

MINOR COUNTIES CHAMPIONSHIP

SURREY 2nd v. WILTSHIRE.

Wiltshire were defeated by nine wickets at the Oval on Monday and Tuesday in their first Minor Counties match of the season. Going first to the wickets Wiltshire displayed anything but convincing form, E. M. Nash, W. Lovell Hewitt and A. L. Awdry being the only players to accomplish anything of note, the side being all dismissed for 100. Although McMurray the Surrey batsman, left quickly for a "duck," Fishlock and Wilson set about the bowling in mercurial style, and Wiltshire's score was soon passed. Fishlock was caught at the wicket when within three of his century. Surrey's total was 385 for eight wickets when a declaration was made.

Wiltshire's second venture proved more profitable, and A. L. Awdry had the distinction of scoring the only century of the match. His 113 was a splendid innings. E. B. Lloyd (58) was also in good fettle, whilst W. Smith, who got a "duck" in the first innings, had revenge with a vengeance from Surrey's bowlers, his 50 including many boundaries. Although the aggregate was 310, Wiltshire had gained a very slender lead—40 to be precise. In knocking these runs off, however, Surrey again lost McMurray for a "duck," caught Nash b Smith twice during the match. The necessary runs were obtained without further loss. Scores:—

TROWBRIDGE v. BATH.

Fine Century by Lovell Hewitt.

This match, played at the County Ground on Saturday, resulted in a draw, but the honours were with the home side for the first time for many seasons. Joe Francis had prepared a perfect wicket for his benefit match, and run-letting proved an easy matter, the bowlers on both sides having a heartless task. Lovell Hewitt has been most successful with the toss this season, and he won it again on Saturday, Trowbridge taking first knock.

The start was sensational, both Connor and Keates, who seem to be out of form lately, being dismissed for "ducks." After these setbacks, Lovell Hewitt and Burns were content to go quietly for a while, but the Trowbridge captain cannot be idle for long, and he was soon attacking the bowling, while Burns presented a sound defence at the other end. The score rose gradually, and Amor brought on his slow bowlers, Woodward and Whiting, in an endeavour to effect a separation, but on the easy-paced wicket the batsmen welcomed this move, and the runs came fast. Fifty was soon passed, and loud applause from an appreciative crowd greeted the hundred. Lovell Hewitt was now hitting delightfully on both sides of the wicket, and he soon completed a very fine century, surely the finest innings played at the County Ground for many a day. With the score 146, however, he was caught off a skier, the third-wick partnership having realised 139, and he had scored 107 of these in 90 minutes. Hooper, who came back from his holidays to play in this match, was next in, and he was soon scoring well, but he lost Burns at 166, Burns having completed a valuable half-century. Though somewhat slow, he had played a most useful innings, and did his share towards relieving a desperate situation. Blair now joined Hooper, and soon after Trowbridge declared at 197 for 4 wickets, after two and a quarter-hour batting. The Bath fielding was always good, and Powell was especially prominent in this respect.

Bath had an equal time in which to get the runs, and a powerful batting side with which to do it, and they started as though they meant to have a go for the runs. Longrigg and Northway batted briskly, the former especially being always on the look-out for runs. The 50 was up in 45 minutes, but at 54 Lovell Hewitt took a difficult catch low down at mid-off to dismiss Longrigg. Powell followed in, but after one or two hard hits was caught by Ferris, and two wickets were down for 61. Northway had now slowed down to his usual batting style, and when Humphries left at 73, Bath were well behind the clock. Hart looked as if he might prove dangerous, but another wonderful catch by Lovell Hewitt at mid-off disposed of him, and then Conside came in to give an attractive batting display. By now Northway was simply stopping the ball with his bat, and it was hardly surprising that a crowd, who had come to be entertained, started to barrack him. At seven o'clock, Conside was out after scoring 84, and when stumps were drawn the Bath score was 144 for 5 wickets. Northway did not score at all in the last 25 minutes, but doubtless achieved his object in being not out after two and a quarter hours tedious batting. What a contrast between Lovell Hewitt's glorious batting and Northway's safety first tactics!

The match might have had a good finish, but the visitors preferred to take no risks. There was an excellent attendance, and the crowd gave generously to a collection for the groundsman. Scores:—

From here, however, Trowbridge got on top of the bowling, and thanks to the masterly batting of Warren and Roles, were able to make a good deal of headway. Trowbridge scored the last 130 runs in an hour. The most thrilling stage was when Trowbridge needed 50 runs to win and 20 minutes in which to get them. KNOCK OUT CUP FINAL.

EASY WIN FOR MOTTISFONT.

Bemerton and Mottisfont met in the Knock-out Cup final of the Salisbury and District League on the Chafyn Grove School ground, London-road, on Saturday afternoon in uncertain weather. The ground was lent by Mr. H. L. Whytehead, who had had a splendid wicket prepared. Despite the attraction of the county game on the South Wilts ground, there was a good attendance. The teams fielded their best sides, and Mottisfont provided some sparkling cricket. In all departments superior to Bemerton, many of whom failed to produce the good form they have shown in recent games.

CRICKET WEEK.

COUNTY GAMES AT SALISBURY.

WILTS v. SURREY 2nd XI.

Heavy rain overnight at one time threatened to interfere with the opening of the Minor Counties championship game with Surrey 2nd XI on Monday. At six o'clock the wicket was under water, but then rain ceased and at 11.30 the wicket had dried out so well that there was no delay. Wiltshire included only one professional, Smith, but Surrey had nine, several of whom, including Fishlock, Wilson and Whitfield, had seen almost regular service with the first team. Winning the toss, Col. Awdry chose to bat on a dead wicket, and sent in Butler and Nash to open before a smallish early morning crowd. The varied Surrey attack gave little away, and the slow outfield coupled with smart fielding made run getting difficult. The score crept up into the thirties, and then came variety. A no ball was called and Butler promptly hit it for a magnificent six to the "on" boundary. He followed with a four and then, alas, he was out leg before wicket. Wittchell joined Nash, and when lunch was taken 52 runs had been added without further loss, two hours having been taken to score 54. All things considered this was not so slow as people arriving for the afternoon session might have imagined. When the game was resumed the attendance had swelled considerably, and getting on for a thousand folk saw Nash and Wittchell take the score past the 100 mark. One run later Mobey took a grand catch at the wicket which sent Wittchell back, the partnership having yielded 59 runs. This was Wittchell's second innings for the county. In his first innings against Dorset he scored 139 not out, and with his score of 24 added he went back to the pavilion with an average of 163. It was a strange thing that the ball which Wittchell put behind the wicket was the extra one sent down in a no-ball over. Nash, now joined by A. E. Lloyd, was well set, and he reached his individual 50 with a smart shot to leg. Four runs later he gave a chance to Whitfield at deep square leg, but the fielder misjudged the flight of the ball and failed to get his hands to it. Earlier Nash had given a chance to Wilson at fine leg, but the catch, an absolute "dolly," was dropped. The drying wicket was now becoming treacherous, and Nash got a nasty crack on the chest from a rising ball. Gamble, Fishlock, Parker and McCanlis, all fairly fast, made the ball get up awkwardly, and at 130 McCanlis in the gully, caught Lloyd. Five runs later Nash, when apparently set for a century, nibbled at a rising ball, which shot off Mobey's glove into Fishlock's hands at first slip. In Nash's invaluable 73 were eight fours. Four wickets were down for 135, and when Fuller also got himself caught in the slips half the side were out for 150. Lovell-Hewitt and E. B. Lloyd, two hitters, became associated, and quite unexpectedly came the dullest batting of the day. Neither would take a chance, and it was six overs before another run was scored. In about half-an-hour only fourteen runs were added, and then Lovell-Hewitt was also caught in the slips. Ambrose Awdry, who in the match at the Oval this year scored a century against Surrey, opened full of confidence, and this apparently encouraged Lloyd, who stepped out and hit Parker for a six right down to the screens. How the crowd loved this! Fifteen runs were scored in this over and things were much brighter. With only four runs wanted for the 200, Lloyd, in attempting to get Parker away, mistimed the rising ball and was caught behind the wicket. The 200 was reached after Wilts had batted four hours. Awdry, playing delightfully easy cricket, sent the score along and made the bowling look easy. He had scored 41 (28 of which came by way of boundaries) when he was caught. The only other resistance offered was by Col. Awdry, who went for the bowling, and when he was bowled for 22 the innings closed for 243. Incidentally, the Wilts' skipper was the only player to be clean bowled.

Mobey and Fishlock were Surrey's opening pair. Fishlock did all the scoring after a quiet start, and he had hit sixteen, the side's total, when he returned a hot one to fine mid-on. Butler, the bowler leapt across the wicket and held a grand catch. Awdry came on for Smith, and his clever fighting of the ball prevented the batsmen from ever "digging in." Mobey sustained a confident appeal for lbw when he had scored 12, but the next ball from Awdry saw him caught in the gully. Two wickets were down for 36, and Wiltshire were on top! Another wicket went at 47, when Wilson played

an appallingly bad stroke in dealing with one of Awdry's slows, and was caught by Nash. Cook, the Surrey skipper, joined Whitfield, and so far as he was concerned he appeared content to play out time. Whitfield batted attractively, and the score stood at 53 when Cook, who had never appeared comfortable, put his leg in front of a straight ball from Smith and was out! The hundred was sent up with Whitfield hitting Lloyd for a six, but off the last ball of the day Whitfield was caught. In his 41 were two sixes, and his was a valuable wicket. Wilts were thus in the happy position of having five of the best Surrey bats out for 102 runs.

Heavy rain fell on Tuesday morning and did not stop until after one o'clock. The wicket became sodden but there were hopes of play right up till 3.45. The two captains then made another inspection, and it was decided that the wicket was not drying sufficiently fast to allow of further play. The game was, therefore, abandoned, all Wiltshire's good work and chance of being the first side this season to take points from Surrey being baulked. Scores-

HOW WILTSHIRE FARED.

Salisbury's annual Cricket Week at the South Wilts Club's ground at Bemerton, which began last Friday, terminated yesterday (Thursday) evening, with Dorset claiming a first innings victory over Wiltshire in the Minor Counties Championship. The weather on five days out of the six was fine, but Tuesday saw the abandonment of a game with Surrey II through rain. This was exceedingly unfortunate for the home county, as had play been possible there was a likelihood of them being the first team this season to take points from the Londoners. The cricket on the whole was not so sparkling as usual, but it was seldom dull. The first match on Friday and Saturday was a friendly with Eton Ramblers and this was left drawn, the second match, against Surrey II in the Minor Counties Championship, had to be abandoned, and the third game, with Dorset, ended as stated. Altogether the number of people actually paying for admission was 1,888. On Saturday and Bank Holiday Sir Thomas Lacey, president of the Wilts County Cricket Club, and Lady Lacey were "at home" to a large number of guests, and the band of the Royal Wiltshire Yeomanry was an added attraction. On each day the weather was fine, Monday being warm and sunny. As usual, the members of the South Wilts Club, with Major C. T. Ellison at the head, worked strenuously to ensure the smooth working of the arrangements.

WILTS CLUB AND GROUND v. ETON RAMBLERS.

Eton Ramblers, always welcome visitors to Bemerton, provided the opposition for the opening match of the week, against the Wilts Club and Ground. It had been announced that they would have with the side that forceful run-getter Akers-Douglas, but at the last minute he cried off, and J. D. C. Ellison, the son of Major C. T. Ellison, himself an old Rambler, filled the breach. Making his first appearance in such distinguished company he batted with commendable confidence and carried his bat for 27. In the Club and Ground eleven were J. Evemy, W. J. Williams and J. Wort, all of Salisbury.

The Ramblers' skipper, Major G. H. M. Cartwright, beat Col. Awdry on the toss of the coin, and chose to bat on a wicket which was "sweating" a little. The Club and Ground bowlers were soon on top, and in a very short time five wickets were down for eighty-four. Cartwright was magnificently caught by Evemy in the slips, the fielder holding the ball low down. Hogg and Mott-Radcliffe stayed the collapse, but so tied down were they by the bowlers that it was not until ten minutes after the luncheon interval that the hundred mark was reached. When the partnership had yielded 46 Hogg played late to Sydee and was taken behind the wicket. This was Sydee's first success in 14 overs, off which only 44 runs had been hit. Mott-Radcliffe carried on the good work despite several bowling changes. With the score at 168, however, Williams, who had taken over the ball from Sydee, clean bowled Mott-Radcliffe, whose 43 included eight boundaries. Turner, opening out, hit merrily. His spell was short-lived, however, for in endeavouring a big hit off Butler he skied the ball and was caught by Col. Awdry. Ellison, who had come in at the fall of the seventh wicket, kept a nice straight bat. He did not fail to hit what was loose, however, and two well-timed leg drives brought him deserved boundaries. Johnston, the humorist of the side, after being missed at cover point by A. L. Awdry, met a rather unfortunate and inglorious end. With the score at 218 he "had a go" at one of Sydee's slows and, missing it, thought he had been bowled. This was not the case, but, leaving his crease, he was promptly stumped. The whole side were out for 239. The total, after such a disastrous start, was extraordinarily good.

The Club and Ground opened with Butler and Fuller, who faced two fast bowlers in Turnbull and Hedley. An early set-back was the losing of Butler, who was caught at cover point with the total at eight. Fuller and Evemy improved things, taking the score to 59 before Fuller was magnificently caught at square leg by Hedley. The batting subsequently became painfully slow, Evemy batting for two and a quarter hours for 40. It was a patient and invaluable innings, but this snail's pace was rather flattering to the bowlers. Another smart catch by Hedley at square leg also led to Evemy's dismissal. When play closed Wilts were 87 runs adrift with four wickets standing.

Wiltshire were soon all out when play was resumed on Saturday morning, the total reaching 200, or 39 less than the Ramblers' score. The Ramblers, batting a second time, met an unexpected rebuff with the dismissal of Gosling after he had scored but a single. Cart-

wright, who was so well caught in the first innings, joined Scaramanga, and a stand appeared imminent, but with the total at 32 Williams took the ball from Sydee and with his third delivery got Scaramanga caught by Col. Awdry at mid-off. Cartwright, continued to bat with confidence, and must have been seeing the ball well for, when his individual total stood at 46, Ling sent down a terribly loose ball which was dangerously head high, but Cartwright sent it to the boundary with a back-handed shot. This gave him his half century. In the next ten minutes runs came rapidly, and Cartwright seemed set for a century. Time was creeping on, however, and an attempt to force the pace led to the fall of the Ramblers' captain's wicket, Sydee getting him caught at mid-off. Cartwright had contributed 78 of the 130 on the score board, and altogether he hit ten fours. Hedley followed in, and hit a beautiful six. He failed to quite get the next ball, however, and sent up a catch to Fuller at cover point which was promptly accepted. The total then stood at 137, and without further addition Sheepshank was clean bowled and Turner was caught at square leg, being the first player to leave with a "duck." Stubborn batting by the tail enabled the score to mount to 206, and Wiltshire were left to get 246 to win in about two hours and a half. Butler and Fuller set about the task in fine style, and 50 runs were on the board in no time. With them together there was always a chance of victory. The fast scoring and crisp batting by both was delightful to watch. Seventy runs were signalled when Butler edged a fast ball and was well caught in the slips. Evemy, who followed, was bowled for a "duck" by a real fizzer from Turnbull. Fuller continued to hit the ball very hard, and a fine drive for four brought him his 50. The next delivery he drove hard to mid on, and was caught by Hogg. A definite finish was not possible, and when the Club and Ground had scored 168 for the loss of 5 wickets play closed, the game being left drawn. Scores:—

WILTSHIRE v. DORSET.

Wiltshire won points for a first innings lead in their match against Dorset, at Sherborne, on Wednesday and Thursday in last week. Rain greatly interfered with the play, and one innings to each side was as far as the match progressed.

Wiltshire's first innings was notable for the fine scoring partnership between G. S. Butler (who made a welcome return to the side) and H. G. Witchell, the last-named going in first wicket down and carrying his bat for a score of 132. He displayed a good variety of strokes.

Dorset were set to score 203 to obtain a lead on the innings, but Smith and Butler soon got amongst the wickets. A. E. Warren and H. F. W. Fox brightened the unpromising position, however, Fox, after a quiet opening, being very severe on the bowlers. Like Witchell, he also carried his bat, his score being 126. M. B. Elderton and Capt. CHAMPIONSHIP.

WILTS BEAT KENT AT SALISBURY.

Wiltshire received Kent 2nd XI at the South Wilt Club's ground, at Bemerton, on Monday and Tuesday for the return game in the minor counties championship, and some interesting cricket was seen. Kent, who won the first game at Canterbury, fielded a very young side under that sporting cricketer, G. A. Simpson, whilst Wilts relied on the same team which did duty for the two games last week against Dorset and Surrey 2nd XI. Winning the toss, Kent batted first on an easy wicket, and early on there were brief stoppages for rain. Sunnucks and the amateur A. G. W. Hill opened, and they found themselves pegged down by the good bowling of Butler and A. E. Lloyd. With only twelve runs on the board Hill was beautifully caught by Awdry off Butler. Butler got rid of Pierce with only eight runs added, and with the score at 44 got Spencer lbw. When five were down for sixty-six Wiltshire's chance of dismissing their opponents very cheaply appeared rosy. The remaining "bats," however, were more at home, and there were good sixth and eighth wicket stands. Sunnucks was eventually out lbw, having batted two and three-quarter hours for 25. The Wiltshire bowling was good, but this snail's pace was not excusable. Kent were finally dismissed for 163. Wiltshire fared disastrously when they faced the Kent attack. In the first over Nash edged a ball behind the wicket and was caught at second slip. There was some doubt as to the catch, but the square leg umpire gave Nash out, and Wilts had one wicket down with no runs scored. Witchell and Butler retrieved a little of the lost ground, and took the score to 49, when Witchell was clean bowled with a sharply turning ball from Arnold. With his dismissal came a collapse, and seven wickets were down for eighty-one. Col. Awdry and E. B. Lloyd, playing stubborn cricket, checked the "procession," and the score mounted gradually. The Wiltshire skipper was not comfortable, and the black cloudy sky made the ball difficult to see. When the total had reached 106, Col. Awdry was bowled. He had only scored six, but the stand had produced 25 runs. Smith joined Lloyd, but with the total at 114 an appeal against the bad light was sustained, and there was no further play. Wilts were thus 49 runs behind with two wickets standing.

The weather on Tuesday, when the game was resumed, was ideal and a full day's cricket closed with Wiltshire securing a fine win. Lloyd and Smith continued the Wiltshire innings and the latter sat on the spicce while Lloyd got the runs. Smith was eventually bowled by Lewis, and with Sydee out leg before wicket, the innings closed for 133, Lloyd carrying his bat for 36. Kent again were dismissed for 188, Wright being the only batsman to deal effectively with the bowling. Going in at the fall of the fourth wicket he was ninth out, having scored 52. He fell a victim to Smith, and with the next ball Smith got Arnold caught to end the innings. Smith took five wickets for 42 runs. Wilts were thus left 219 to get to win in two hours and twenty-five minutes. With Nash again falling, the chance of victory appeared remote, but Butler and Witchell, batting boldly, brought a win well within the bounds of possibility. They both played grand cricket and the score had mounted to 78 when Witchell was out lbw. A. E. Lloyd only stayed to make one, three wickets being down for 78. Fuller then joined Butler and the hundred mark was passed safely. Butler scored twice as fast as his partner and he was still going strong at 110, when Fuller was caught, having contributed 10 in a stand which had yielded 32 runs. Runs had to be got and got quickly and Butler, in going for a ball from Ashwell was smartly caught at cover point by Spencer. The total then stood at 125, of which Butler had made 70, which included ten fours. As he walked to the pavilion his courageous batting was warmly applauded by spectators and players alike. Lovell Hewitt and E. B. Lloyd played confidently from the outset of their coming together and the cricket was of the merry kind. There was some fine running between the wickets and chancy singles were often stolen. Anything in the nature of a loose ball was severely punished. For instance, when Arnold delivered a no ball, Lloyd immediately clouted it for a high down to the screens. How the crowd cheered! The wicket had become very easy and the Kent bowlers could get little assistance from it. The fielding was extraordinarily keen, however, and Spencer at cover point saved two wickets by diving for the ball. At 160 Grimshaw

came on to bowl at the top end and Lovell Hewitt pulled the first ball to leg for four. In two overs eighteen runs were notched and when six o'clock struck Wilts only required 4. to win. When the total had reached 188, Lloyd was caught in the deep. The pair had put on 61 runs and in Lloyd's 31 were a six and four fours. Lovell Hewitt, hitting a four and a two sent up the 200, which had been scored in two hours and five minutes. A. L. Awdry, who had replaced Lloyd, also went for the bowling and gave two chances which were dropped. Three byes were a great help and when a Kent fielder, in his anxiety to save a boundary, stumbled and kicked the ball over the line, Wilts were well within striking distance. Lovell Hewitt, in getting his individual 50, brought Wiltshire within two runs of victory. He hit the equalising run and then Awdry got the winning single. Wiltshire had won by four wickets and with ten minutes to spare. Two hundred and nineteen runs in 135 minutes is an indication of the grand cricket produced. Scores:—

NOTES.

Mottisfont and West Dean both won their matches on Saturday, and the neck-to-neck race for the leadership of the league still continues. Porton lost the toss and were sent in to bat first. Despite a bad start (1 for 0) F. WILTSHIRE v. BERKSHIRE.

Wiltshire concluded their season's programme ingloriously, Berkshire winning the return match at the County Ground, Trowbridge, on Monday and Tuesday, by an innings and 23 runs. It is interesting to recall that this year commemorates the 25th anniversary of Wiltshire's great victory over Glamorgan, in 1909, when they won the Minor Counties Championship. Wiltshire have had a poor time this season, and there is no doubt that Jim Smith was missed badly in the bowling ranks.

The match at Trowbridge this week revealed a glaring absence of effective change bowling. The batting was also unenterprising. True, the bowling of Peach, the old Surrey professional, and Relf was remarkably accurate, but it could be hit. Alan Sawyer proved this when he went in ninth man in Wiltshire's first innings and hit a 6 and several 4's. He scored 30 all told, and this proved to be the highest contribution in the Wilts team in both innings.

The game commenced in a gale, and the County Ground is particularly susceptible to the effects of such weather. Whilst the majority of the players, and the handful of spectators, would have appreciated calmer conditions, Peach revelled in the wind, for it enabled him to swing the ball to such good purpose that the batsmen seemed completely "at sea." Peach claimed the first four wickets with only 48 runs scored, and, throughout the innings, with the notable exception of Sawyer, he persuaded the batsmen to pursue unenterprising tactics. The innings realised only 141, Peach claiming seven wickets for 60 runs.

Berkshire's innings was not spectacular by any means, but their opening pair experienced only brief periods of difficulty with the bowling. Smith and A. Awdry kept a good length, but H. L. Lewis and G. Sayles got the ball nicely in the middle of the bat and soon took the edge off the bowling. The first wicket partnership realised 98 runs, both players passing the 50 mark, and when stumps were drawn for the day Berkshire had scored 214 for four wickets.

On Tuesday the wind was hardly so fierce and Wiltshire's bowlers operated with greater effect. Berkshire were all out for 301, and facing a deficit of only 160, it was hoped that Wiltshire's second knock would prove more profitable. Peach and Relf proved almost as effective as in the first innings, however, and with the assistance of Human, the visiting shire contrived to dismiss their opponents for four runs fewer than their first innings total, leaving Berkshire winners by an innings and 23 runs.

A noticeable failure in the match was H. G. Witchell, who scored 136 not out at Reading in the first match. He had the remarkable average of 110 before the match, having played four not out innings, including two centuries. Smith had the rare experience of bowling 26 overs during the match without taking a solitary wicket.
