

COLTS AT OLD TRAFFORD

Dennis and Sellars in Form with the Bat

Following a tedious wait until mid-afternoon, the Yorkshire Colts opened very shakily against their Lancashire rivals at Old Trafford yesterday. On a wicket which had been relieved of much water artificially, but which quickly resorted to tricks, the White Rose representatives lost four wickets for 12 runs, and five for 26 in less than a hour.

The destructive agents were the slow bowlers, Latchford and Wilson, both of whom made the ball turn awkwardly, and only Grimshaw, the early batsman, showed any enterprise. Grimshaw had two 3's from Latchford, both strokes behind the wicket.

When A. B. Sellars and Dennis came together, however, risks were taken which proved profitable, and 50 was run up in 75 minutes. Surviving two confident appeals for obstruction and a dropped catch at mid-on, Sellars reached 21 by forceful cricket before being given out leg before to end a partnership which had produced 33 valuable runs.

The two left-handers, Dennis and Fisher, if more subdued, carried on the good work to the extent of 26 before Fisher was easily stumped in attempting a big drive. Dennis, eighth out, at 86 for a sound 30, easily took the honours of the day.

With nine Yorkshire wickets down for 94 runs the rain brought play to an end after having lasted only two and a quarter hours.

YORKSHIRE COLTS DRAW

Rhodes's Part in Last Wicket Stand

Only first innings points were involved in the match between the junior roses, which concluded at Old Trafford last evening, and these went to Lancashire. The wicket played much easier than on the opening day, but the bowling on both sides was so steady as to compel respect.

Practically the only batsman who took the slightest risk was Rhodes, the Yorkshire bowler, who drove and pulled the Lancashire attack with freedom. He had six fours in his innings of 51, which was his share of a last-wicket partnership which realised 68 runs. The Yorkshire innings eventually reached 162 as a result of three and a half hours' batting, and the total was excellent considering that the first five wickets fell for 26 runs.

The Lancashire reply was a painstaking affair which exceeded the visitors' total with eight wickets down, and which was eventually declared closed at 179 for nine. Taylor made himself highest scorer in the match, but his 58, which included four boundaries, was a tedious knock of two and three-quarter hours. F. D. Beattie, the amateur, played the best cricket for his 32, scored in 40 minutes.

Fisher took the bowling honours with five wickets for 37—figures which did not flatter him. There was no interest in Yorkshire's second innings, which produced 56 for the loss of two wickets in the last hour. Scores:—

YORKSHIRE COLTS Play Curtailed in Game with Staffordshire

(By Our Own Representative)

The two days Minor Counties Championship match between the Yorkshire II. eleven and Staffordshire, which began at Park Avenue, Bradford, yesterday, was seriously interrupted by rain. Not a ball was bowled after the luncheon interval, before which Yorkshire had scored 72 for two wickets, and play was abandoned for the day at four o'clock, the wicket being thoroughly soaked by hail and rain.

The interruption is all the more regrettable as the fixture is the first to be played with Staffordshire for over 20 years, and the Midland side have for long been one of the most powerful among the minor counties. They are not quite at full strength for this game, and they lack Sydney Barnes, who is, of course, the greatest strength of their attack. He is engaged in giving a cricket demonstration at a Manchester store. Nevertheless, they are deemed to be a strong combination, particularly in bowling.

The Yorkshire batsmen who had innings yesterday could not score more than steadily before lunch, but that was good work off the keen-edged Staffordshire attack. Halstead and W. E. Harbord gave the innings a capital start by putting on 45 for the first wicket, and Halstead was well set and not out 34 at lunch. Harbord, too, had looked good for runs when he was caught at long one in trying a big drive.

The wicket was soft with rain when the game started, and the ball came through slowly, although jumping up and hanging sometimes. Towards lunch, however, when a strong cross wind had dried the surface, the bowlers, Lockett in particular, were making the ball turn at a fair pace, and batting caution was necessary.

Included in the Yorkshire side are two newcomers to the Colts—Watnough, the Bradford City football club's winger, and Temple, a bowler from Scarborough.

This fixture fills the vacancy in the Colts' programme caused by the withdrawal of Notts II. from the Minor Counties Championship this season.

YORKSHIRE COLTS IN GOOD POSITION

Cheshire in Danger of Innings Defeat

(From Our Own Representative)

Cheshire won the toss yesterday, at Bramall Lane, Sheffield, in their return match with Yorkshire 2nd XI., and the wicket was in such a perfect condition that they appeared to have a good chance of compensating for their batting failures of the week before, when Yorkshire won by nine wickets, at Chester. The outcome of the day's play, however, was a great surprise, for no fewer than 22 wickets fell for 275 runs, the only batsmen to show any confidence being the Yorkshiremen, Fisher, Turner, and Grimshaw.

Cheshire gave a sorry exhibition in their first innings, and when they went in again for 30 minutes before close of play, they lost two of their best batsmen for 25 runs. Fisher and Hall did splendid work for the home county with the ball, and the former capped his bowling success with an invaluable innings of 61. Wilson bowled his "off-spinners" with great success, but none of the remaining Cheshire bowlers looked dangerous.

The visiting County opened disastrously, Hall clean bowling J. Abell with the fourth ball of the match. Two smart catches at the wicket by Buller, who "kept" very well throughout, followed soon after, and three wickets were down for only 15 runs. When Fisher replaced Grimshaw, he met with instant success, and he broke up the two partnerships that promised runs during the Cheshire innings. The second of these, between Wilson and L. J. Pearson, added 20 runs before the Barnsley left-hander bowled Wilson with a beautiful ball which came in sharply from well outside the off stump. Ten minutes before lunch, the sixth, seventh, and eighth Cheshire wickets fell for two runs, Fisher being the bowler on two occasions, and soon after the interval, Hall finished off the innings, which had only realised 79 runs in 2½ hours. Hall took 5 for 32, and Fisher 4 for 20.

Yorkshire's opening pair, W. E. Harbord and Halstead, started confidently, but with eight on the board, Wilson beat Harbord. The same bowler got Halstead leg-before, but Turner settled down, and hit two fine 4's off successive deliveries from G. P. Burgess. J. R. S. Raper, his partner, never looked comfortable, and after being twice missed in the slips, was all at sea when a length ball from Wilson finally bowled him. Turner continued to score freely, but just when he seemed set for a big score, he fell to a catch at the wicket off Wilson. Yorkshire passed their opponents' total shortly after tea, with five wickets in hand.

Some really bright cricket followed, Grimshaw and Fisher putting on 71 runs in 65 minutes. After a slow start, Grimshaw batted delightfully, being particularly strong on the off side. Wilson, who, before he was rested had taken 5 wickets for 22 runs in 22 overs, returned to the attack, and claimed Grimshaw's wicket with his second ball, which the latter edged into the slips.

Fisher reached his 50 with a glorious late-cut off Wilson, but was out shortly afterwards, hitting across a straight ball from Burgess, and the innings closed for 171—a lead of 92 for Yorkshire. Wilson secured 6 wickets for 33—a fine achievement under such conditions.

Cheshire had half an hour's batting before close of play, which was delayed until 7.0 p.m., and they lost the wickets of J. D. Worthington and J. Abell for 25 runs. They need 67 runs to-day, with eight wickets in hand, to avoid an innings defeat. The attendance was disappointing in view of the perfect cricket weather. Just over 800 watched the match, of which 299 paid £14 6s. 11d. for admission.

COUNTY COLTS' DOUBLE

Another Easy Victory Over Cheshire

(By Our Own Representative)

The Yorkshire Colts defeated Cheshire by nine wickets at Bramall Lane, Sheffield, yesterday, thus successfully crowning their victory by the same margin at Chester only a week before.

The home county were in a commanding position at the start of the second day, for their opponents, who had lost two of their best wickets overnight, had still to score 67 runs to avoid an innings defeat. As Cheshire had only managed to total 79 at their first attempt, it seemed quite possible that Yorkshire would not have to bat again. However, the visiting batsmen put up a more stubborn resistance than was expected, and their last wicket did not fall until twenty minutes after the lunch interval.

Although Cheshire scored 50 more runs than in their first innings, the total was most disappointing on such a perfect batting wicket. The Yorkshire attack was not so effective as on the previous day, but J. A. Richardson, the Scarborough amateur, secured two wickets cheaply towards the end of the innings.

A start was made in brilliant sunshine, J. P. Hodgson and R. S. Skelton facing Turner and Hall, and with his second ball, the York fast bowler knocked Skelton's off and middle stumps out of the ground. Wilson, the mainstay of Cheshire's first innings, joined Hodgson, and the two doubled the total by attractive forcing cricket, before the professional was beaten by Turner. Hodgson continued to play confidently, and although Fisher kept throwing them well up to him, in the hope that he would lift one, he kept all his powerful off-drives on the ground. With W. G. Maybury he put on 25 runs in as many minutes, and the Yorkshire bowling was just beginning to look innocuous when a clever piece of stumping by Buller, off Fisher, disposed of Maybury. E. G. Parker, the captain, left at 88, and two runs later Yorkshire secured their most valuable wicket, Hodgson skying a length ball from Fisher to Halstead, at mid-on.

L. J. Pearson, who had the assistance of a runner—having injured his leg fielding on the boundary on the previous evening—was joined by G. F. G. Rees, and the danger of defeat by an innings was averted. The pair sent up the hundred after the innings had lasted two hours 25 minutes, but when Richardson came on for Fisher at 108, he met with success a few minutes before lunch, bowling Rees.

After lunch, Hall and Richardson repeatedly had the tail batsmen in difficulties, and the amateur finished off the innings by bowling Burgess at 129. Hall took 3 for 32, Fisher 3 for 28, and Richardson 2 for 10.

Yorkshire were faced with the easy task of scoring 38 runs to win. They opened with J. R. S. Raper and Watmough, and the former played some delightful off drives off Burgess before attempting a very short run which left him no chance of getting home. He had scored 16 of the 21 runs put on while he was at the wicket. J. A. Richardson and Watmough maintained the easy rate of scoring, and at length two full-blooded drives by the former put his side ahead, without further loss.

The attendance was very disappointing, less than 200 watching the match.

STAFFS RECOVER

FINE PLAY BY HARBORD

HEADINGLEY, Monday

After a somewhat indifferent start, the Yorkshire Colts ran up a very useful total against Lancashire in their Minor Counties match here to-day, and Lancashire will have their work cut out to score the 300 odd runs necessary for a lead on the first innings. The day's play ably demonstrated the potential batting strength of the Yorkshire 2nd XI., for after their first four wickets had fallen for 129, the tall wagged so effectively that 296 runs were on the board before the final wicket fell, with the fourth ball of the last over.

The three main features of Yorkshire's innings were a very fine display by W. E. Harbord, an extremely good, if not quite so spectacular, effort by Grimshaw, and a valiant exhibition by the wicket-keeper, Buller, who showed his great progress as a batsman by failing only by a single to reach his half-century.

The wicket was too soft for a prompt start, but Yorkshire had an hour's batting before lunch, in which they lost the wickets of Bedford and Turner. The best of the bowlers appeared to be Parkin, a son of the old Lancashire player, and Phillipson, a medium fast bowler, who compelled respect. Parkin, who bowls off-spinners, flighted the ball cleverly at first and claimed two of the first three wickets.

Harbord and Bedford were together at the interval, before which the former had started with great confidence, playing some splendid strokes in front of the wicket. He was rather lucky to escape being run out at 32, but a piece of wild fielding saved him. After lunch, the score rose from 54 to 73 before Bedford, who had scored a sound 37, was bowled by a yorker from Parkin.

Then a splendid stand between Harbord and Grimshaw added 56 for the fourth wicket. The amateur was giving a very fine display of forcing cricket, and he eventually made 62 in an hour before he was caught in the slips. While he and Grimshaw were together the bowling was made to look quite innocuous, but when he left three wickets fell for 30 odd runs.

H. G. Coates began well, then survived a very awkward ten minutes, when he failed to time most of his shots, and finally, when at last he seemed to have settled down, he was well bowled by Latchford. J. A. Richardson and Fisher were out cheaply, but then a really great stand for the eighth wicket ensued, Grimshaw and Buller putting on 84 in enterprising style.

Grimshaw played one of his best innings, and scored fast except for a short period just before his 50, while Buller played a very straight bat to all length balls, and hit any loose deliveries with terrific force. At 211 Grimshaw was missed off a difficult skying mis-hit to mid-off, but this was practically his only mistake, and his 83 was a most valuable effort.

Yorkshire's batting resources were not by any means exhausted at the fall of the eighth wicket, for Major R. C. Chichester-Constable hit up a merry 30, and with Buller put on 44 for the ninth wicket. The wicket-keeper was extremely unlucky to miss a half-century, which he richly deserved, by one run. Major Chichester-Constable continued in great style, and one flashing drive through the covers off Higson, the rival captain, was the most delightful shot of the whole day.

Tedious Batting by Lancastrians

RAIN STOPS PLAY

(By Our Special Representative)

HEADINGLEY, Tuesday

The Minor County Championship match between Yorkshire 2nd XI. and Lancashire 2nd XI., which was concluded here to-day, resulted in a draw, the home county taking points for a lead on the first innings. This lead was the very substantial one of 203 runs, and Yorkshire thus avenged their only reverse this season, sustained at Old Trafford in May, when Lancashire took first innings points.

This concluding day did not produce such interesting and enjoyable cricket as had its predecessor, for although Lancashire were dismissed for a very small total, their innings was a long drawn out affair, and before lunch the spectators were treated to an incredibly tedious display of batting. On the form shown in this match, Yorkshire were very much the better side, and they now occupy one of the leading positions in the Minor Counties table.

Owing to bad light, play began thirty minutes after schedule, and only a small number of spectators risked the thunder-storm that seemed imminent. However, the clouds lifted and Parkin and Hawkwood went out to open Lancashire's innings, facing a total of 296. Hall and Turner were the bowlers, and at 10 Hawkwood was missed at backward point off the latter by Fisher. Turner's next over produced the first wicket, however, Parkin being well beaten by a ball which came across to take his off stump. Hall was bowling fast and well, and he claimed the next wicket, dismissing F. D. Beattie at 22.

Then followed a period of intense inactivity. Oldfield was l.b.w. to Turner, but joined by Farrimond, the wicket-keeper, Hawkwood resolutely refused to hit at anything. After an hour and twenty minutes, he reached double figures, amid sarcastic applause, and ten minutes later, when this feat had apparently failed to inspire either batsman, the spectators began to cheer every stroke. The Yorkshire bowling was very accurate, and permitted few liberties, but this ultra-cautious display was not justified.

Bedford replaced Turner at the pavilion end, and the field spread out expectantly, but Hawkwood was not to be tempted, and the outfield remained undisturbed. Finally, when he had batted 105 minutes for 14 runs, Hawkwood walked in front of a ball from Fisher, and was out leg-before. Horrocks, the Australian, was out to a very fine catch by Halstead, and half the wickets were down for 58 at lunch.

FISHER AND TURNER BOWL WELL

After the interval the last five wickets only added 41 runs. Farrimond played some nice shots and scored at a more lively pace—he had made 11 in just under an hour before lunch—but he was unfortunately run out at 76. Latchford hit the ball hard towards the on boundary, and while trying for a second run arrived at the same end as his partner. Farrimond ran hard for the opposite crease, but Buller was too quick for him, and he was out by yards. Bennett, another Australian, was also run out, and the rest offered little resistance.

Fisher and Turner bowled excellently, taking 4 for 22 and 3 for 31 respectively. The former sent down 11 maidens in 23 overs, and the latter 10 in 31—eloquent testimony to their consistently accurate length.

The follow-on was naturally enforced, but Lancashire never looked like collapsing a second time, and put on 72 for 2 before the match was abandoned owing to rain. Parkin batted extremely well for his 41, bringing off some well judged cuts and drives, while Hawkwood did not indulge in his former dour tactics to such a marked

degree. J. A. Richardson had a short turn with the ball, and kept an excellent length for seven overs, which only yielded nine runs.

FINE WORK BY THE COLTS

Winning Lead Established Over Durham

(By Our Special Representative)

REDCAR, Monday
Although rain had been blowing in off the sea throughout the night, a full day's play was possible here to-day, when Yorkshire Colts began their final match in the Minor County Championship against Durham. The home county had very much the better of the play, and finished up 106 runs in front of their opponents' first innings total, with eight wickets in hand. Features of the day's play were the fine all round form of Turner, the Sheffield player, and convincing displays by the Yorkshire bowlers.

It seemed likely before the start of the match that the absence of Fisher and Hall would considerably weaken the Yorkshire Colts side. As things turned out, it is highly improbable that the side could have given a better display had these two been taking part. Douglas, the Bradford bowler, proved a splendid substitute for Fisher, and both Rhodes and Turner were seen at their best. Winning the toss, Durham opened their innings with C. L. Adamson and Gibbon to the bowling of Rhodes and Turner, and this pair pegged them down so successfully, that only 9 runs had been scored after three-quarters of an hour's play. The first hour produced 16 runs, and then a successful bowling change broke up this stubborn partnership. Douglas replaced Rhodes, and with the last ball of his first over, he got Gibbon caught in the slips by Turner.

John Adamson joined his brother, but he did not stay long. At 23 he was dismissed in exactly the same manner, Turner taking another slip catch off Douglas. In his next over, Douglas claimed another victim, beating Hirst with an off spinner which the batsman made no attempt to play.

When he had bowled unchanged for 1 1/2 hours, Turner was relieved by Rhodes, and with his first ball, the latter clean bowled Clark. T. K. Dobson, the Durham captain, joined Adamson, who had only 16 to his name after 1 1/2 hours' batting. Dobson brightened matters up slightly with a few lusty drives, and the pair were together at lunch when Durham had 57 on the board with six wickets left.

After lunch the downfall of Durham came with unexpected suddenness. Adamson, having occupied 2 1/2 hours over his 23, was caught at point by Rhodes, and Dobson left to a good catch at the wicket. The last four batsmen only totalled three runs between them, and Douglas and Rhodes shared the wickets. Douglas took 6 for 42 and Rhodes the other 4 for 25, but the most remarkable performance of all, in some respects, was that of Turner, who sent down 17 overs, 14 of which were maidens, for no more than three runs.

Facing this moderate total, Yorkshire made an indifferent start. At ten, Halstead was bowled playing back to Ellis, but then Yorkshire's troubles ended. By sound cricket, Bedford and Turner put on 89 for the second wicket, the Durham total being passed with nine wickets still in hand.

With the score at 99, Bedford's valuable innings came to an end. He fell to a catch off Ellis, having made 36. Wade, the King Cross batsman joined Turner, and until stumps were drawn the spectators were treated to a first-class exhibition of forcing cricket. Turner went from strength to strength. He was badly missed when 49, but after that his hitting was so powerful that four lofty drives fell within measurable distance of a fieldman. He hit eight fours and two sixes, and was only one short of his century when play ended.

COLTS WIN A GREAT MATCH

Durham All but Avoid Defeat

BRIGHT BATTING

REDCAR, Tuesday
The Yorkshire colts gained a brilliant victory over Durham in their final Minor County Championship fixture here to-day by five wickets, and this success takes them to the head of the Northern section of the table, while they occupy third place in the combined table. This second day proved most eventful, and the game never once flagged in interest.

Yorkshire were able to increase their first innings lead to 180 before declaring with six wickets down, and then Durham, thanks to a wonderful ninth wicket stand between their captain, T. K. Dobson and G. T. J. James, ran up a score of 276 at their second attempt.

Yorkshire were left with an hour and 35 minutes in which to score 97 runs—a task which presented undoubted difficulties in the face of an excellent attack, but they accomplished the task with 20 minutes to spare.

Major Chichester Constable, at the beginning of the day decided to prolong the innings, and establish a commanding lead if possible before declaring. So Turner and Wade went out to resume the profitable overnight partnership, and the second ball of the morning provided a single for Turner to complete a great century. Ten runs later he was out, caught in front of the pavilion. His innings was an admirable one, for he scored fast off a steady attack, just when quick run-getting was imperative. His 110 included two sixes and nine fours, while, with Wade, he had put on 97 for the third wicket.

N. W. D. Yardley did not last long, and when Wade's valuable innings came to an end, the closure was applied.

FLUCTUATING GAME

At this point, Yorkshire were in a strong position, and in the short period before lunch they improved their chances of victory by securing two useful wickets. The afternoon provided some thoroughly entertaining cricket, and Yorkshire several times seemed to have a grip on the game only to lose it again.

Durham had eight men out for 147, but then the whole aspect of the game was changed by a ninth wicket partnership between Dobson and James, which added 112 runs. Dobson began to hit extremely hard as soon as he came in, and with James adopting similar tactics, the score mounted at a great pace. James landed a terrific pull off Rhodes into Trafalgar Terrace, which runs parallel to the ground.

An over later, Dobson reached his hundred. He continued to force the pace, but at 259 he lost James, and the innings closed at 276—a total undesired of earlier in the afternoon.

Yorkshire were thus set 97 to win in just over an hour and a half, playing extra time, and the foundation of their victory was well laid by Rhodes and Turner. These two scored 71 before being separated in the face of a desperately keen attack. Rhodes hit with freedom and remarkable precision, while the power behind many of Turner's lofty drives was extraordinary. His innings, which terminated just after Rhodes was bowled, included another prodigious assault upon the terrace which can seldom have been so often disturbed in one afternoon. Durham never relaxed their efforts, but although they claimed three more wickets—all at 76—their success ended at this point, and Grimshaw and Nutton hit off the remaining runs necessary.
