharp return to mid-off and holding a catch in one hand. Mobey, too, was again in great form behind the stumps, and he got Ling by taking the ball almost off the bat when the Wiltshireman attempted to turn a scoring shot to leg. The brightest cricket of the day was seen when Smith J. came in. He started by sending Owen to the rails for four, and then in his next over he hit two sixes in succession, fourteen runs coming in one over. Gover, the fast bowler, was brought on to stop Smith's antics, but the batsman was quite at home and sent the first ball away with a terrific hit for three. It was strange to see four men in the deep field for a bowler like Gover. Smith helped himself to another six off Lock, the ball crashing on to the big score board, and then he was missed by Owen. One ball later, however, he was caught at the wicket. In his total of 38 he had three sixes, two fours, a three and a two. This lively scoring had brought a new interest to the game, and with Wilts all out at tea time for 139 there was the prospect of an exciting finish.

When Surrey started on their task, the wicket was playing fairly easily, and they had two and a half hours in which to win. Barling got going straight away and 50 runs were signalled in as many minutes. Barling, with an individual score of 42, had so far, not scored a single. The hundred was sent up in ninety minutes, just over a run a minute, and with seven wickets to fall and Barling still going strong Surrey were odds on favourites for the honours. Barling looked all set for a century but with his score at 93 he got his leg in front of a straight one from Smith W. and was out lbw. In his total he had only six singles, there being a six, eleven fours, seven threes. The game then took another twist and Wiltshire were all on their toes to get Surrey out. A thrilling race against the clock began. With the total at 121 Wheeler smartly caught Hadingham and some demon bowling by the brothers Smith was responsible for three cheap wickets McMurray, Sheffield and Owen all being victims of the lbw. rule. With a quarter of an hour to play there were still two wickets to go down, and when after five minutes Lock was caught the position became tense. Gover and Buss looked quite comfortable but Gover was lbw. to Smith J., and with five minutes to spare Wiltshire had won by 59 runs. It was a grand performance and not since 1921 had Wilts beaten Surrey in Wiltshire. The brothers Smith were superlative, "Bill" claiming 5 wickets for 41 runs and "Jim" 4 for 34.

WILTSHIRE v. DORSET.

No fewer than 25 wickets fell on Wednesday, the first day of the third game of the week, when Wilts opposed Dorset in search of further championship points. Dorset, fresh from their high-scoring victory against Cornwall, brought what was reputed to be a strong batting side, but throughout the day the bowlers were on top and runs were scarce. Colonel Awdry, winning the toss, chose to bat first, but the batsmen found Harrison difficult to score off. When things looked exceedingly ominous Nash again came into the breach with Ling, and the score was lifted from five for 54 to six for 93. The total eventually reached 115, Harrison having the splendid analysis of 8 for 33.

Dorset went in to bat at five minutes past three, and in an hour and fifty minutes they were all out for 55 runs. The opening and the conclusion of the innings were sensational. G. H. White and Brockway, the first wicket pair, were out before a run had been scored. Smith (J.) and R. W. Awdry holding two hot catches. With two runs on the board Bean was caught and then two runs later G. White was bowled, four wickets being down for four runs, of which one was a leg bye. None of the batsmen except Captain Busk appeared comfortable, and the innings was rushed to a close with Smith (W.) performing the "hat-trick." Elderton was the first victim, being caught for 11, then Spear and Harrison were caught off successive balls. Last year Smith performed a similar feat against Berkshire on the same ground, and he came out of this game having taken three wickets for four runs.

Wiltshire batted again with a lead of 60, but they fared none too well, five wickets falling before stumps were drawn for 52 runs.

On being resumed yesterday (Thursday) morning E. M. Nash was run out when only 8 runs had been added to the total. A. J. P. Ling and Smith (J.) batted to good effect, and 83 were on the board at the fall of the seventh wicket, while the next went down with the total at 102. A further 28 were added for the ninth, and when the innings closed Dorset wanted 205 to win.

G. H. White and Brockway opened for Dorset at one o'clock, and the former's wicket, with that of L. H. Bean, who followed, was down for 12 runs in as many minutes. When play was stopped for lunch there were 18 runs on the board. Dorset's third and fourth wickets fell at 29, and then a notable stand by R. G. Tindall and Captain R. D. Busk added 60 runs before the former was sent back. The remaining wickets fell at 96, 102, 113, 118 and 129 respectively. Smith (J.) bowled consistently well, taking nine wickets for 53 runs.

SALISBURY CRICKET WEEK.

FULL PROGRAMME COMPLETED AT BEMERTON.

A GREAT WIN FOR WILTS.

The Wiltshire County Cricket Week, which commenced on Friday closed yesterday (Thursday) and a full programme was completed, all three of the two day matches being brought to a conclusion. The weather at times was unsettled, and there were several short delays for rain, but on the whole the conditions were such that the cricket could be enjoyed in comfort. The showers and the drying sun tended to make the wickets difficult and the bowlers always held an advantage, so that the rate of scoring at times was a little slow. There were few dull periods, as the struggle between bat and ball gripped the interest of all those who were content to see real cricket and not mere stogging.

There were thrilling moments, too, for nothing could have been more exciting than Wiltshire's race against the clock with Surrey, and their ultimate well-deserved victory, with a few minutes to spare. It was a game full of twists and the issue was in doubt until the very last. Jim Smith's mighty hitting will be remembered for a long time.

The Dorset match provided plenty of interest, for here a strong batting side was skilted out for 55 runs in an hour and 50 minutes, Smith (W.) performing the hat trick. The friendly match with Eton Ramblers was again won, but it did not attract much interest. There is a feeling that this game is no longer the draw it was, and that it would be advantageous in the future to arrange to have an M.C.C. side to provide the opposition on the first two days of the week. Only 200 people came to see the Eton Ramblers game, and those pressing for a change have good grounds for the criticism. The stormy weather on Bank Holiday rather deterred a good many from attending and the crowd of 1,000 was 900 short of last year's. As usual the arrangements were made by the committee of the South Wilts Cricket Club. The full details were as follows:

WILTS CLUB AND GROUND V. ETON RAMBLERS.

The start of the first match of the "week" was delayed half an hour to give the wicket, which had suffered from the heavy rain, a chance to dry a little. The Club and Ground took first knock, and with the Eton bowlers receiving a lot of help from the pitch and a strong wind, the scoring was subdued. C. A. Field-Marsham kept a consistently good length, while H. M. Sprot always had the batsmen thinking with his artfully-flighted slows. Two representatives of the South Wilts Club in the Wiltshire side were dismissed cheaply. W. J. Williams, the century scoring bat, was out lbw to a ball that shot without rising an inch, and J. Wort only survived four balls. Field-Marsham clean bowled him. C. H. Stanford, however, contributed a useful 15. F. A. H. Ling and A. L. Awdry were associated in a last-wicket stand, which yielded a valuable 21, but Wilts were dismissed for 141; not at all a bad total considering all things. Field-Marsham came out with the bowling analysis of 7 for 39.

The wicket had improved when Eton went in. Major A. C. Wilkinson, the army batsman, and H. T. Foley, who gave such a fine exhibition of fast scoring last year, were the opening pair, with C. H. Stanford and G. S. Butler bowling. Foley fell a victim to Stanford before he could score, but Wilkinson got into his stride straight away and scored three beautiful fours on the leg side off Butler. A single took him to the other end to face Stanford, and in attempting to hook another shot away to leg he skied the ball, and Butler, running in, brought off a great catch. Wolfe-Murray collected a smart 28, including a six, when he played a bad stroke to another of Stanford's deliveries and was out. Wilts seemed certain of a first innings lead, but Cartwright, the Eton captain, came in to play a real captain's innings, and by patient batting the Wilts total was passed at 6.20 for the loss of eight wickets. When stumps were drawn for the day Eton had a lead of 13 runs with a wicket to fall. When play was resumed on Saturday morning only one more run was added to the overnight total, the innings closing at 155, Cartwright being undefeated with 54.

Wilts, batting again, had 80 on the board before a wicket fell, Butler and Forrester, the opening pair, playing confident cricket. With their dismissal the bowlers gained the ascendancy and five wickets were down for 107. Nash and R. W. Awdry stopped the rot, however, and later, when Stanford joined, Nash, there was a fine seventh wicket stand which produced 52 runs. Nash was not out with 65 when Wilts declared, giving the Ramblers 205 to get to win. They fared badly and lost nine wickets for 80 runs, W. J. Williams at one period having four wickets to his credit for three runs. Carnegie and Sprot were associated in a bright last wicket stand, and 37 runs were added before Carnegie was caught. MINOR COUNTIES' CHAMPIONSHIP.

WILTSHIRE v. SURREY 2ND XI.

For the first time in their own county since 1921, Wiltshire defeated Surrey 2nd XI, at Bemerton on Monday and Tuesday. Wiltshire won by 59 runs. The closing stages of the game were exciting. BRIGHTER CRICKET

**Wiltshire's Dramatic Victory
over Kent 2nd**

Brighter cricket is often yearned for by present-day followers of the game. It came with a vengeance for those who spent Tuesday at the County Cricket Ground, Trowbridge, where Wiltshire and Kent 2nd were engaged in the second day of a Minor Counties fixture, the only one allotted to that ground this season.

A more thrilling match has never been witnessed at this ground, and so uncertain was the result of the game at tea-time that the possibility of a "needle" finish attracted a large number to witness Wiltshire's wonderful victory by 59 runs, a result which midway through the afternoon seemed almost impossible.

Kent were exceptionally keen on securing victory, as they were second in the table, and with a match against Buckinghamshire (the leaders) next week their chances of honours were rosy. Their prospects appeared bright—at least defeat seemed exceedingly remote—at 5.15 when they started their second innings and only 140 runs were required for victory. With the option of claiming an extra half-an-hour to enable a decision to be reached, Kent's optimism was justified, but some amazing bowling by the brothers Jim and W. Smith brought about an utter collapse, and won for the Wiltshire players a wonderful reception from the spectators as they left the ground.

The weather on Monday was glorious, and Wiltshire, securing first innings, were expected to compile a good total. G. S. Butler, W. Lovell Hewitt and J. A. Wheeler all made useful scores, but afterwards the Kent bowlers, Wright in particular, were well on top, and the innings closed at 153. Wright, who is not yet 18 years of age, bowled some very puzzling slow stuff, which had the batsmen always guessing, and his analysis of 6 for 71 was exceptionally praiseworthy.

Kent started their reply at 3.5, Honey and Fairservice (who has performed with distinction many times for the Kent senior eleven) playing the bowling with confidence. Upon Honey's dismissal—a good one from W. Smith did this—R. H. Hewatson joined Fairservice, and immediately the rate of scoring increased, both batsmen being applauded for some graceful strokes all round the wicket. The Wiltshire fielding was splendid, and eventually the tide turned in favour of Wiltshire's bowlers, W. Smith beating Fairservice with a beauty. Hewatson, however, continued his rock-like defence and never looked like coming out, his score when stumps were drawn for the day being 91 not out.

Tuesday's play opened in Wiltshire's favour, a heavy dew proving very advantageous for Fitzgerald to exploit his slow breaks. Hewatson, as was generally hoped, obtained his century, but one run later Lloyd held a ball off J. Smith's bowling to bring about his dismissal. Fitzgerald then obtained two quick wickets, and apart from a "fireworks" display by Ashwell, the remaining batsmen quickly went, and the innings closed at 268, a much smaller total than at one time seemed likely.

It was from this stage that the game fluctuated in a remarkable manner. Butler and Fuller again opened Wiltshire's second innings, 37 runs were soon on the board, and both appeared to be comfortably set. At this stage, however, Blunden got past Butler's defence, and at 42 Fuller "cocked" one into Lewis's hands at mid-on. W. Lovell Hewitt played several balls in his customary stylish fashion, and then Ashwell shattered his stumps for a "duck." Wheeler's failure brought Nash and Lloyd together, and this footballing pair held out until lunch-time, when the score was 62 for 4 wickets, still 51 in arrears of Kent's first innings aggregate.

Naturally, very few of those present were optimistic enough to hope for such a recovery as would save the "Moonrakers" from defeat, particularly when Lloyd and Nash, on resuming, several times just flicked the ball off their wickets. However, the pair remained together, Nash playing stubbornly and with extreme caution, and Lloyd, getting the measure of the bowling, rapidly raising the score with delightful strokes to all parts of the ground. Several bowling changes brought no success to Kent, and the score was taken to 215 before the next wicket fell. In the meantime Lloyd reached his century, and was unlucky to come out when he did. He had hit a couple of splendid boundaries, and was trying to repeat the performance when the ball "got up" on his bat, and soaring to a tremendous height, was well held by Grimshaw in the deep field. Lloyd was

batting about 2½ hours and hit one 6 and sixteen 4's. Nash remained his patient self for several more overs, and was then out to a very good ball from Ashwell. His score was only 40, but he had played his part with remarkable efficiency for over two hours. The value of this partnership was evidence when the remainder of the wickets fell cheaply, the innings closing at 254, leaving Kent 140 to get for victory.

"We want another Surrey 2nd performance," said someone as Jim and W. Smith opened the bowling to Honey and Fairservice. That is almost what did happen, for their bowling proved well-nigh unplayable. The opening pair tried their hardest to take the "sting" out of the deliveries, but the rattle of the wickets was soon heard as Jim Smith started his damage. Half the side were out for 30 runs, and the spectators rose from their seats in great enthusiasm as the stumps were repeatedly straightened by the umpires. The monotony of batsmen walking from the wickets to the pavilion every few minutes was relieved by Ashwell, who made a couple of tremendous hits for sixes and several fours. Then he shared the fate of his predecessors, and the innings closed at 83, nine batsmen being clean bowled. The last wicket fell at about 6.15, when the spectators ran on to the pitch and gave the players a rousing cheer as they went into the pavilion.

No charge was made for admission, but during the two days £2 10s. was taken in collections. Scores:—

BERKSHIRE BEAT WILTS AT BEMERTON.

Berkshire retained their unbeaten record in the Minor Counties Championship at the expense of Wiltshire, whom they defeated on the south Wilts Cricket Club's ground, at Bemerton, on Monday and Tuesday. They won by five wickets, and but for a great innings by F. N. S. Creek, in Wiltshire's second visit to the wickets, might well have secured an innings victory. The match was a splendid one for R. H. C. Human, of Berkshire, who scored 71 and 44 not out, and also took seven Wiltshire wickets. Without him, Wilts might easily have reversed the result. The weather was fine throughout.

Wiltshire won the toss and elected to bat first, G. S. Butler opening with Fitzgerald, E. H. F. Fuller, his usual partner, being absent from the side. R. Human and Relf shared the bowling. The start was not at all good, a single being scored in the first over, and then came seven maiden overs. With the total at nine Fitzgerald was dismissed with a splendid ball without having scored. E. M. Nash joined Butler, but this partnership was broken for the addition of only seven runs. With the total at 25 for three, J. A. Wheeler and A. E. Lloyd considerably improved the position by adding 40 runs. They looked well set, but with the score at 60 Mole took over the bowling from Human, and only five more were added before Lloyd was out bow. Lloyd in his score had hit six fours. The brothers Smith put on 20 runs for the final wicket, Smith (J.) hitting a six and two fours in his 16. The Wilts total was a moderate 126.

Wiltshire started off badly on Tuesday morning, six wickets being down for 43. Creek and Ling then became partners and some fast scoring delighted the Wilts supporters. Ling was eventually dismissed by a good catch by Dollery after scoring 24, which included three fours. This pair had put together 60 runs, bringing the total to 103, and but for this stand it is doubtful if Wilts would have stayed off an innings defeat. Awdry was not in many minutes, but then partnerships between Creek and the brothers Smith added 26 and 35. At the conclusion Creek was undefeated with 70 to his credit.

LEAGUE NOTES.

The wicket was difficult on the Monday morning, so that the Wiltshire batsmen who went in then did very little against the Berks bowlers. Relf, who was bowling throughout the innings, took 4 wickets for 49, R. Human 2 for 20, and A. Mole 4 for 34. At lunch time only one wicket remained to fall, and this took place soon afterwards, when the score stood at 120. H. Lewis and H. Dollery opened for Berks, and between them made 56 runs, until Dollery was caught and bowled by Smith (W.) for 21. H. Lewis was soon caught in the slips for 45. Mediocore play followed until the stand made by R. Human and C. Mole in the evening. Their partnership added 71 runs before Butler dismissed Mole for 40. R. Human, whose wicket was the last to fall, made 71. Berks' total was 215. Wiltshire required 89 runs to avert defeat by an innings. The same evening two of Wiltshire's wickets fell for 16 runs, with F. Fitzgerald not out for 2. On Tuesday morning 3 wickets were down for 37 runs, 4 for 38, 5 for 39, and 6 for 43, and then F. Creek and A. Ling made an invaluable stand while, added 60 runs, and easily passed the Berks' first innings score. A. Ling was caught in the slips when he had made 24 runs. Creek continued to score well, but other wickets fell cheaply, and the innings concluded for 164, Creek having made 70 not out, one run short of the highest score of the match. Berks required 76 runs to win. H. Lewis and H. Dollery opened, and Smith (W.) took H. Lewis' wicket for 12 when the total stood at 17. J. E. Human, who came in next, only added two runs before Lloyd caught him. Four wickets fell for 46 runs, and another at 73, just before the crucial 75 was reached. Stumps were drawn soon after 3 o'clock.
