**TYNEMOUTH AND CONSETT
BEAT CLOSE RIVALS
BOLDON'S FIRST DEFEAT
MORPETH BATSMAN MAKES ONLY
SENIOR CENTURY**

Surprisingly few matches were affected by the rain that fell on Friday and Saturday, but conditions were cheerless for the most part, and fielding was a cold job.

The four unbeaten teams in Division A of the Northumberland Senior League were reduced to three with the defeat of Tynedale by Tynemouth, who now lead by two points. Benwell, however, also have a full points record for a match less played. Close House had their first win.

Tom Robson, the Morpeth left-hander, carried off batting honours with 113, and Wilson, Tynemouth professional, had the best bowling performance, 7 for 43. The County II. captain, H. R. Urwin, took 10 for 56 in Division B, which Morpeth II., only unbeaten side, lead.

Consett went ahead in the Tyneside Senior League as a result of their win over Madamsley, who were far from impressive at Blackfyne. J. L. Brown (Gateshead Fall) had the highest individual score, with 65, in Division A matches, and J. E. Richardson (Greenside) had much the best bowling performance, 8 for 17.

Boldon's defeat leaves Sunderland and Durham City undefeated Durham Senior League clubs. Whitburn gained a first win, leaving Seaham alone without one. They almost saved the game at Ashbrooke, Emmott Robinson getting their last wicket in the final over, to finish up with 7 for 43.

Ridley's 6 for 3, Hendon v. Philadelphia, was the outstanding bowling feat in the League; and W. T. Charlton topped the batting with 92.

Blackhall are now N.Y.S.D. League leaders, while Norton, champions, are without a win. They are missing D. C. H. Townsend, Charles Greaves, Scottish International, was the star bowler of the day with 7 for 19. Ellis, 7 for 17, again played a big part in a Horden victory in the Durham County League.

The Hexham match, which Tynemouth won by 19 runs, drew the best crowd of the season, despite the cold, but was a game almost entirely lacking in thrills. The wicket, in consequence of overnight rains, was rather on the slow side and it did not suit Allan, while J. Graham, Tynedale's slow bowler, was not able to play.

Tynemouth had the good fortune to win the toss, but Allan bowled L. Purvis at 6. Lea and Mutch, however, carried the score to 73, before the former was out to a brilliant catch by A. Graham. He had seven 4's. Mutch left at the same total, bowled by Allan; thereafter the visitors lost wickets steadily, only Rhind making any stand. The innings lasted 39 overs and the total reached 113. Considering that Graham was absent, and that Thomson had 30 runs hit off him before he was relieved by Watson, Tynedale can be complimented on getting out such a strong batting side for such a score and Allan bowled right through the innings, to get 5 for 22.

Tynedale's batting, with the exception of Ridley and Bland, was unenterprising. Still, the Tynemouth professional, Wilson, who varied his pace finely, bowled really well and had the excellent return of 7 for 43. While Bland and Childe were together it looked as if Tynedale might save the game and Bland hit two 6's. With their dismissal, however, the end now came and Tynedale had suffered their first defeat.

Morpeth, winning by 93 runs in the match at Denton, owed their victory in good measure to a sterling performance by Tom Robson, who, batting for a little over two hours, scored 113, including two 6's and nine 4's. Morpeth commenced in a shaky manner, losing their first two wickets for six runs, and having only 47 at 4. Then Robson and J. Bell took the total to 110, Robson continuing until ninth out, while Craig had another useful over.

Benwell Hill never shaped as a winning side and the scoring was very slow. Then with a draw in sight they pay too freely with Marshall (4-26) and Curray (5-21) and ten minutes from time were all out for 99. Only six batsmen were bowled in the match.

USHER'S INNINGS

County, who won at Backworth by 122 runs, batted first and made 174 in 150 minutes off 50 overs (four maidens) before declaring with six wickets down. The batting of Usher, who followed up previous League innings of 41, 5, 38 not out, 36 not out, and 92, with a delightfully played 66, was voted the best seen at Backworth for a long time. He had a six and nine 4's.

Mackay and Usher made 52 for the second wicket and Usher and March 45 for the third.

Backworth made a very bad start, 11 for 4, and at the fall of the seventh wicket the total was only 19. Fenwick alone made it possible for them to get to 52, off 21.4 overs, and J. W. Morland finished off the innings with 3 for 7 in the course of ten deliveries. The innings lasted an hour.

Moralee and Manners gave Blyth a good start at Old Benwell, putting 42 runs on for the first wicket, but the only other stand of note was for the eighth wicket, which produced 30 runs. At the end of 33 overs Blyth were all out for 126 and Milne had 5 for 44 in 22 overs. The brothers Milburn opened for Benwell, but were soon parted, E. Milburn leaving at six, H. Milburn and Scott then took the score to 46, Lough and Callon followed with useful scores, and Benwell won by six wickets in 51 overs.

Close House broke their losing sequence at Percy Main, where the home side, resigned to defeat after the fall of their eighth wicket, tried to force a draw. The last of the Percy batsmen would not trouble to run; they simply pursued the task of staying in. There was great excitement as the time wore on, and there was only a minute or so left for play when Adamson got past the defence of L. Hunter.

W. S. SHIELD

Close House opened, and after R. L. Henderson had left at 30, W. S. Shield and Adamson carried the score to 98. This had been increased to 165 when Shield was out for 90. He was seldom in difficulties, and, excepting for a chance cocked up to mid-off when he was 62, played his shots correctly. Percy Main got the next four wickets for one run, but the tail wagged and after two hours and 40 minutes Close House declared at 221 for nine.

Percy Main were handicapped by the lack of Rhind's services in the attack, after three overs, owing to shoulder trouble.

Shield was the chief medium of bringing about Percy Main's discomfiture, because there was every chance of a drawn match until he was introduced into the attack, and his googlies got him four wickets.

South Northumberland defeated Wallsend at the Roseworth Terrace Ground, Gosforth, by three wickets after Wallsend, batting first, had made 145. Wallsend lost three wickets for eight. Lavers and Adamson then added 40 runs, and after the fifth wicket had fallen without increasing the total Gray and Lavers took the score to 100. Dodds, third change, came in very useful with four wickets.

"South," after losing their first wicket for 13, had useful scores, but it was only Malcolm Steele who made a win possible. In second wicket down, he was not out for 64. Crozier was his best partner.

MEDOMSLEY BATTING NOT GOOD ENOUGH

Richardson's Bowling Feat at Greenside

Cold wind at Blackfyne did not reduce the keenness of the players in a match that would have been well supported on a warm afternoon, and as it was, drew a useful-sized crowd. All real cricket enthusiasts, surely, or they would not have been there under winter sport conditions. The weakness of the Medomsley batting, when put to a searching test, gave Consett too little to do, when it was their turn to bat on a pitch unlikely to help a bowler of Elsdon's type. Both teams are strong in bowling, in a general way, but Consett have the better batting side, and only in an exceptional way could Medomsley have prevented the champions making the 79 runs needed to win, when they had from 4.50 to get them.

Medomsley had no big total of their own to play about with—to throw the ball up to get the bone batsmen to give catches—and Consett had the advantage, through batting second, of knowing what they had to do.

Medomsley, against Latchford (down wind) and Dyson unchanged, were put out in 85 minutes for 75. They had 48 on for three, but the sixth, seventh, eighth, ninth, and tenth wickets fell for an addition of only nine runs, after half the side had been, out for 69, the last four "making" but three runs.

Latchford had three chances missed off his bowling, the ball being difficult to hold off snicks on such a cold afternoon, as against the dropping ball, but bowled well, and beat most of the batsmen. Dyson, giving a sample of his real bowling form, took more wickets, six, but the professional had the better figures, as will be seen from the following:—

Dyson got the first wicket with a catch, at 9, and Latchford the second, at 30, in an over uncomfortable to the outgoing

batsman. Reynolds, who shaped confidently in making 20 out of 48, was bowled by Dyson in trying to cover a leg ball that swung in and Elsdon had the mortifying experience of seeing his sticks disturbed by a Dyson ball he made no attempt to play.

Dyson was making the ball bend, and to make matters worse for Medomsley, Latchford beat Pattinson playing forward, got both Hurst and Armstrong to turn the ball into the safe hands of Ellison at forward short leg, and took a catch himself low down at slip. Dyson finished off the innings with this, then a catch by Whaley at mid off, and a ball that bowled Hodgson round his legs, taking the middle stump.

Though Latchford was lbw. at 9, swinging over a straight ball that kept low, Consett got the runs without undue trouble. W. wicket partnership between Williamson and Armstrong came in very useful. Armstrong, dropped when four, hit the next two balls for sixes. Dunn (5 for 52) had three for eight at one period.

When Chester-le-Street declared at Wood Terrace after scoring 156 for 8, leaving South Shields less than two hours to bat, a draw appeared likely, but poor batting against the sound bowling of Robson and Bewick, unchanged, led to the champions' defeat by 82 runs.
