

## FAST BOWLER'S FIREWORKS

### Devon Make a Fine Recovery

#### SURREY'S STEADY START

Fortunes fluctuated in the first day's play of the Minor Counties cricket match between Surrey II, and Devonshire at the Sports Ground, Guildford, yesterday, in such a manner as to give the spectators a day's cricket full of incident. Surrey II. were not at full strength, but two players who were watched with interest were McMurray, the Guildford City footballer, and Gamble, who formerly played football for Aldershot. Devon had the good fortune to win the toss, and batted first on a beautiful wicket.

Surrey's first assault was founded on pace bowling, and soon caused a surprise. After F. H. Carroll had played a maiden from Gamble, E. J. Hatfield was completely beaten by the speed of the first delivery he received from McCanlis, and his off stump was knocked back. Joined by W. W. Hoare, Carroll soon settled down, and made some pretty shots off his legs when McCanlis was bowling to him. Gamble worked up a fine pace, but was bowling without luck.

Carroll and Hoare went along serenely, hitting the loose ones when they arrived and keeping the best deliveries out of their wickets. When McCanlis and Gamble had to be rested, Surrey's slower bowlers were innocuous, although Buss kept rolling along his left arm slows with a perfect length. At lunch Carroll, who had placed his shots with rare skill, was 48 and W. W. Hoare 62, the total being 118 for one wicket—a fine recovery.

#### FATAL LUNCH INTERVAL

The lunch interval proved fatal, however, for in the second over after the break, from McCanlis, Hoare tried to pull a long hop, missed, and was bowled. It was a disappointing end to an innings which was studded with brilliant off drives and leg shots. In the next over Gamble got a beautiful ball past Carroll's bat, and two wickets had gone without the addition of a run. McCanlis was now bowling at a devastating speed, and Emmett left lbw before he had scored. Only 17 runs had been added when H. S. Stoneman, who had made 15, saw his middle stump go flying out of the ground, and eight runs later B. H. Lock's off stump was knocked flat. McMurray's wicket keeping was excellent, and he took the ball cleanly on both sides of the wicket from the fast bowlers. Surrey's ground fielding and throwing also reached a high standard.

#### BRILLIANT BATTING

J. L. Watts and G. K. Simmons by brilliant stroke play all round the wicket, began to make Devon's prospects brighter. McCanlis lost his length, and was punished until he was taken off. With the fast bowling tamed, the batsmen had struck a shrewd blow, for the slower men were helpless on the hard wicket. At tea the score had been taken to 243, but once again the break proved to be a useful 12th man. Only 22 runs had been added after tea, when Gamble sent Watts back with a brilliant 64 to his credit, after the partnership had realised 120 runs. Soon afterwards Simmons was bowled by Avery for an invaluable and attractive 61. McCanlis and Gamble soon finished off the innings at 303, the former having taken six wickets for 80 runs, and the latter three for 95.

With 85 minutes' play remaining, McMurray opened the Surrey innings with H. R. Crouch, and runs began to come at a lively pace. McMurray made some delightful strokes before leaving at 53, when he appeared to hit against the spin of a delivery from Aitken Davies, a slow right hander, and was caught in the slips by Emmett. McMurray had made 27.

With Wilson in, Crouch began to show his strength, and a number of beautiful offside strokes revealed first-class fielding powers among the Devon men. Wilson, however, was not comfortable, and at 72, when he had made five he was beaten by a ball which came straight through, and was palpably lbw. This brought in the Surrey skipper, W. T. Cook, and the score began to leap along, the captain placing the ball to leg beautifully and making one smashing

straight drive for four off Lock, the former Surrey player. Crouch was playing everything with ease, and reached his 50 by sweeping a ball from Aitken Davies to the leg boundary. The 100 went up in an hour, but at 114 Cook nibbled at a ball from Lock, and was smartly taken in the slips. Crouch and Avery played out time, when the score was 116 for three wickets.

CRICKET

On yet another Saturday cricketers have enjoyed perfect weather for their sport, although to those who had to spend long hours in the sun chasing a ball which was sent often and hard from a real batsman's wicket this was probably a mixed blessing. It was the kind of day when the batsmen generally beat the bowler, and in the end the clock often beat everyone.

Time was, at any rate, the deciding factor in Guildford's game at Croydon, which resulted in a draw after a close match containing some surprising elements, a total of 241 from Croydon receiving a reply of 207 for eight wickets from the visitors. Croydon batted first and their innings reminds one of a more famous match recently, in which one disastrous spell threatened to bring about a collapse of the English team. In this case the demon 'O'Reilly' was represented by R. D. Judd, the Guildford bowler, and he spread his devastation over three overs. Croydon had opened quite confidently with D. N. Moore and D. A. Lancaster, and, with the former hitting out, soon reached 23. At this point Lancaster gave a catch to Wilson off Judd and then came some surprises. With the third ball of his next over Judd made Hobbs give a catch to Parker, and one ball later he clean bowled Isard. The score was still 23.

But worse was to come for Croydon, and with only two more runs on the board Judd had a successful appeal for lbw against Bardell. During this unfortunate spell Moore had been keeping his end up, and with his new partner—E. R. Gryspeerd—he began to get on top of the bowling. Guildford's period of luck was over, and in a partnership which produced some bright cricket, 138 runs were added. It was broken when Moore was caught by Powell off Dadswell, his innings having produced 89 runs, including a six and 12 fours. By a coincidence Gryspeerd was out for the same total as his partner, being bowled by Flippance two wickets later for 89, which included 14 fours. Judd finished the innings with the average of four wickets for 25 runs, P. Flippance taking three for 59 and Dadswell two for 89.

Guildford's reply was an innings in which the total mounted steadily with each wicket to a point very near that of the home team. Broatch, who was the first man in, played his usual cautious game, a score of 52 being mainly composed of singles, with only an occasional knock of four. In contrast was a forceful knock of 56 by Wilson, who hit a four and a six off his first two balls, and altogether sent the ball for two sixes and nine fours. Isard was the mainstay of the Croydon bowling, taking six wickets for 62, and the other two were secured by Harding for 51. Moore, who, by the way, is a Gloucester county player, was unable to do anything with his spin bowling on the hard wicket, although when Croydon visited Guildford he did a good deal of damage.

Guildford second eleven visited Chiddingfold on Saturday, and, playing with only ten men, lost by 21 runs. Chiddingfold, batting first, put up the useful total of 181, a surprising innings of 44 not out by N. Rockwood, who went in seventh wicket down, saving them from a not too promising situation. Rockwood was partnered for some time by K. Cooper, who stayed at the wicket for a very useful innings of 23, until Piper, who was useful steadily, took Cooper's wicket and finished the innings with two more good wickets. In ten overs he took four wickets for 28 runs. Bate secured three for 48.

Guildford started off in good style, and for the loss of four wickets had put 100 on the board, but in spite of useful batting by some of the later players they could not reach the Chiddingfold total. With an extra man, however, and a slice of luck they might have managed to win. S. D. Eudry played a good innings of 33, H. F. Colebrook scored good innings of 35 and W. J. Jenner 32.

Some of the foremost amateur cricketers in London and the south country will be seen on the Guildford Sports Ground on Wednesday, when the annual match between two sections of the Club Cricket Conference takes place. The teams represent London and the Southern Counties, and will be captained respectively by R. T. Bryan, of the famous brotherhood of Bryans who played for Kent, and L. G. Baker, of High Wycombe, a prominent member of Bucks County. Play starts at 11.30 a.m. and a fine day's cricket should be provided. The teams will be:—

The excellent feat of capturing 100 wickets so early in the season has been performed by G. C. Callingham, of Normandy. He took his 100th wicket on Sunday when his club entertained Mr. J. S. Milton's eleven, and he had an average of five wickets for 49. In addition to his bowling performances, Callingham is also a useful bat, as he showed in the same match when he scored 48 towards the Normandy total of 132. Mr. Milton's eleven won the match by replying with 142, towards which E. Peer, a Puttenham player, contributed 40.

Guildford British Legion had a shock when they visited Plaistow on Saturday and were defeated by an innings and 41 runs. 'Ducks' were plentiful in the Legion innings, chiefly through the deadly bowling of C. Ayling, whose average for the first innings was eight wickets for three runs. T. S. Mitchell did most of the wicket-taking in the second innings of the Legion, performing the hat trick and securing eight wickets for 14 runs.

Burnham, the Guildford footballer, was in irresistible form with the ball on Saturday. Playing for the Guildford United Banks, he took nine Merrow 'A' wickets for 17 runs. Despite this Merrow won the match by five runs. Another fine bowling performance was that of F. Boxall, of Guildford Railway Athletic, who took seven Guildford Electric wickets for nine runs.

Merrow did well to defeat Hambledon on Saturday. Batting first, Hambledon scored 102, of which J. Probert was responsible for 43. Merrow seemed in a hopeless position when seven wickets were down for 52 runs. Pooley and Stonehill altered the complexion of the game by putting on 39 runs for the eighth wicket, and the home club won by five runs. For Hambledon, Edwards took three wickets with four balls in one over; F. Amey (four for seven) was Merrow's best bowler.

McMurray and Crouch, who played out time for Surrey, scored 62 in half an hour, the first 50 coming in just over 20 minutes. Their partnership was one of the brightest phases of the day. The attendance at the Minor Counties cricket match, in which Surrey II. opposed Devon on the Guildford Sports Ground, was 330 on Friday and 599 on Saturday. A total of 929 from Guildford and district seems to be disappointing, yet it was regarded as satisfactory. An expression containing this view was forthcoming from the manager of the Surrey team, who stated that it bore favourable comparison with the support accorded Minor Counties games at the Oval. On the other hand, Guildford can draw quite as big an audience to their Saturday afternoon contests. It goes to show that with first class cricket within easy distance reserve matches have no pull with the fan.

The wicket, upon which many superlatives have been expended, stood the test of a two-day match with satisfaction to all concerned. Although the play might have been more inspiring, there were, nevertheless, some good performances. For the Dumplings, who led on the first innings by 61, three batsmen topped the 60 mark, viz., W. W. Hoare (62), J. L. Watts (64) and G. K. Simmons (61),

while Lock, the bowler, once with Surrey, took six wickets for 98 runs. Top scorer for Surrey was H. R. Crouch with 88. Defeat came when he was apparently well set for a century, Carroll taking a smart catch behind the wicket off Lock's bowling. Devon cut a much smaller figure in their second innings, due to the deadly bowling of Owen, who in 12 overs, two of which were maidens, sent back six men at the small cost of 35 runs.

**SURREY II. v. DEVONSHIRE.**

**TWO-DAYS' MATCH AT GUILDFORD.**

GUILDFORD CRICKET CLUB members are very disappointed at the poor attendances at the Minor Counties cricket match at the Sports Ground last Friday and Saturday between Surrey II. and Devon. The "gate" on Friday was as low as 320, while on Saturday it was only about 600—less than 1,000 for two days' really fine cricket, and then the question is asked, "Why cannot we have a Surrey first eleven match here?" The public themselves are to blame, and in consequence of the financial loss last week-end it is very improbable whether there will even be another M.C.C. match at Guildford. Very definitely there will not be a first eleven fixture next season.

WHY THERE should be this lack of support is very difficult to understand in a town of 32,000 population, quite apart from the thousands who reside in the adjacent villages. But Guildford, assuredly, is not a "sporty" town. As one member of Guildford C.C. remarked on Friday, if a charge for admission is made, no matter how small, it sets the seal on a poor attendance. Can it be that something for nothing is what Guildford "sportsmen" want? Look at the "gates" at Guildford City F.C.'s matches! The only annual event which is really well supported is the evening meeting of Charlottesville Cycling Club, and even then a large proportion of the supporters come from areas long distances from Guildford. It is to be sincerely hoped there will be better attendances at the matches during Guildford Cricket Week, which commences on July 23rd.

DEVON won the toss and batted first on a wicket as perfect as any prepared on the Sports Ground. In fact, a *Weekly Press* reporter was told by a Devon player that he had never played on a better pitch anywhere, not even at the Oval, and one of the umpires went so far as to say that the wicket was good enough for a Test. F. H. Carroll, the Devon captain, and E. J. Hatfield opened the innings, the first over, a maiden, being bowled by Gamble. With the first ball of the second over, however, taken by McCanlis, a fast bowler, Hatfield's leg stump was knocked back, and the batsman afterwards stated that he got inside the ball.

ONE for nil. Not a very promising start. But Carroll, who in his time has undoubtedly been a very fine batsman, and can still score runs, played himself in with W. W. Hoare at the other end, and were undefeated at the lunch interval, with the score 118 for one, Carroll having scored 48 and Hoare 62. Hoare got his 50 in 75 minutes. The match was resumed in sensational style, Hoare being bowled in the second over by McCanlis, and the next over Carroll's wicket fell to Gamble, neither batsmen increasing their morning scores. In the third over Emmett lost his wicket leg before to McCanlis for a "duck," four wickets having fallen for 120 runs. Ten minutes later H. S. Stoneman was bowled by McCanlis after scoring 15—137 for five.

B. H. LOCK went in to partner J. L. Watts and was bowled by McCanlis for two, the score being 145 for six, but G. K. Simmons, who took Lock's place, made an able partner for Watts, the combination putting on 120 runs. Watts was bowled by Gamble with his score at 64, and Simmons's wicket fell to Avery when he was 61. J. L. Price, Lock, the old Surrey player, and E. Aitken Davies were soon dismissed, Devon's total being 303 runs. McCanlis took six for 80 and Gamble three for 95.

SURREY II. had 85 minutes' batting on

Friday, H. R. Crouch opening with McMurray, and in the latter chief interest centred by reason of the fact that he is better known to Guildford as the clever outside-right of Guildford City F.C. McMurray's style is definitely that of the professional, his leg and mid-off boundaries quickly carrying his score to 27, when he was dismissed by a catch taken by Emmett in the slips off Davies. One for 53. Wilson went in to partner Crouch, who began to demonstrate the many strokes of which he is capable, but Wilson did not keep his wicket long, being out lbw to Lock after scoring five with 72 on the board. W. T. Cook, Surrey's captain, took his place, and the score bounded along to 114, when Emmett brought off another catch off Lock to dismiss Cook for 23. Avery, with Crouch, played out time, and at close of play on Friday the score was 116 for three.

WHEN play was resumed on Saturday Crouch and Avery continued to bat on a good wicket. At first runs came slowly, but soon the rate increased, and it seemed that Crouch was set for a century at least and that Surrey had every chance of winning on the first innings. But it does not do to be too sure in cricket. Just after one and a quarter hour's play Lock, in two overs, changed the whole course of events. First he had Crouch caught at the wicket for 88, when the score was 171 for four. He followed this up in his next over by dismissing Williamson with a catch off his own bowling before that batsman had got on the board, and with his next ball he had Gamble out lbw. In spite of a valuable 37 not out by Buss, Surrey finished at 242—61 runs behind Devon.

IN DEVONSHIRE'S second innings wickets fell quickly, thanks to Owen, who, bowling from the railway end, claimed six Devon wickets for 35 runs in 12 overs. The tail-enders batted stubbornly and the last wicket fell at 141. H. S. Stoneman was highest scorer with 48. Left with only an hour to make the 203 runs necessary for victory, H. R. Crouch and McMurray opened the innings, and in spite of drives to the boundary by both players it soon became obvious that Surrey had no hope of getting anywhere near Devon's score in the time at their disposal, and at 8 o'clock, with the score at 62 for no wicket, stumps were drawn. The match was thus drawn. Of the 62 runs Crouch made 42, but was badly missed by Aitken Davies at mid-on when he was 15. McMurray made 19.

# : : CRICKET NOTES : :

AN ATTRACTIVE match has been arranged for the Sports Ground pitch next Wednesday. Play will start promptly at 11.30 a.m., and a most enjoyable day's cricket should be witnessed, especially as the two sides will contain some of the foremost amateur cricketers in London and the South—players who merely for lack of leisure are unable to play for their various county clubs. The Conference has about 1,000 clubs affiliated, and it is interesting to mention that about 250 clubs in Surrey are affiliated to the Surrey County section.

R. T. BRYAN, a member of the famous brotherhood of Bryans, all of whom have played for Kent, will captain London; while L. G. Baker, of High Wycombe, a prominent member of Bucks County Club, will lead the Southern Counties, and another of the players will be "Johnny" Broatch, the popular Guildford batsman.
