"But justice to the Pontypool club claims the compliment that they have some superior and crack men among them. We must yield the palm. c" as one of our cricketers good-humouredly said—'Great let us call them, for they conquered us.'

ONLY LOBS

The clock was put back to those days on Thursday. The players wore clothes of a century ago. There were top hats. waistcoats, tail coats and cravat, and on every face were sideboard whiskers and heavy moustaches.

Scores were recorded by notching ash sticks.

The game was played strictly to the rules of these early days. Attack was restricted to lob-bowling. No pads were worn. There were no boundaries. Every hit had to be "run out."

Players smoked clay pipes and batsmen put them down just outside the Crease when they faced the bowling.

Crease when they faced the bowling. True to the tradition of the past the fun began when the captains, Major J. E. C. Partridge and Dr. N. Rocyn Jones, went on the field and hotly argued where the wickets should be pitched. Then the umpires, also in period costume, Messrs. J. Cox and Harry J. Rowlands, went out and pitched the wickets.

Not long after the Mayor of New-port, Counciller William Casey, had bowled the first ball, which, by the way, was wide of the wicket, it was noticed that the scorers, Messrs. Reg. Webb and Sid Ingram, who were also

in costume, fell out and Webb pushed Ingram off the seat and put him on his

ON A WHEELBARROW The Gentlemen of the District took first stand. Lieutenant-Colonel F. Gordon Phillips and Jack Wreford opened to the bowling of T. B. Williams and N. Feirelungh. Fairclough.

Before a run had been scored there was a misunderstanding, and Wreford was run out.

Norman Abraham was then caught by Everson when the total was six. Some stylish cricket between Gordon Phillips and W. E. C. Hudden followed. They are former Monmouthshire players, and they had not forgotten the art. The score was carried to 36 when Hudden was caught by Fairclough off Rocyn Roses.

There was another lively passage when Tom Blandford joined Gordon Phillips. At the fall of the fifth wicket for 61 there came an interlude.
