## CRICKET TOPICS

### NORFOLK CLUB AND GROUND MATCHES

### VILLAGE CRICKET AND NEW LBW RULE

The first match on the Norfolk County card of fixtures will be played at Lakenham next Wednesday, when a Club and Ground side will be pitted against an eleven from Trinity College, Cambridge. At the annual meeting of the Norfolk County Club in March M. Falcon stated that the County Club hoped to make more of the Club and Ground matches this season. The Norfolk captain said that the club now realised that they were rather losing an opportunity over these games and hoped in future to attract players, especially young ones of promise, to take part and let them realise that their abilities were being watched and that interest was being taken in their cricket.

Mr. Falcon is now in much closer touch with the club cricket of the county than it was possible for him to be when he was residing in another county. He appreciates the value of Club and Ground matches as propaganda for the County Club and also that the matches can be the means of bringing out players and of giving players an opportunity of calling attention to their abilities with the view to future development. The practice of holding Colts' matches at the very beginning of the season before some of the players had run into form has fallen into disuse. In the writer's young days there were also one and two-day matches between the County XI. and the Next XIV., and East v. West, in addition to Club and Ground matches. These matches also served to awaken interest in county cricket during the period before the county matches came on.

The principal aim of all matches of this type is the discovery of players likely to be of service to the county—the finding of players worthy of having a trial in the county team. To make these matches the real test they are intended to be, it is necessary that the Club and Ground teams should be strong and contain a good leaven of county players. In recent years the professional staff has been smaller than in the days when Club and Ground matches provided a club batsman with an opportunity of showing his skill against county bowlers like Shore and Morley, Smith and Gibson, &c. The new interest taken in the Club and Ground matches is all to the good of cricket in the county. R. H. Gladden will captain the team against Trinity College at Lakenham next Wednesday, and the county captain will lead the side to take part in the opening match of the new ground at Great Yarmouth on Whit Monday.

#### CLUBS AND NEW LBW EXPERIMENT

To what extent the clubs of Norfolk and other counties are responding to the appeal of the M.C.C. to give the new lbw experimental rule a try out this season we are unable to say. All that we know positively is that the clubs affiliated to the Norfolk Association have been instructed to adopt the new rule, and that the Norfolk Saturday and Junior Cup competitions, which are managed by the association, will be played under it. The clubs taking part in these competitions, which begin next week, are in the main village clubs, and though it might be difficult to make out a case for the need of helping bowlers in this class of match, there is a good deal to be said for uniformity in the laws of the game. The disadvantages of having different laws for different grades of cricket are obvious. County players are recruited from the clubs, and promoted players would be under a handicap if they

had not previously had an opportunity of playing under the new rule. We believe that the adoption of the new rule in the better class of club cricket is general throughout the country. It is the wisest course, if only because it is believed that the new rule will cease to be an experiment after this season and that next year it will be a fixed law.

The only new provision is that the striker is out to a ball which, pitching on the off-side of the striker's wicket, would have hit the wicket had it not been intercepted by part of the striker's person (except his hand), which part was between wicket and wicket at the moment of impact.

#### HELPING THE BOWLERS

The change was made with the intention of giving the bowlers more help in the fight between bat and ball, which had gradually become unequal through the perfection of wickets. It was also a blow at pad play, an objectionable feature of modern batsmanship. The new rule has compelled batsmen to trust to their bat and their strokes and to play at the off ball instead of covering up. Mistrust of umpires was one of the chief objections to the change, but in top grade cricket many of the umpires who had experience of the new rule last year were of opinion that their task had been made easier as they had no longer to consider whether the ball had pitched on or just outside the off-stump.

#### UMPIRING IN VILLAGE MATCHES

Club cricketers may be excusably shy of putting fresh responsibilities upon the shoulders of umpires. Pad play is practically unknown among the small clubs or village cricket. No one will pretend that the standard of umpiring in that class is as high as that in county cricket. The average player is more concerned about keeping his legs away from the ball rather than using his pads as a second line of defence. As we mentioned previously bowlers require no fresh aids in village cricket. P. Bird's 92 at Stibbard on the first Saturday of the season was an exceptional performance. Bowling feats like that of W. Mobbs, who took eight Hempton wickets for a single run in a Rudham League match, are the high spots of village cricket. The total of Hempton's innings that day was only four and it will interest the players to know that 121 years ago when the parishes of Litcham, Dunham, and Brisley combined to play a team drawn from Fakenham, Walsingham, and Hempton, the latter did not get a single notch, which the newspaper of that time described as a feat "unparalleled in the annals of cricketeering."

#### MR. JOHN HUDSON'S STORY

At Swanton Morley the other day thirty wickets fell in a match for 84 runs, and it is by no means uncommon for two innings each to be played before six o'clock and the aggregate of the four innings to be well under 100. Mr. John Hudson, with over 50 years' experience of village cricket in Norfolk, has said that the two things which cried out for improvement in village cricket were the pitches and the umpiring. He tells the story of a match in which he played which began at 1.30 and within two hours his side batted twice and lost by an innings. That is only the half of the story. The rest of it in Mr. Hudson's own words is: "It was then decided to play a second match, and by six o'clock we were on our way home, having suffered two bad defeats. The home umpire was a great authority on the lbw rule, and if the ball hit us anywhere below the waist we were given out. In the two matches there were 28 lbw's!"

WOMEN'S COUNTY  
MATCH

Norfolk Entertain Kent at  
Aylsham

Thousands of cricketers were disappointed because of the weather on Saturday, but none more so than the Norfolk County women, who entertained Kent at Aylsham Recreation Ground. The start was delayed over two hours, and only sixty-five minutes' play in all was possible and in this period there was an interference by a heavy shower.

The Norfolk Women's Cricket Association is but a few months old, and this was the first inter-county match that had been attempted. Even the reflection that the rain was so badly needed could scarcely make up for the Norfolk women's disappointment, especially as their visitors had travelled so far to give them their baptism of county play.

Kent included several players well known in the women's cricket world, notably Miss Archdale, who captained the side which visited Australia; Miss Cattell, and Miss Doman. Miss Doman won the toss and elected to put Norfolk in first, calculating, no doubt, that the wicket would give her bowlers considerable assistance. Norfolk had fifty-five minutes' batting before the rain caused a stoppage, and in that period made 59 runs for the loss of six wickets. Off Miss Woolger's third ball Miss K. Gahan was caught by Miss Lelean at mid-off, and only 5 runs had been scored when Miss Roe was dismissed in exactly the same way. Miss N. Gahan and Mrs. Cross improved the Norfolk position, getting runs briskly and causing a change of bowling at 23, when Miss Doman, a left-hander, went off and put on Miss Cattell, a slow right-hander. The score was 35 when Mrs. Cross, who hit well on the leg side and had two fours in her 13, was caught by Miss Heyate off Miss Cattell. Mrs. Icton was bowled by the next ball. At 40 Miss Doman again took the ball in place of Miss Woolger, and at 44 Miss N. Gahan, who went in at the fall of the first wicket with no run scored, was run out in attempting a second run. She had batted very steadily. Miss Lynam left at 49, and Miss Bullard pulled Miss Doman off two successive balls, one shot reaching the boundary.

When the rain caused a stoppage Norfolk declared. A resumption was possible a quarter of an hour later and Kent, batting only ten minutes before heavy rain finally stopped play, lost three wickets for six runs. With one scored, Miss Sexton finely caught Miss Foster at square leg. Five had been added when Miss N. Gahan had Miss Archdale leg before, and with the next ball she bowled Miss Waters. Both teams were very good in the field, the wicket keeping of Miss Tapsfield, of Kent, being noteworthy.

There are four clubs connected with the Norfolk Association, Aylsham, Sennowe Park, Blofield, and Norwich Post Office. On July 11th Norfolk will play a team from Hertfordshire, captained by Miss Pollard, at Sennowe Park. A collection was taken on Saturday on behalf of the hospitality fund in connexion with the visit to this country of an Australian team next year. The Australian team will play an Eastern team, representing Kent, Norfolk, and Herts, at Stevenage.

## CRICKET TOPICS

## Norfolk Players at Lord's

## Another Edrich-Hendren Partnership

The thunderstorms which not infrequently occur during a heat wave have left their mark on recent cricket. In some instances matches have been abandoned without a first innings result being obtained, but cases have been more numerous in which batsmen have had a lean time on the rain damaged wickets. During the week Notts won two matches in which the total of their first innings in each match was under 70. Derbyshire 62, Gloucestershire 88, and Northamptonshire 68 were other small scores, and All India, dismissed for 86 by Yorkshire, had their day of triumph at Lord's, where they dismissed the Minor Counties for 42 and gained their first victory. It was the tourists' thirteenth match, and in their case thirteen was not an unlucky number.

Rain interfered with the matches at Southampton between the only two unbeaten counties, and in the end Hampshire were fortunate to escape defeat. Hampshire are now engaged with Yorkshire—and Verity—at Leeds, and the nought may disappear from their lost column. Kent are still at the top of the table, though their percentage has come down, and Yorkshire have left the unfamiliar middle position and are now fifth. Since the war Yorkshire have finished at the head of the table nine times. At Lord's the other day we met a Kent enthusiast who had taken 3 to 1 about Kent finishing above Yorkshire this season. The bet now does not look quite so good.

Middlesex II. have given their percentage an appreciable lift by obtaining the maximum points from Surrey II. and Devon. The defeat of Surrey II. by an innings and eight runs was a notable performance. Durston and Young were mainly responsible for Surrey II. being dismissed at the Oval for such small scores as 172 and 96, and Durston and Watkins had bowling successes against Devon at Finchley. Middlesex pursued a bold policy against Devon, declaring with five wickets in hand and with no more than 274 runs on the board, but by the end of the day they were able to make Devon follow on. Devon batted better the second day and took so long over compiling 250 that Middlesex had to make a dash for the 86 needed to win and lost eight wickets in getting the runs.

Jack Durston is one of cricket's Goliaths. A product of Bedfordshire village cricket, he joined the staff at Lord's when he was in his teens and his cricket was then interrupted by war service. Durston returned to Lord's in 1919 and ten years later he took his thousandth wicket for Middlesex. Durston is now in his 42nd year.

Suffolk fared badly against Hertfordshire at Watford. They lost the toss and had the worst of the wicket, Hertfordshire's slow spin bowlers going through the side very quickly. Watson, who is on the staff at Leavesden Hospital, was more successful than the left-handed Roberts, and he had the fine match figures of twelve wickets for 72. When a change of bowling was made in the second innings, Cyril Fordham made amends for his "duck" by taking four quick wickets. Grimsdell had a good match. Promoted to an opening batsman he made the top score of 90, and assisted in capturing five wickets, performing the stumping feat four times. Hertfordshire have started well. On Wednesday they entertain Bedfordshire at St. Albans, and next Monday they pay their annual visit to Mr. Douglas Crossman's private ground at Cokenach, near Royston, when their opponents will come from Norfolk. Suffolk play their return match with

Lincolnshire at Bury St. Edmunds on Wednesday and Thursday next.

Staffordshire, for whom Lockett is still getting cheap wickets, beat Cheshire at Stoke-on-Trent by the narrow margin of two runs, and thus avenged the heavy defeat they sustained at Chester in May. Cheshire were under handicap, as their fine all-rounder, Dennis, was in the Minor Counties team at Lord's.

## ENGLAND'S NEW CAPTAIN

George Oswald Browning Allen, who is to be England's new captain in the first of the Test matches with All India, has had experience of representative cricket in England, Australia, and South America. He is one of the very few amateurs who have taken all ten wickets in a county match, and his successes as a batsman include a century for the Gentlemen against the Players and a century in a Test Match against New Zealand at Lord's. In the latter match he joined Ames in a partnership of 246. Like Jardine, who was born in Bombay, Allen cannot claim England as his birthplace. Allen was born in Sydney, and his uncle, R. C. Allen, played for Australia against England in 1887. Allen was very young in years when he was brought to England. He played for Eton and gained his Blue as a Freshman at Cambridge in 1922, taking nine Oxford wickets in the match at Lord's. Allen will be 34 next month.

Tristan Ballance has made few appearances for Oxford University this season, and his score of 63 against Leicestershire last Tuesday was his highest score in first class cricket. Going in at the fall of the eighth wicket he attacked the bowling so forcibly that he hit nine fours, his partnership with P. M. Whitehouse producing 116 runs in 55 minutes. The improvement in Ballance's batting was noticeable in his matches with Norfolk the last two seasons, and at Hunstanton last August he made his top score of 76 not out against Lincolnshire.

## EDRICH'S SECOND 100 AT LORD'S

Those who were punctual in their attendance at Lord's on Monday for the start of the Test Trial match were surprised to see W. J. Edrich walk through the gate with Gimblett and the other professionals in the South team, led by G. O. Allen. A hasty checking of the players on the field with the official score card revealed the fact that R. W. V. Robins was absent. It was some time before Robins came out, and the Norfolk man enjoyed his period of fielding as substitute. That Edrich was chosen from the large staff at Lord's for this small task suggests that his fielding abilities are recognised at headquarters, and it may be that this brief association with the revival of the North v. South matches will be the forerunner of more opportunities for Edrich in representative matches. He failed to seize the chance which the Minor Counties match with All-India provided, Amar Singh getting through his defence in the first innings, and when he was holding out a promise of stopping the second innings rot Edrich touched one of Nissar's expresses and was caught behind the wicket. Success as a bowler was also denied Edrich, as many as 35 runs being scored off four of his five overs.

Saturday, however, brought great distinction to the Edrich's, William scoring his second century of the season for M.C.C. at Lord's and his elder brother, Eric, scoring 111 not out at Heacham, in a match in which three Edrich's took part—the father and two sons. W. J.'s 114 at Lord's was the only century of the day in first class cricket. He joined Hendren at a time when four wickets had fallen for 74 and the Oxford captain's policy of putting the M.C.C. in appeared likely to be justified. Hendren and Edrich brought about a great change, and it will be remembered that Hendren was associated with Edrich in a partnership of 296 when Edrich made his first 114 against Surrey in May. On Saturday the pair were together eighty-five minutes, and 141 runs were added. During this stand Hendren completed his 1000 runs for the season, but missed the century honour by a mere couple of runs. When Edrich settled down he batted brilliantly, hitting fourteen boundaries during a stay of two and a half hours. His front-of-the-

wicket scoring strokes were a fine feature of his splendid innings. When Oxford batted the spectators at Lord's were treated to a sound display by another Norfolk player, Michael Barton scoring 35 not out and seeing four Oxford wickets fall very rapidly.

Captain G. N. Scott-Chad assisted the Past to beat the Present Coldstream Guards at Burton Court, Chelsea, by four wickets after the Present had declared with two wickets in hand. Scott-Chad scored 17 and took one wicket. Scott-Chad can now claim to have played for two counties. He was given permission to assist Lincolnshire in their friendly match with the Royal Air Force.
