FEAST OF RUNS

TRURO'S DOUBLE OVER REDRUTH

Devotees of King Willow who, scoring league points and captives, believe with Shakespeare that "the play's the thing," enjoyed a rare feast of runs at Truro on Saturday, where the home team beat Redruth by 58 runs. It was cricket at its best from two teams who, freed from championship worries, forgot league points and gave unsparingly of their best for sheer love of the game. The previous meeting of these teams saw some high scoring, Truro bringing off the surprise of the season by winning 199-143. The element of surprise was absent this time for Redruth were without two of their best all-rounders, Harry and Bradley, so that Truro were expected by many to repeat their victory. Both attacks were only moderate, and this resulted in an orgy of run-getting, no fewer than 426 being scored in about 4 1/2 hours' play.

Batting first, Truro amassed 246 for eight wickets in 2 1/2 hours before declaring. Five men contributed 187 towards this total, the individual scores being Barnes 57, Lewman 39, Hambly 34, Bussa 33, and Bax 24. Easily the best of these efforts was that of Barnes, who, for the first time this season, showed a return to the stylish and free batting which gained him county honours two or three years ago. He also took seven wickets, and perhaps this success will revive his former keenness. Next in order of merit came young Bax, who admirably demonstrated the typical left-hander's slashing cover drives, cuts and hooks. He should become a reliable, forcing bat when he has learnt not to step back and cover up so much. Bussa merrily hit boundaries all round the wicket, and Hambly merrily straight-drove all along the carpet. Lewman's score was marred by an early "lifo" in the slips and a cramped style. Is it too late for him to start using his hefty weight and to develop off-side strokes to replace feeble pokes?

Everything in Redruth's batting was dwarfed by a century by McKensie. The measure of predominance was shown by the fact that the next highest scorers made 18 apiece. Could he have got but one companion to stay with him for a decent while he would undoubtedly have saved his side a point. Captain of the Colts in 1934, McKensie scored all round the wicket with every variety of stroke, and no fewer than 20 boundaries attested to the perfection of his "placing." Truronians thought that he offered a chance at 80, but had it come to hand it would have been a wonderful catch, and it could not be considered as a serious blemish on a grand, fighting innings. As he also saved at least 30 runs by clean hitting in the deep, he was an outstanding figure throughout the match, and if a vacancy should occur in the county team before Friday the selection committee might do worse than give him a trial; new blood is urgently needed to stiffen Cornwall's batting.

A delightful feature was the consistently keen fielding of both sides, with Redruth the more accurate, crowned by three remarkable catches. Tonkin snatched up a snorter at short-leg, Hambly grabbed a scorching off-drive at "suicide point" and Williams took a running-in catch at third man a couple of inches from the ground. The wicket-keeping was not very good. Hosking is regarded by many good judges as a coming county keeper. For some reason not apparent he had a decidedly "off day," conceding 31 extras and missing the only easy chance of stumping offered him. Scores:
