Lewis had an early escape when he was dropped at mid-on, but when he had made five he fell to the wiles of Parker.

With the score at 140 for six wickets, matters did not look at all favourable for Kent, but Simpson came in to hold the fort and saw both Cobb and W. H. V. Levett go before the score had reached 188. The Kent captain went on to reach his half-century in as many minutes, but with the addition of a further five runs to his score he was out lbw to Parker. Cole and Wright took the score to 230 before Cole was caught by McMurray off Parker when he had made only one.

Parker, despite a bad start, proved the most successful of the Surrey bowlers and finished the day with an analysis of seven wickets for 94 runs.

Mobey and McMurray opened the Surrey innings, but they received an early set back after ten minutes, when Mobey got his leg in front of a straight ball from Wright. Wilson came in to partner McMurray and the pair played out time, stumps being drawn wit
