TROON & FALMOUTH LEAGUE RIVALRY

UMPIRING EXPERIMENT

CORNWALL'S match with Middlesex

II. at Penzance was lost, but only after a fine finish and a number of thrills. The game opened on Friday with a batting collapse by Cornwall, who lost six wickets for some 30 runs, and finished with a collapse by Middlesex, who lost five wickets for 24 runs in the fourth innings, and had to fight very hard for the 61 runs needed to win.

Had not Ollerearnshaw fallen lame at the critical moment, when he was bowling so finely, no one can say what the result might have been.

There is no cause for anxiety about Cornwall's attack. Admittedly, a really fast bowler would be a great asset, but Mill, Ollerearnshaw, Maddern, and Harry are equal to most occasions, and Bradley is a very useful fifth member of the attack. Once again it is weakness in batting which is Cornwall's problem. In this game Harry and Maddern put the side out of a critical position in the first innings, and Cory, Ollerearnshaw, and Hoiman (G.) all showed good form in the second innings. Rarely has Ollerearnshaw batted more attractively than on Saturday, and he played with great power and confidence, getting three glorious 6's, one at the expense of the wind-screen of a spectator's car. On the whole Cornwall can feel quite satisfied with the game. The resources of a side like Middlesex II. are not to be compared with those of a county like Cornwall, and this must be borne in mind.

For various other reasons it has not been possible to put Cornwall's strongest side in the field in the opening matches, and the remaining games will doubtless see an improved side, at least for the home engagements.

COUNTY LEAGUE.

An interesting position persists in the Senior League in the West. UMPIRING.

The past fortnight has been marked by some rather unfortunate criticism of the experiment of neutral umpires in league matches in West Cornwall. This criticism, fortunately, is limited to one or two sources only, and certainly is not widespread. Calm reflection will, it is hoped, bring down the temperature and enable all to realize that the authority of the umpires must be respected and upheld, and that the responsible body, the Umpires' Association, is alive to all the difficulties which have surrounded the initiation of this experiment. If the clubs wish to have other arrangements for 1937, or a differently constituted association, the matter is entirely in their hands, and they will doubtless make their wishes known at the proper place and time.

The Gloucestershire XI. are visiting Camborne on Saturday, July 18, for a day's match with the local club, possibly strengthened by some other players. This will be an opportunity for Cornish enthusiasts to see first-class players, and the Camborne club deserve a large "gate" to reward them for their enterprise.
