Even the fact that he took on the thankless job of team secretary did not worry him in the least, but only served to emphasise his fitness for the job. Haynes, who had little cricket last season, owing to being twelfth man so often in the Glone stershire team and could not play regularly the July, was another vastly-improved cricketer, and personally I never wish to see a better immings than that which he played at Wycombe when Rutter was bowling his fastest. As he has only just passed his 21st birthday, and is moreover a very fast and lively fieldsman, his future seems full of promise, and if he will devote some time to improving his action and getting more bodywork juto his bowling, no cricketer of his age could be more sure of going right to the top.
