

**NORTHUMBERLAND 244**  
**After Losing Five Wickets**  
**For 57**

**DURHAM'S FINE RESPONSE**

In the opening Minor Counties match of the season at Jesmond yesterday Northumberland, winning the toss and batting first, were in from 11.30 until 5 o'clock, and in an actual playing period of four hours 25 minutes scored 244 runs off 97 overs. A very useful total and an extraordinarily good one considering that five wickets were down at lunch for a mere 57 runs. Actually 163 runs were added between lunch and tea, about 125 minutes, for the loss of only three more wickets.

In the time remaining for play, an hour and three-quarters—the close on the first day has now been extended to 7 o'clock—Durham scored 83 without loss and therefore require 163 this morning to get the lead on the first innings.

Though a very boisterous wind made conditions somewhat unpleasant and caused wired balls to be brought into use there was compensation in a warm sun, and after lunch the ground was comfortably filled. The wicket was shown to be good for runs, and the fact that the earlier Northumberland batsmen could not get going may have been due in part to lack of match practice this season. In any case the bowlers were well on top up to lunch, and 57 runs in two hours was very slow going indeed.

Durham met with an early success, Ellis getting Mackay l.b.w. in his third over, as 6, and then at 21, with the game an hour old, Ord was run out. Mutch played the ball and it was his call, but there was not a run in it. Ord, however, ran for one and was three parts down before he turned, and, of course, could not get back in time. Mutch had been in 90 minutes for 17 and the total was 41 when Carr bowled him with an off-spinner. Four runs later he got Shield with a similar ball, and last ball before lunch had Lee caught, and went in with the following figures:—

**A BIG CHANGE**

There was a big change after the break. Only nine runs had been scored from Ellis's first 12 overs, but 43 were taken from the next 12. Similarly with Howell, who had 42 scored from him in 12 overs after having 7-4-5-0 in his first spell.

Bruce, in second wicket down at half-past twelve, had set himself the task of wearing the bowling down, and having played defensive cricket began to hit. McKinnell, playing well forward and getting runs by driving, scored 25 while helping Bruce to add 46 at a run a minute. He was let off when 14 by Ellis dropping a catch at mid-off, and Bruce (35), too, had a life at leg, Carr in each case being the unlucky bowler.

Carr finally bowled McKinnell at 103, but another 56 runs had been added by Bruce and Robson before Bruce was caught at the wicket off the fifth ball of Daggart's first over as fourth change. Bruce, who had 32 singles in his 51 runs, made in 135 minutes, stayed at a time when Northumberland looked like being out for under three figures.

Robson and Atkinson afterwards forced the pace, and the former reached 50 out of 35 in an hour, having then hit seven 4's, and the left-hander got to 63 (nine 4's, chiefly off-drives) before mishitting one behind the wicket for Woodhouse, running back to make a very good catch, taking the ball as it came over his shoulder. It was one of Robson's best displays for the county.

The last two wickets added 24. Carr, brought back, bowled Atkinson first over, and Allen was splendidly caught with one hand by Daggart to give Howell his only wicket. Atkinson again showed that he can get runs, and there were five 4's in his 33.

Included in the 32 extras were six boundary byes. James, the wicket-keeper was hurt early in the innings, and this handicapped him in his stopping.

Carr was the best of the bowlers, coming off the pitch more quickly than the others, and always looking more likely to take a wicket.

**51 OUT OF 64**

Durham, starting their innings at 5.15, did not score a run until the seventh over, but Gibbon, after getting his eye in, hit so well that he had 51 out of 64 in 75 minutes, having hit six 4's, and finished up with 64 not out (eight boundaries) against Adamson's 17. Drives and leg shots brought him most of his runs. Eighty-three in 105 minutes does not look particularly enterprising batting on paper, but it means that Durham can do a little more score-building this morning and then go in for forcing matters, with the object of getting a lead big enough (and early enough) to have a chance of winning outright.

They have to get in front first, however, and the fight for that object should make to-day's play particularly interesting.

# TIE AT JESMOND

## How Durham Saved a Point

### EXCITING DAY'S PLAY

At one period of the play at Jesmond yesterday there was a possibility of Durham forcing a win, and that was at tea-time, when after the teams had tied on the first innings at 214, Northumberland had lost half their second innings wickets for 67 runs, and there was a possible 135 minutes left for play, but a useful sixth wicket partnership, followed by a Robson-Atkinson unbroken stand starting at 5.10, made a draw the only outcome, and when at 6 o'clock Northumberland's score stood at 163 for seven stumps were drawn.

A tie on the first innings is so unusual an occurrence that Durham have not had the experience before, and Northumberland only once, at Preston 11 years ago. The net result is that each county gets 2 points.

The fight for first innings lead, always very keen, became particularly so after lunch, when with Durham's last pair, Dobson and Ellis, together they needed 37 runs to top their opponents' score.

Northumberland tried all they knew to separate the pair, but Dobson, looking for runs off every ball, and Ellis, backing him up well and getting runs himself, too, got the total to 240. A couple of quick singles, 212, and then an off-drive by Dobson, which looked only good for a single, but was made into a two by an overthrow, and the scores were level.

Durham seemed bound to get the lead now, but Ellis lost his wicket next ball through over-keenness. Dobson played one short on the off-side, Ellis galloped down the pitch, only to be sent back—it was not his call—and a throw back to the bowler's end was gathered by Allan on his knees and the wicket broken. A really thrilling finish to a remarkable over.

#### ELLIS'S PART

Ellis's impetuosity cost his side the first innings lead, but he also made it possible for Durham to save defeat on the first innings.

When he came in at 1.20 Durham, with nine wickets down, were 57 behind the Northumberland total and seemed certain to finish in arrears. Dobson, trying hard to save the day, had not had anyone to stay with him, but Ellis did, and at lunch the Durham captain had passed his half-century. They were together another 25 minutes after the break and made their 57 runs at two a minute.

Dobson, not out 78, was batting 115 minutes and made his runs out of 124. He had eleven 4's, a three, and eight 2's. Drives and leg strokes particularly hard pulls, brought him most of his runs, and though his display was not without blemish, it was the best of the day and the fighting innings of a captain. He was caught off a no ball in the 40's, gave a chance of stumping at 25, and had the umpire's verdict in his favour when he broke his wicket just before lunch. In the umpire's opinion the stroke had been completed before the ball struck the wicket.

Durham started the day in quite a favourable position, needing 162 to get ahead on the first innings with all wickets standing. But they found the Northumberland bowling, particularly that of Lee, difficult to play, and lost nine wickets between 11 o'clock and 1.20 while adding 104 runs.

To start with they lost Gibbon to the second ball of Lee's first over with the score unchanged. Hickman, keeping the ball down, drove in useful style, but the

first time he got it up was out to a splendid catch by Mutch, who, running quite 15 yards from mid-off, took the ball behind the bowler's wicket.

This was at 111, and nine runs later Northumberland at last got rid of Adamson, who played a bad shot in lifting the ball to leg for Mutch to hold the catch. Adamson had spent two hours and three-quarters over 25 (23 singles). Lee got his third wicket when Woodhouse was leg before after surviving a confident appeal, and bowling Doggart next ball had taken his last three for 11 runs in six overs.

#### NOT NATURAL

Handy, probably forced by circumstances to play a game not natural to him, was never comfortable, though staying over half an hour, and Atkinson bowled him at 166. Carr tried to hit, but after a couple of 4's did not properly get hold of an Allan ball and Atkinson at mid-off held a banging skyer.

Four runs later (179) Atkinson bowled Howell, and Lee, back after resting, following a spell of an hour and three-quarters, bowled James from the Avenue end. Then came the Dobson-Ellis stand.

Durham took 15 minutes longer than Northumberland to get the same number of runs.

Lee, bowling 37 overs, 14 more than anyone else, came out with 5 for 72.

Ellis early showed in the Northumberland second innings that he was in his old form. Shield, promoted to opening batsman, Mackay dropping to third wicket down, was bowled at nine, and at 39 Ord played the ball with his pads and was given out leg before. At 45 Bruce chopped one on, Carr got Mutch caught at the wicket first ball of his over as change, and Ellis claimed his fourth wicket when he got rid of Mackay in a similar way. Half the side were out for 63 in 75 minutes.

Lee and McKinnell stayed together half an hour, adding 20, but the danger was not removed when McKinnell then left, bowled by Ellis, for Lee was leg before to the same bowler at 90; but Robson and Atkinson, coming together at 5.10, not only stayed until 6 o'clock but scored 73 runs. Atkinson, taking three 4's in one over, finished up with 41 (74 for the match) and Robson 29 (92 in the game).

Ellis bowled very well to take 6 for 31 in 22 overs.

There was a fair crowd for a second day, and the weather kept fine though still of the sweater kind for fieldsmen.

**BOWLING FEATS AT BENWELL**

**ANOTHER BIG SCORE BY J. G. ADAMSON**

**BOLDON LEAD THE LEAGUE**

There were several changes in the Northumberland League as a result of Saturday's games. Benwell moved up to within three points of Tynemouth (not playing and a match in hand), Blyth dropped from second to sixth, and others went up one.

Blyth, against Wallsend, opened quite well with 88 for the first wicket, but three men were out for 62, while four more wickets fell for a single run. Gibbons and Oliver each having two victims in following overs. Hutchinson, the professional, improved matters with three 6's (out of the ground), but the total only reached 91, of which Scott, opening batsman and sixth out at 53, made 40, chiefly with leg shots. After the first hour the bowlers got help from the wicket, and the stumps were hit nine times. Wallsend lost Clark to Hutchinson's third ball, a return catch cocked up from a defensive stroke, but Patterson and Oliver added 47 before Oliver was adjudged c. and b. to Graham. There was some doubt whether the ball had been played on to the ground first. Bicalton, at 75, was bowled by a ball he tried to "pad" out, and at the same total Patterson, then 42, chopped a ball on to his off ball. Thompson was bowled at 84, but the sixth pair won the match. Hutchinson, really unlucky with his bowling, varied his methods, but might have been more successful if changed round earlier. The fielding on both sides was uncertain, and Blyth made one costly miss.

Robinson, when only five, was given out in a remarkable way at Old Benwell, opening the innings against Morpeth. He lifted a ball to the boundary, where Curry, in making the catch on the line, fell over the seats. The umpire, after consultation with spectators on the spot, gave Robinson out. Lough and H. Milburn carried the score to 46 and then Nicholl, a newcomer from Dewsbury, failed to score, and soon half the side were out for 65. The next three wickets added 52, but a total of 118 did not seem beyond Morpeth, who looked yet for a win when the score stood at 89 for five, but thanks chiefly to Robinson, who wrought disaster with 5 for 5, Benwell won by 14 runs. Gillespie had four 6's and four 4's in a half-century. The bowling figures of Wright and Robinson are worth giving in full:

Tynedale, lacking Fenwick and Graham, had the good fortune to bat first against County at Hexham and totalled 151. Bland had two 6's and seven 4's and Thompson two 6's. Haworth, coming in late, had 4 for 14. County lost seven wickets for 62, but Bolam and Booth made a stand and Tynedale only won by 15 in the end, Booth (a better batsman than many have given him credit for) making 40.

Close House mastered the Backworth bowling, and after 160 minutes were able to declare at 200 for six. Adamson, in first wicket down, was within seven of his century when Fenwick took his middle stump. Although the latter bowled 40 overs he was only able to account for two of the visitors, but he certainly kept the score down, despite poor fielding. Backworth went in for hard hitting, and their opening pair, Johnson and Baker, scored rapidly against a well placed field, but over-eagerness and the failure of the

tail-enders, gave victory to Close House, who had Backworth out for 145 with twenty minutes to spare.

Adamson has made 55, 41, 54, and 83 in his last four innings and now has an average of 50.

Benwell Hill won the toss, and sent Percy Main in to bat on a rapidly drying wicket; but some steady batting was shown by the home side, 185 runs being made in 155 minutes. Rhind, in at the fall of the second wicket, when the total was 52, was ninth out at 111 for 59. The Hill fielding was excellent.

The Benwell Hill batsmen were never at home with the bowling. Only 42 runs had been hit off Rhind and Howling in 23 overs, four wickets having been lost in collecting them, when a double change was tried. At that point Rhind had bowled 11-7-14-2. His last six overs were maidens, and yet the skipper took him off. The judgment was good, because Usher got rid of Howling in his first over, and from the other end Pirie, in his fourth over, secured the wickets of Clark and Saunders. The opening pair were then brought back, and with the first, third, and sixth balls of his first over Howling cleaned bowled J. McKinnell, Toddie, and Simpson to finish off the game.

## ORD AND ALLAN IN FORM AT JESMOND

### Lancashire's Slow Play

The cricket week at Jesmond had a very quiet opening yesterday. Lancashire II., who brought up a side including eight men with first team experience, one of them, Washbrook, playing here for the first time, lost the toss, but got a helpful start when Nutter, fast right hand, bowled Mutch at seven in his second over, the ball breaking back quickly from the off. The pitch was easy paced, but Nutter and Phillipson, both fast, made the ball skid a little, and it was difficult to get them away. Mackay and Ord, however, forced a change at the cemetery end, and runs came more freely with Wilson bowling. When he began to overpitch and was taken off the skipper, Higson, put himself on, to the benefit of the batsmen, though a chance was missed off his bowling.

#### BUTTERWORTH'S BOWLING

Phillipson came back, displacing Nutter, who had lost none of his accuracy; but it was the amateur, Butterworth, bowling from the cemetery end, who broke up the second wicket stand after it had made 63 runs at a run a minute, and was chiefly responsible for a pre-lunch collapse.

In his third over, at 70, he got Mackay caught at square leg for 27, including three 4's, and then two more wickets fell for a single between them. First Bruce, before he had scored, was caught by Farrimond, standing back to Phillipson, and then Shield snicked one in Butterworth's fourth over to be taken at slip. Rhind was never comfortable against Butterworth's lighting, but looked like staying in until lunch, only to be bowled last ball by a googly, at 80.

Robson, Ord's partner after lunch, was shaping well when he cocked a Nutter ball back to slip at 113. With Atkinson in Ord reached his 50 out of 114 in 140 minutes and the seventh wicket had added 55 before Lancashire got rid of the left-hander who is to play for Morpeth from now on. Ord's 79 was a valuable effort and good cricket, too. Leg shots, especially in the early part, brought him six 4's in his first 40, to be followed by 12 singles, and then a bright wind up, with 4's from his last three scoring shots.

Butterworth had got Ord's wicket via Farrimond, standing close up, and the innings was over 12 minutes later. Moffat, who batted without gloves, was bowled almost with a full pitch, Atkinson (again driving well) played on from Greenhalgh, the ball keeping low, and Allan lifted one back to Butterworth. The innings lasted 205 minutes and between the fall of the fifth and seventh wickets 88 runs were put on in 70 minutes, much the brightest period.

Butterworth, leg break spin bowler, got his 6 for 47 in two spells, 8.4-1-11-3 before lunch and 3 for 8 in 12 balls at the finish. Of the other six bowlers—Higson certainly rang the changes—Nutter's length and accuracy is shown by his figures.

Lancashire opened their innings at 3.55, and had to bat an hour before tea could be taken. Hawkwood and Washbrook, the first pair, remained together to the interval, but scored rarely, yet they managed to take the total to 47 before Allan got Hawkwood cleverly caught at the wicket after 95 minutes' actual play. Then two more wickets fell quickly, Nutter, missing in trying to drive Allan, being stumped when the ball came back off the wicketkeeper's foot, and Beattie giving Mackay an easy catch at forward short leg two balls later. Both fell at 55, but Greenhalgh stayed 35 minutes while Washbrook was scoring 24 out of 28 before Allan took his off bail. Wilson, sent in to

play out time, was fortunate to survive, particularly in the last over, and Lancashire finished up 92 behind with six wickets in hand, including Farrimond's.

Washbrook (lucky not to be run out near the end), watching the ball carefully and not taking any risks, has so far made 61 (eight 4's and two 3's), and used the pull shot profitably. The scoring rate was very slow, however—88 runs in 160 minutes—and it was not surprising that there was some barracking in the form of ironical applause.

At the same time, there was very little loose in the Northumberland bowling, and Allan's figures at the close were:—

Remarkable figures indeed. He had three spells—one run off seven overs, three for 13 in 13 overs, and one for one in four overs.

It was rather curious that none of the eight no balls in the home innings was scored from. Sawdust was needed from the first and the outfield was dead in parts.

Naturally a good deal of interest was shown in the bowling of Ian Peebles, the tall Scotsman who bowls right arm medium pace, nips off the pitch quickly, and, most important of all, bowls to his field. He had four batsmen caught at short leg, and also kept runs down by good setting of the field.

**LANCASHIRE LACK ENTERPRISE**

**Valuable Innings by Mutch**

Lancashire perhaps regard the Minor Counties more as a training ground than a sphere for winning matches—at least that is the impression one has gained from their visits to Newcastle—but it was poor tactics that left them winners on the first innings only against Northumberland at Jesmond yesterday. They took too long to get their runs and made a rather futile declaration with the last pair in. Futile because they were optimists if they expected to turn a first innings lead of 53 into a clear victory when they left themselves under three hours to dispose of Northumberland a second time (including the extra half-hour) and then get whatever runs would be required afterwards.

As it happened they got Northumberland out by exactly six o'clock, the normal time for drawing stumps on a second day now, and as there was only 20 minutes left for actual play, naturally they did not go in themselves, with 82 runs required to secure the five points.

Tactically they made two mistakes. In not trying to force the pace in the earlier part of the day and in not bringing their fast bowlers, or at any rate one of them, back earlier in the Northumberland second innings. And if they had serious intentions of forcing a win outright they could have made an earlier declaration.

When play was resumed in the morning, with Lancashire requiring 93 runs to gain the first innings lead and six wickets in hand, Washbrook and Wilson, the overnight not-outs, continued their cautious methods in raising the score from 88 to 129 in an hour, at which point Wilson was dropped at the wicket off Atkinson. Washbrook reached his hundred out of 146 in four hours, having then hit 13 4's, and the pair were not separated until one o'clock—two hours for 76 runs—when Washbrook was given out to a catch at silly point by Moffat off Robson.

**WASHBROOK'S BATTING**

This fieldsman had been placed between wide slip and silly point, with Robson finding a spot from the cemetery end, and Washbrook cocked one for Moffat to reach down for the ball, take it with one hand, and roll over. Washbrook, who appeared not at all satisfied with the decision, scored 112 out of 164 in four hours 25 minutes and had 14 4's, pull drives, hooks, and an occasional drive making him most of his runs. This Barrow boy means to show that he is worth his place in the first team again, but spectators here are not accustomed to the first-class rate of scoring and probably did not quite appreciate the object of Washbrook's care and discrimination.

He left at 164, the fifth wicket having added 81 in 115 minutes, and two more wickets fell quickly, so that seven were down for 177. Allan disturbed Butterworth's stumps, and Wilson, the overnight stop gap, who had outstayed his welcome by remaining two hours and a quarter for 33, was run out off a no ball.

Farrimond, turning the ball cleverly until restricted by fielding re-arrangement to check his pet shot, and then getting several sharp singles, had Bennett for his partner when the lead was secured at 1.10, and these two were still together at lunch. And for half an hour afterwards, for it was not until 2.40 that a great shot by Atkinson, fielding wide mid-off, ran Bennett out (48 for the eighth wicket).

The total was then 225, and at the same total Farrimond was adjudged l.b.w. to Rhind after a 70 minutes stay. Higson declared soon after at 233 for nine, made in six hours.

Thirty-nine runs an hour and 233 off 130 overs flattered the home bowlers, of whom Allan, keeping a fine length and doing a bit most of the time, had five for 39 in 47 overs. He would have had six wickets if a chance off Higson had been accepted.

**THE LAST PHASE**

Northumberland had an hour's batting before tea, in that time lost three wickets for 50 runs, and so at the interval were still three runs behind with a possible 115 minutes left for play. At 26 Mackay was stumped in Butterworth's second over, Ord returned the ball to the same bowler three balls later, and at 50 Bruce, most surprisingly, was given out hit wicket after a run had been completed for a leg bye. The player displaced a bail in starting his run, but the stroke had been completed, and the decision caused much comment.

Wickets fell quickly after tea. Shield, at 63, off the seventh ball of an over (there had been a no ball), hit the ball straight to silly mid-on; Rhind left at the same total, and Mutch, opening batsman, could not get anyone to stay with him long. Robson was stumped at 91 on a second appeal; Atkinson (101), given out l.b.w. to a ball he tried to avoid; but Paterson, promoted to keep the ball out, helped Mutch, and when the latter was out at 5.40, with Northumberland leading by 67, the match was as good as drawn. Before the finish, however, Moffat and Paterson (in the last over) were out.

Mutch, in first and eighth out, caught at short leg off an edged ball at 120, had five 4's in his invaluable 60. His stay of two hours and 15 minutes meant a great deal to Northumberland.

Lancashire's bowling was good all round this innings, Wilson getting something out of the pitch and the leg break men being difficult, but conditions were not quite suitable for what Bennett can really do, and Phillipson was recalled too late. Lancashire's fielding was superior to Northumberland's and saved a good many runs.

## BRIGHT PLAY AND GOOD BOWLING

### Winning Issue at Jesmond

Denbighshire, for their visit to Jesmond, strengthened their team from the side defeated by Durham by making four changes, the newcomers including Captain A. O. Straker, who has played for Northumberland and gave evidence of his driving powers; A. J. McAlpine, an all-rounder, also strong in the front of the wicket; and Ted Davies, who was professional to several clubs on Tyneside some years ago. They are not a strong county, but on yesterday's play are interesting to watch, chiefly because they enter into the spirit of the game in the right way and are not obsessed with averages and playing for places, like some of the minor counties.

They finished up last night four runs behind Northumberland and had lost a wicket in their second innings, so there is every prospect of a definite finish to-day.

The medium to fast bowling of Lee and Atkinson was responsible for the visitors making a wretched start. They won the toss and on a drying wicket were soon in trouble, though it was a spectacular catch by Atkinson, low down with one hand at square leg, that got rid of Macnab at eight. This was off the first ball of Lee's fourth over, and by the time the Tynemouth man had completed his ninth over there were four wickets to his credit for a mere five runs. Walker turned one into Mackay's hands at forward short leg, Lucking had his stumps shattered by Atkinson, Sykes, the captain, fell to a slip catch off Lee, and at 19 half the side was out in 50 minutes when Brookes played outside a Lee ball that fairly shot in.

With Straker and McAlpine together, however, there was a welcome improvement. Both made hard shots in front of the wicket and forced a couple of bowling changes. Straker became less enterprising after being let off when he skied one and the ball fell between three waiting fieldsmen, but McAlpine continued to drive with power, and the sixth wicket pair had put on 63 in 55 minutes before Straker, playing back to Robson, edged the ball to short slip. There were five 4's in his 34, and the hard hitting of these two was much to the liking of the crowd. Just before lunch Rees was unlucky to have a run out decision given against him, and Denbigh went in with seven down for 98.

McAlpine, much to his disappointment, was out when two short of 50, bowled by Robson at 105, playing forward to cover the break. He had put a no-ball into Osborne Avenue, twice lifted the ball to the sight screen at the same end, and had four other 4's. The last two wickets fell at the same total, Evans being trapped by Robson, who had Davies lbw next ball. The innings had lasted 145 minutes.

Lee, who made the ball get up sharply and was always difficult to play, had the best figures. Robson got his four wickets at an actual cost of six runs in 7.3 overs.

Northumberland soon found that they had to respect the Denbigh attack, especially when it was backed up by keen fielding and some first-rate catching. The opening pair, Mackay and Mutch, were back in the pavilion with 19 runs (45 minutes) on the board, the latter out to a remarkable catch wide to backward point's left hand and Mackay being bowled by a ball that never rose. Straker broke up a promising third wicket stand by using his height to take a slip catch off Ord and then Bruce and Shield put on 40 in 25 minutes before Bruce was lbw.

Northumberland got the lead with only four men out, Shield and Lee sending

the score along with drives and leg hits to the boundary, but after Lee had left at 111 wickets fell so quickly, as the pitch became appreciably faster, that in the end Northumberland had but a first innings lead of 23 runs. The fast bowlers, McAlpine (right hand) and Walker (left hand), were responsible for the last five wickets adding only 18 runs. McAlpine, who with the wind got a good deal of life out of the pitch, bowling to the Avenue end, took four wickets for seven runs in 24 balls.

Walker, brought back to the Avenue end at 111, bowled Shield (for what was the top score), and a great ball by McAlpine beat Lee at 113. Twelve runs later three wickets fell at the same total. Rhind was unluckily out to a splendid cover-point catch low down, Atkinson well taken in the gully, and Robson beaten by what was nearly a fast yorker. Then the wicket-keeper, Taylor, finished off a good display by safely holding a snick off Thompson to give McAlpine his fifth wicket. The innings lasted two hours 35 minutes.

The remaining playing period of 45 minutes was curtailed by two mishaps, Macnab, who opened Denbigh's second innings, having to retire through a hurt thigh and Paterson, the home wicket-keeper, going off through a cut over the eye from a throw-in to which he took one hand. Bruce put on the gloves and had the satisfaction of holding a catch in the last over off Atkinson, who had been unlucky not to get both batsmen out before.

## NORTHUMBERLAND'S SIX WICKETS WIN

### Mutch's Half Century

The mere fact that Northumberland beat Denbighshire at Jesmond yesterday by six wickets does not give a true idea as to the way play ran on the closing day or of the spirited fight put up by the losers.

When Denbighshire resumed their second innings in the morning they still needed four runs to equal Northumberland's first innings total and had lost one wicket. They seemed to be in for an early defeat when, though doing somewhat better than in their first innings, they had five wickets down for 49, which left them only 26 ahead, but again there was a fine sixth wicket stand, this time by Macnab and Brookes who put on 70 in an hour.

Northumberland had lost their grip on the game, and though getting the remaining four wickets for 35 more runs, they were not at all assured of victory when set to get 132 to win, even with a possible three hours and a half remaining, for Denbighshire's attack on Wednesday had some bite in it, and it was just a question of whether they would secure a couple of quick wickets (as in the first innings), and then get on top.

On a fast pitch, however, the opening pair, Mackay and Mutch, gave the home county such a fine start to the innings, scoring 74 in 55 minutes, that the issue was practically safe when Mackay was out at twenty minutes to four.

The first 50 had come in 40 minutes, and the second 50 was made in 45 minutes, but two wickets were lost in the process—both at 97—and before the match was won another wicket had fallen, and 45 more minutes taken up.

#### GOOD SPORTING MATCH

It was a good sporting match, more enjoyable to the general public than the Lancashire game, and while there was certainly some casual play not generally associated with Minor Counties' cricket the game as a whole was a pleasant change. Denbighshire lack experience in tactics, and are inclined to take things not quite seriously enough. Their second innings total of 154 was the highest they have so far made this season.

Northumberland's play left room for improvement, and the ground work in the field is below what it used to be. There are exceptions, however, and Atkinson saved several boundaries. Yesterday, as on Wednesday, the advantage gained early on by the bowlers could not be held, and there was not sufficient cover against batsmen who drove hard through a close-set field.

Macnab, who was hurt on Wednesday night, was fit enough to bat yesterday morning, though it was surprising he did not have a runner early on. His defence was sound, and he made some good shots in front of the wicket. Brookes, his sixth wicket partner, hit well on the leg side, and also drove well. There were six 4's in his 47, and he was obviously disappointed at failing to reach 50, especially as he was bowled by a long hop.

The light was poor for the first half-hour, and Denbigh might reasonably have appealed. The storm which hit the city missed the County Ground completely, and soon the light became normal. The enterprise of the visitors is shown by the fact that 51 runs were added in one period of 45 minutes.

Atkinson kept good length and direction, Lee deserved more than one wicket, and Robson bowled quite well to his field. Thompson's fielding close in was extra good, and he had some good overs.

Denbigh helped to put their opponents on the way to victory by loose bowling in the early part of the home second innings, and 20 runs came from the first four overs. Mackay (six 4's) hooked and drove well, and Mutch, if lucky with one or two shots behind the wicket, con-

firmed impressions as the most dependable Northumberland bat just now. Mutch, who had two lives in one over when 28, hit seven 4's, and made his 57 runs out of 123.

**MORPETH OUT OF LUCK**

**ROBINSON'S FIFTH EIGHT WICKETS "BAG"**

**PERCY MAIN CHECKED**

Tynemouth, with a match in hand, retain their six points lead over Benwell, so there is no change in the Northumberland League top positions, but Saturday's results affected other leading teams, and Tynedale and Backworth moved up to fourth and fifth respectively.

Tynemouth's first pair put on 58 at Wallsend, and though a second wicket fell at the same total Lee was in fine form and hit 11 4's while making 78. Despite a long fall Tynemouth's total reached 194, and this proved to be 104 too many for Wallsend, who lost two wickets in Wilson's first two overs. The fourth pair added 29, but in two hours the side was out. Tynemouth's smart fielding contrasted with Wallsend's uneven work.

Percy Main, after successive wins, were beaten at Backworth, where Peacock (12 4's) and Fairney (two 6's, a five, and three 4's) had a good deal to do with the home team reaching a total of 206. Percy Main fell 79 runs short of this total, and actually had four of their batsmen run out, including their top scorer, Pirie, who made his 26 runs with seven scoring strokes—two 6's, three 4's, and two singles. Altogether a bright game.

Benwell Hill, against the County, were 87 for six when Saunders joined Marshall, and the pair put on 78 in about 50 minutes. Saunders, in his 73, hit twelve 4's and two 6's. This period was his only bright interlude in the game, as when the visitors went in to make 214 they were content to play for a draw after losing Mackay and Stanger-Leathes early on. Taylor and Towler added 53 for the fourth wicket.

**SPIRITED BATTING**

An interesting finish was seen at Roseworth Terrace where the home side in response to Benwell's total of 197 had lost eight wickets for 93. Then as the result of spirited batting by Bell, Baker, and Taylor the position was changed, but right on time Bell was caught off Robinson with the total 15 short. The last two wickets added 66 and these three batsmen pleased the crowd with their hard hitting in an attempt to force a win. Between them they scored 17 boundaries. "South" made their runs in 140 minutes, against the 157 minutes occupied by Benwell. Robinson again played a big part in Benwell's win for he followed up a fine innings of 68 with a bowling return of 3-42, this being the fifth time that he has taken eight wickets this season. In his last 16 overs he had 11 maidens, having all the batsmen playing on the defence. He opened the innings and was fourth man out with the score 125, occupying 89 minutes for his 68, which included one 6 and seven 4's. J. Scott, in obtaining 57, had his best innings of the season. He went in at the fall of the third wicket and was last man out, having a "life" at 37. Baker, from the "South" second team, had five wickets.

Blyth, against a much strengthened Tynedale team, started off in fine style by getting 3 for 24, but later batsmen took toll of Hutchinson's bowling, and in sharp contrast to the previous week Blyth eventually found themselves facing a total of 223 (for nine). J. Graham and Allan, whom they had not encountered at Hexham, made a decided difference to the Tynedale attack and they got eight wickets between them for 75 runs, to play a big part in a 76 runs win for the Hexham club.

**ONE RUN WIN**

Morpeth were unlucky to be beaten by a single run at Close House. Batting first, the latter occupied 170 minutes over 160 runs. To commence with, Shield and Dixon needed 70 minutes to make 41 for the first wicket. Both were missed early, and this seemed to make them extra cautious, and Shield had a somewhat charmed life. Indeed, on one occasion he was caught at the wicket and started to walk away, but the umpire said "Not out."

Morpeth, chiefly through Ord, Atkinson, and Curry (who followed up good bowling by good batting), got to 140 for nine, and the last pair were still together at 149 when Bird was given out (bowled) on appeal by the wicket-keeper to square leg umpire after the player had cut the ball to the gully. Hunter bowled admirably to get seven wickets.

ANOTHER GREENSIDE WIN  
 Seghill Bowling Feat

Unless they fall away completely the Tyneside Senior League title seems fairly certain to go to one of the two leading North-West Durham teams. Medomsley beat North Durham after early shocks and Consett were never extended at Low Fell. Seghill, next in the table, brought off one of their surprises in beating Craghead, who occupied third position up to this match.

Medomsley, batting first, lost half their wickets for 22 runs, but Wheatley, who batted so well a week ago, again kept his end up, and Patterson was a good sixth wicket partner. ## A YORKSHIRE CENTURY AT JESMOND

### Fisher's Enterprise

Yorkshire II., fortunate to win the toss at Jesmond yesterday, when they opened their North-East tour, batted on a plumb wicket, with a very fast outfield, from 11.35 until 5.15 before Colonel Chichester-Constable declared the innings with the score at 269 for seven, the runs having been made in an actual playing period of 275 minutes.

In the 90 minutes remaining for play Northumberland lost three wickets while scoring 75, so that they need 94 to avoid the follow-on.

A remarkable feature of the day's play was that the stumps were not hit once direct by the bowlers except from a no-ball near the end.

Though Yorkshire spent two hours over their first 100 runs the Northumberland attack was shown to be inadequate with Lea absent, and it was rather surprising that Yorkshire did not score more runs in the time they were batting.

Indeed, had it not been for the enterprise of Fisher—who had a life when 34—they would not have been in a position to declare, for while he was in with Halstead 117 runs were added for the fourth wicket in 90 minutes, and the left-hand all-rounder, who will be in the Yorkshire first team next season, made 70 of them. This partnership looked like being even more prolific, and it was only in bringing on Ord, the left-hander, who is not a county bowler, that the stand was broken.

It is sometimes worth while trying an "irregular" bowler in an attempt to break up a troublesome partnership, and in this case the move was doubly successful, for Ord had Fisher caught second ball of his first over at backward point, though the batsman was not convinced about it, and Halstead, having completed a century, was taken at the wicket off the last ball of the Morpeth player's second over.

Yorkshire had opened with Halstead, the Hunslet professional, who is having a very good club season, and Harrison, a well-known Wakefield player, making his county debut. Harrison was soon looking for runs, but Halstead was content to wait for them. These two stayed together to within five minutes of the lunch interval, and Harrison had scored 41 of the 89 put on for the wicket when Halstead ran him out—the only way it seemed likely either would go.

Just on the interval Atkinson got the wicket of Raper, who had followed Harrison, but Yorkshire were still doing quite well with 95 on. The loss of Pearson, the young Scarborough professional, at 104 to a mid-off catch improved the home position, but then Halstead and Fisher came together and, helped by the costly life to the latter, who gave a chance to Thompson, standing too close in, took the total to 221. Fisher used his feet well and drove with power, especially past the bowler, where he got most of his 114's.

#### HALSTEAD'S HUNDRED

Halstead, out three runs later, made his 101 runs from 224 in three hours 50 minutes. His defence was very sound, but his batting was not so clean as Fisher's and he had some helpful snicks. He had some good shots through the covers and altogether five of his nine 4's were on the offside.

A mishit at 235 by Robinson, new left-hander, gave Thompson a chance to make a catch running back from slip, and at 247 Buller was safely taken by Gillespie at the pavilion rails boundary. Chichester-Constable hit at everything, and the eighth wicket had added 22 in 15 minutes when he declared.

It was hard work fielding under the broiling sun and on a hard ground, and there was not much chance of getting a shot, made with any power, by chasing

it. An ordinarily set field was not sufficient under the abnormal conditions. The newcomers, Dixon and Gillespie, did good work in the deep, Ord was an active cover point, and Paterson kept wicket well.

Northumberland early lost Shield, l.b.w. at 14 to the fast bowler Hall, whose appeal did not seem to be very convincing. With half an hour to go and the score 44 Ord was caught at the wicket wide on the off-side off Hargreaves, first team bowler at the start of the season, to a loud chorus of appeals, and Bruce went the same way to Hall, who had changed over to the Avenue end. Dixon had to come in at an awkward time, but showed confidence, and no more wickets fell. Mackay has so far batted in confident style, and there was nothing better yesterday than his cover drives to the boundary. It should be mentioned that shortly before Bruce was out he had a nasty blow on the body from fast bowling. Fisher so far has not met with success.

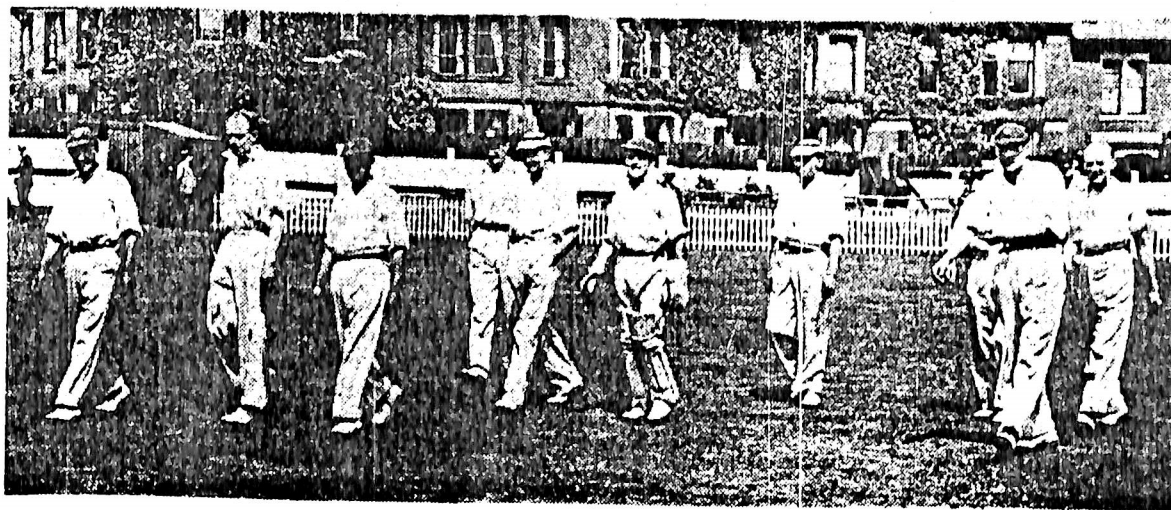
**D. C. H. TOWNSEND**

D. C. H. Townsend, the Oxford batsman, who made 193 yesterday at Lord's in the Varsity match, is a son of Mr C. L. Townsend, the former Gloucestershire and England player who lives at Norton-on-Tees and is president of the North Yorkshire and South Durham Cricket League, in which he played up to a year or two ago.

Townsend's 193 is the third highest in the Varsity series and Oxford's second best. The Nawab of Fataudi made 282 not out in 1931 and A. T. Ratcliffe (Cambridge) had 201 in the same match after being recalled from Manchester—where he was assisting Denbighshire—on the eve of the match.

Both Townsend and F. G. H. Chalk (also a century maker yesterday) had a thin time in last year's Varsity contest, so their success in the current event will be all the more acceptable. J. G. W. Davies, who had an inspired bowling spell for Cambridge, was not even called upon to bowl in the 1933 match. He will be remembered as the man who bowled Bradman first ball in the present tour.

YORKSHIRE WIN ON FIRST INNINGS

How Northumberland Saved Follow-On

After saving the threatened follow-on so well at Jesmond yesterday morning that Yorkshire II. had only a lead of 43 with their first innings total of 269, Northumberland put an interesting aspect on the situation when they got three of their opponents out a second time by five minutes past three for 31 runs.

But they allowed each of the fourth wicket pair, Pearson and Fisher, a life before tea, which arrived with the total 99. With 34 added after the resumption—another let off, at the wicket this time—Chicchester-Constable declared at 5.15 for the second time in the match, leaving Northumberland to get 177 to win in 75 minutes, including the extra half-hour! An impossible task, and shown to be so by the very fact that the Yorkshire captain rested his three best bowlers, Hargreaves, Fisher, and Hall, when Northumberland batted again.

Mackay sent the Close House first wicket pair, Shield and Dixon, to open, and chiefly through the latter they forced the pace to such purpose that 50 runs came in 27 minutes, while Dixon reached 50 (in his first county match) out of 76 in 40 minutes. Stumps were drawn with the dismissal of Dixon close on six o'clock, and Yorkshire, still 96 ahead, took first innings points.

Dixon, who had eight 4's in 115 54, took risks and had the satisfaction of making the last 45 minutes' play to the liking of the spectators, who earlier had almost been sent to sleep by the heat and lack of playing incident.

Dixon, both in batting and fielding, has justified his inclusion and though Gillespie, the other player to be brought in, did not meet with the same batting success—he was beaten by a ball that would have bowled anybody—he made an improvement in the fielding and should get another opportunity to show his batting work.

Northumberland, resuming under the same tropical conditions as we had on Monday, needed 94 to avoid following on with seven wickets in hand. Dixon got 13 of the 18 runs added in the first 20 minutes and then there was almost a deadlock, with Mackay unable to get Fisher away and Gillespie having to stand up to Hargreaves bowling really

fast. After 17 minutes the last named beat Gillespie with a fizzer, and four runs later—105 for six—Fisher's slower ball, hanging, bowled Mackay, who, scoring 39 overnight, added only nine more runs in 45 minutes.

FREE SCORING

The bowling was very good hereabouts, but Robson and Atkinson, coming together with 64 needed to save the follow-on, forced a couple of changes, and then proceeded to put on 57 in 35 minutes, the follow-on having been averted but for seven runs before Atkinson was caught low down at slip when Fisher was tried at the cemetery end. Atkinson, though not getting so much of the bowling, made 31 and hit six 4's.

When Allan joined Robson for the last wicket at a quarter to one the score was 185. It was taken to 226, with the help of a couple of missed chances, before Robson was bowled at 1.15, for 66, featured by powerful cutting and off driving. The left-hander, using his reach and coming down hard, dealt severely with balls pitched outside the off stump, and the field was never adjusted to block his shots. The fact that he had 12 4's, twice three of them with successive scoring strokes, shows how good was his timing. In at the fall of the fifth wicket (101) and last out he made his runs from 115 in 84 minutes.

The follow-on fight was most interesting, and afterwards the Yorkshire captain probably regretted not bringing Hargreaves and Fisher back earlier.

Yorkshire, going in again at 2.10, did not attempt to force the pace in an effort to get a clear win and there was an excuse for this after Allan had taken three wickets in this way:

Sir.—As you witnessed the above match on Saturday last, I wish to contradict a grave mistake you printed in Monday's "Journal." **Season's Best Game at Ashbrooke**

Sunderland are now the only unbeaten team in the Durham Senior League, for Chester-le-Street went down at Philadelphia on Saturday; but the actual leadership position is unchanged, Hendon keeping their one point advantage for a match more played. Durham City, with another draw, got ahead of Boldon, and there was a levelling up with wins by Sunderland (their first since May) and South Shields.

Whitburn, much below strength, managed to total 159 at Hendon, where the home team, thanks to E. N. Randle and Gibbins (who stayed with the opening batsman when the first three wickets had fallen cheaply) got the runs for the loss of five wickets. Randle had a six and 14 4's in his net out 107.

At Ashbrooke Boldon, with 226 runs on for six wickets, declared at 5.15, and Sunderland had an actual playing period of 130 minutes in which to get the runs. They lost Levy at 11, but Gibbon and Williamson got runs so quickly that 51 came in the first 22 minutes and 1.3 in 47 minutes, the time then being 6.25. **LEFT TO THE CLUB**

It was reported to Gateshead Council yesterday that a letter had been received from Lord Northbourne's agent submitting the terms on which the Corporation can acquire the land on his lordship's Shipcote Estate at present leased to the Gateshead Fell Cricket and Lawn Tennis Club, and, as an alternative, the amount of compensation required by Lord Northbourne to forgo his right to build on the land facing Evinstones Road.

The Town Improvement Committee submitted two recommendations, which were adopted by the Council, namely: (1) That Lord Northbourne's agent be informed that the Council are unable to proceed further in the matter, and (2) that the Town Clerk supply the cricket and lawn tennis club with a copy of the letter, and inform them that the terms suggested for the acquisition of the land preclude the Council taking any action.

**£5,000 APPEAL**

This means that the future of the ground is in the hands of the club, whose officials have already circularized residents of Low Fell and district appealing for support for their £5,000 ground purchase scheme.

One alternative to buying the whole of the ground, comprising five acres, is to purchase the two acres required for a building site (for £3,000) and rent the other three.

Failing all these things the club, which has had a 56 years' existence, will have to disband or transfer to another ground. The latter presents a great difficulty these days.

**BOLDON BACK TO THIRD PLACE**

**Two Centuries Scored**

After gaining their first win since May the previous week Sunderland on Saturday met with their first defeat after being set by Whitburn to get 176—a task generally considered to be within their compass. But this time they slumped after a good start, and there was no Maurice Armstrong to step in.

Boldon gained on the top two, who draw, by winning in hollow style over Wearmouth; and South Shields, keeping up their improved form, got on to terms with Durham City. This means a most interesting finish to the championship, with Hendon's position at two points ahead never secure, because they have played two more games than the four teams immediately below them.

Hendon tried hard to snatch a win in their home game with Chester-le-Street. Time was the main factor in the match, and the clock beat the batsmen after an exceedingly hard struggle, and the game ended in a draw.

Chester-le-Street batted first on an easy-paced wicket. Runs were slow in coming, and the first 30 took an hour to get. The 100 was reached in 1 1/2 hours, Buglass and Atkinson having made 70 for the second wicket, and when the total had reached 225 in two hours and 40 minutes the visitors declared. Fred Buglass had a fine score of 82, and looked like making a century when run out through an error of judgment.

Hendon, left with 130 minutes to get the runs, lost Watson at 15, and two runs later Brown was bowled by Atkinson. Gibbons was hit on the hip by a fast rising ball and had to retire. The total was only 18 when Moore lost his wicket, and matters looked serious for Hendon. Then, however, E. Randle and Low came together for the fourth wicket, and they took the score to 167, Randle being bowled after making 107 for the second Saturday in succession. There were 17 1/4 in his well-played innings. At the close Hendon, with six wickets down, were 27 behind. Chester-le-Street batted 62 overs and Hendon 45.

Burnmoor, against Eppleton, were deprived of Woodhouse's bowling services owing to an injury. Eppleton, making the most of their opportunities, scored 221 for six wickets before they declared, after batting 175 minutes. A. The last four wickets fell cheaply, but Whitburn could consider themselves fortunate to reach a total of 175.

Sunderland made a useful start, but after the fall of the third wicket it was left to Gibbon to try to win the match, and the tail was so feeble against a well-handled attack that another good score by the professional was of no avail.

Tait, Brackhill and Covell, a debutant, bowled a weakened Wearmouth out at Boldon for 67, made from 26 overs, and then Pickering and Haworth made it a ten wickets win by scoring 69 together in 40 minutes.

Compiling the fine total of 273 for eight in 150 minutes, Philadelphia appeared to have victory within their grasp when

**NEARLY ONE-DAY MATCH**

Actually the first day's "play" was not abandoned for another hour, though there seemed to be little prospect of a resumption, but the captains did not come to an agreement until they went out to inspect the wicket at 4.50, in heavy rain, and straightway called it off.

In the time available Northumberland, winning the toss and batting on a freshly prepared wicket, made only five runs from seven overs and lost Mutch's wicket in the process.

Mutch, opening with Mackay, took a couple off Howell's first ball, a square leg push shot, Mackay got a single off Ellis, and then three maidens followed. In the sixth over Ellis bowled Mutch with the third ball, a slightly faster one. Ord, who followed in, had made two runs when the players were brought off.

Durham's field showed one or two changes in the setting, Randle being at cover point, vice Adamson, who was at fine leg and mid-off alternately. Wilson, one of the three changes from the Australian match, showed up well behind the wicket in the short while play was on.

Northumberland's team differs in two instances from the tour XI, Mutch and Allan returning and Johnson retaining his place, with W. H. Fenwick not available.

**Ellis Takes Five Wickets**

Even though play could not be resumed at Chester-le-Street yesterday until three o'clock there was a possibility of a first innings decision with the pitch in the state it was, but in the end the match had to be left as a "no result," and will not be counted in the minor championship table.

Durham, as the play ran, had a chance to get the points for a first innings lead, but did not take it, and the cricket finished up very tame.

Northumberland's captain had declared at 5.20, with the score 143 for seven, to give Durham a knock, but as stumps were to be drawn at six o'clock there was not much point in this, and it became a mere matter of playing out time.

The actual playing period of the whole match was 2 hours 54 minutes, including the 22 minutes on Monday. A most disappointing finish to the home season of the two counties, and presumably a financial loss to Durham, despite insurance, which operated both days and brought in £130, less takings. After Monday's heavy rain there was a downpour in Chester-le-Street up to nine o'clock yesterday morning, so that though later the weather was fine, turning warm and sunny after noon, the pitch required several hours to recover, and was still very soft when play did start.

Mackay and Ord resumed for Northumberland with the total five for the overnight loss of Mutch, and it was significant when Dobson put himself on to bowl after opening at this other end (Ropery Lane) with Ellis. The pitch, under the influence of sun and breeze, gradually helped the bowlers, who at first were handicapped by slippery foothold, but 40 minutes had gone before the second wicket pair were separated.

**TWO—"LIVES"**

Ord, however, should have been out when only five, Wilson failing to gather the ball when the Morpeth left-hander jumped out and missed, and the very next ball Ellis, at backward point close in, dropped a catch, Ord being lucky to survive a most uncomfortable over. Dobson opened with three maidens, but Ord hooked him for four, Mackay also pulled him to the boundary, and followed with a square cut for four.

With the total 34 and Mackay 12, Ellis, bowling round the wicket, got the visiting captain l.b.w., and, following a maiden over by Dobson, Ellis repeated the process in the case of Dixon, l.b.w. first ball, while six runs later a third successive victim was claimed by Ellis when Lee, likewise beaten by the change of pace in playing back to meet the ball turning from leg, had to go for obstruction. Thus Ellis had taken all four wickets.

Johnson, following in, took a delightful leg boundary off Ellis, while Ord touched one of Dobson's low down outside the wicket-keeper's reach for another four.

Showing a partiality for the Durham captain's bowling Ord twice straight drove him to the boundary, but in the same over Dobson got his revenge, bowling Ord off-stick with the fifth ball. This silenced the barrackers, who had told him to "take himself off," and he almost got Gillespie out next ball.

Ord had been fifth out at 56, and a run later Johnson, facing Dobson, was snapped at the wicket last ball of the over. There was ten minutes to tea, and in that time Gillespie was let off by Elsdon. The batsman forced and lifted an Ellis ball to the on, and Elsdon dropped it after getting both hands to it.

**ROBSON AND ATKINSON**

Before Gillespie was bowled off-stick by Ellis, presumably trying to knock the bowler off his length, he had helped to add 30 for the seventh wicket, but Durham still had a chance of getting their opponents out by 5 o'clock. Robson and Atkinson, however, had another good partnership, and when Mackay declared at 5.20 they had put on

56 in 38 minutes.

Robson soon hit a leg boundary off an over-pitched Dobson ball, and then collected ten runs in an over of the Durham captain's, including a square-leg boundary and another neatly cut back. A chop brought another four, likewise off Dobson, and this had the effect of changing the bowling, Elsdon coming on for Dobson and Carr for Ellis. The displaced bowlers had been on for 100 minutes while the score was being taken from five to 103.

Elsdon was difficult to get away, but neither of the new bowlers could move the eighth wicket pair, though Carr had a possible c. and b. chance late on. Atkinson took three 4's, two of them square, and Robson another two before the innings closed.

Ellis, who finished up with five for 33 in 23 overs, showed how adaptable he is, and though there is generally some doubt about l.b.w. he certainly called the tune for a lengthy period.

The best shot in the Durham "innings" was a cover drive for four by Randle, for whom Gibbon was moved to second wicket down to accommodate the Hendon batsman.

Durham are unchanged against Yorkshire II. to-day at Redcar.

## NORTHUMBERLAND'S SEASON

### And Pointers for Next

## BOWLING LIKELY TO BE STRENGTHENED

Northumberland almost managed to finish up the season undefeated for the first time since 1925 when they took part in their second successive challenge match, but by a matter of ten minutes Yorkshire II, beat them at Leeds, where, without prejudice, it can be said they had ill-luck. Leslie Allan was astounded not to get a favourable l.b.w. decision against Harboard towards the end of the first day's play—a decision against Northumberland that really altered the course of the game, for Harboard, then nothing, went on to make 64, top score in the match, second day.

There would, of course, have been some considerable satisfaction in finishing the season unbeaten, but that would not have signified that it had been a successful season; for on the other side it should be remembered that Northumberland only won one match! And that was against the weakest of the counties, Denbighshire, who inversely were not the least attractive side to watch.

Northumberland had escapes, and owed quite a lot to men three-parts down their batting list—see the appended averages—but they were part of the team, and it is well to remember that 11 make a side when thinking of individuals in terms of criticism.

### TAKES SEASONS

Northumberland's cricket is still in a transitional stage. Only the captain, W. G. Mackay, remains of the XI, responsible for putting Northumberland at the top of the Minor Counties' table, but it takes several seasons to work through the period of reconstruction, and Northumberland has not quite reached the last of them.

Next year, however, there should be a more settled side—and stronger bowling. Presumably both Wilson (Tynemouth) and Booth (County) will qualify and bring in that new interest which seems essential.

There are enough young amateurs now in Northumberland who have had experience of county cricket to give the selection committee something definite to work upon. The problem will be perhaps who to leave out.

If there was sufficient income, particularly in the way of county members, I am sure that the Selection Committee would not be averse to playing four professionals if that meant the winning of matches; but subscriptions are considerably below what they should be for a county in which there are so many people well able to afford financial support to cricket, but apparently unwilling to do so.

One trouble of Northumberland's is that there are players who have and are likely to do well, but are not available—at any rate, for all the games. This season, for instance, H. C. Lee, J. L. Allan, J. Mutch, W. H. Fenwick, and J. McKinnell have all been affected in this way, and in the case of the first two their absence meant a weakening of the bowling.

### JOHNSON'S BATTING

"New" men have been tried, and all have shown varying degrees of promise. Mark Johnson, of Backworth, should develop into a really first-rate batsman. He has the shots, and can get runs quickly without chancing a lot. He is probably suited more as No. 3 or 4 than in his club position of No. 1, for as a rule there is much steadier bowling from both ends to meet in county cricket, and when an ordinary league batsman 49

Hargreaves, Fisher, Pollard, Ellis, or a Phillipson he has got to be able to sort out the hittable balls if he is to stay long.

Noel Dixon has some good shots and can only get the others from experience in playing varied bowling. It is rather a pity that he is a club wicketkeeper, though Close House have done their best to give him outfielding practice since he became a county player, for there is an art in boundary and other outfield work. Mutch, for instance, is one of the best men in the district for saving runs by anticipation.

W. H. Fenwick is restricted in stroke power, but he would not be the first player to keep a place because he could keep an end up for a good stretch. For the same reason that there are some shots not within his scope he is not suitable for outfielding.

C. B. Gillespie has had to make his batting suit the circumstances, and so far, because of that, has not been able to bring into full use his undoubted hitting powers. His fielding has certainly been valuable. Indeed, the gradual introduction of younger players should mean a considerable saving in runs.

The placing of the field was a difficult matter, and the slip work was not satisfactory. James Paterson's wicket-keeping was a pleasing feature, however.
