

MINOR COUNTIES' CRICKET.

KENT 2nd XI v. SURREY 2nd XI.

The minor counties match between the Kent and Surrey second elevens opened at Folkestone yesterday (Thursday) in glorious sunshine, but there was only a handful of spectators present throughout the day.

Kent won the toss and set about compiling a total of 230 in a manner, apart from a breezy knock by G. A. Simpson, that proved very dull fare for those present to watch. However, Simpson, the Kent captain, provided some fireworks during his fifty minutes' stay at the wicket, scoring at the rate of over a run a minute, but when he had reached 53 he got his leg in the way of a straight ball from Parker. While his innings lasted it was a treat to watch, his best strokes including four sixes and three fours. One six landed on the covered terracing and carried away a piece of the roofing.

Fagg and Sunnocks put on 69 for the first wicket before Fagg was clean bowled by Owens, when he had been 1 hour 25 minutes at the wicket to score 47 runs. Sunnocks, with 23 to his credit, was bowled by Maxwell, and this brought Crawford and Hill together. Crawford opened strongly and his first scoring shot was a straight drive to the boundary for four. This was soon followed by another for six.

Parker was bowling well from the south end and play became very subdued, but eventually Hill was bowled by Parker, after he had taken an hour to score eleven. Just previously, Kent had reached the 100 mark after 2 hours 25 minutes. Parker secured another wicket soon after, when he clean bowled Crawford, who had made 17 in just under half an hour, and five minutes later uprooted A. S. P. Mason's off stump. Lewis had an early escape when he was dropped at mid-on, but when he had made five he fell to the wiles of Parker.

With the score at 140 for six wickets, matters did not look at all favourable for Kent, but Simpson came in to hold the fort and saw both Cobb and W. H. V. Levett go before the score had reached 188. The Kent captain went on to reach his half-century in as many minutes, but with the addition of a further five runs to his score he was out lbw to Parker. Cole and Wright took the score to 230 before Cole was caught by McMurray off Parker when he had made only one.

Parker, despite a bad start, proved the most successful of the Surrey bowlers and finished the day with an analysis of seven wickets for 94 runs.

Mobey and McMurray opened the Surrey innings, but they received an early set back after ten minutes, when Mobey got his leg in front of a straight ball from Wright. Wilson came in to partner McMurray and the pair played out time, stumps being drawn with the Surrey score standing at 30 for one wicket, McMurray and Wilson being not out.

KENT 2nd XI. BEATING MONMOUTH

For the first time in the long years that cricket has been played at Ashford, the Kent County Committee favoured the town with a Kent second eleven fixture on Thursday and Friday, when Monmouth were the visitors and the attendance was very good.

In the Kent side three young amateurs were making a first appearance, F. S. Bird, the Wellington College wicketkeeper; W. R. H. Joynson, the Harrow boy, and J. H. Clark, of Cranbrook, who has done well for Ashford.

Monmouth arrived with only ten men, as N. Williams, of the Ashford Club acted as substitute.

Although the Kent skipper won the toss, he decided on taking first knock, despite the wicket being in a sodden condition

after the night's rain. As it turned out the opening batsmen were soon in difficulties, Sunnucks, Bird and Wright being out for 31.

When Clark joined Joynson, the wicket had dried a lot and both scored freely in front of the wicket. Clark commenced very confidently, while Joynson, quiet at first, hit well. The pair added 63 when Clark mis-hit a ball to mid-on. 97 for 4. When Lewis arrived rain came on and lunch was taken.

On resuming at three o'clock, Spencer, with an off-drive, sent up the 100, but fourteen runs later, he was out from a mis-hit to mid-on. Lewis played across a straight ball and Ashwell followed suit and eight wickets were down for 135.

The Kent skipper, with Cole, played sparkling cricket, G. S. Simpson driving well, while Cole played soundly. Both were together at the tea interval, when the score was 206 for 8.

Continuing, Simpson was missed when 60 and again two runs later, but continued to hit brilliantly. He lost Cole, who had done extremely well, having put on 101 for the ninth wicket. Simpson was last out and hit three sixes and seven fours in his stay of ninety minutes.

Monmouth made a miserable show against Lewis, the Kent slow left-hander. With the exception of Pitchford, who went in first and was last out, no one except Dolman showed any pretention to play. Lewis, actually took seven wickets for 27 runs.

Play will commence on Friday at 11, when Monmouth will follow on.

BRILLIANT HITTING AND DEADLY BOWLING

The Kent 2nd XI. finished their list of matches at Ashford on Friday, when they gained an easy victory over Monmouthshire.

In the twelve matches they have played in the Minor Counties' Championship Kent have won two, lost three and drawn seven.

Monmouthshire arrived at Ashford one man short on Thursday, so N. Williams, a local amateur, fielded for them, but they batted only ten men.

On the first day Kent held a decided advantage, thanks to a splendid forcing innings by G. A. Simpson, the skipper, who, assisted by Cole, put on 101 for the ninth wicket.

Monmouthshire made a sorry show, and when Lewis, the slow left-hander, went on for Cole at 14, he took seven for 27. At the close of play Kent held a lead of 159 runs.

It was generally thought that the Kent skipper would enforce the follow-on, but he gave his side an hour and a half's batting on Friday, in which time 172 runs were scored.

Sunnucks and Ashwell at once commenced to hit, and Ashwell dominated the batting and hit splendidly, reaching 50 in fifteen minutes, a couple of sixes clearing the ring. Thomas, in five overs, had 51 scored off him.

Sunnucks made some clean hits in front of the wicket. Ashwell had a "life" at extra-cover when 61, and then when he had made another run he was caught in the deep. His 62 out of 93, made in 35 minutes, included two sixes and eleven fours—56 in 13 hits.

Allan and Pitchford soon dismissed the others, and when the innings was declared closed Monmouthshire were set to make 32 to win.

In the forty minutes before lunch they fared disastrously, losing five wickets for 16 runs. With the score at 14, Lewis went on for Cole. In his first over he had Taylor stumped and Allan caught at point for one run.

Ashwell, in the next over, had three wickets for no runs but bowled a no-ball, and half the side was out for 16. The remaining wickets fell quickly after lunch, and Monmouthshire were all out for 47.
