**CRICKET** is now in full swing. Saturday's matches in St. Albans and the surrounding district produced no little excitement and some surprises.

St. Albans suffered their usual fate before Luton. Lamont's grand bowling was largely responsible for St. Albans' lament. Harpenden jumped into their best form at Highgate, but Radlett and Welwyn Garden City just can't strike winning ways. Radlett's attack needs strengthening and the Garden Citizens' batsmen have not found their form.
