BURY AND WEST SUFFOLK v. THE OPTIMISTS VISITORS WIN ON VICTORY GROUND

Playing on the Victory Ground, Bury St. Edmunds, on Monday, the Optimists completed their short East Anglian tour with a win over the West Suffolk side, an unfinished match against East Norfolk, and a defeat by Sir Pierce Lacy's XI, comprising the other games of the tour.

Battling first on an easy wicket, with a fast outfield, the home side, after an inauspicious start, losing their first three wickets for 25 runs, had, thanks to Capt. Beauford and B. W. Rought-Rought, 112 on the board before the next wicket fell. At that total, however, five wickets fell, and the whole side were out for 122. Losing two wickets for 50, the visitors were not suspiciously placed, but the hundred was passed before the fourth fell and the runs hit off after the fall of the sixth. S. H. W. Levey, who just failed to reach his 1,000 runs during May in the previous game, achieved the result in this with a steady contribution of 61.

Maurice Lacy and Covill opened the home innings, but, with only 15 on the board, Covill put one up to silly mid-on, and six runs later Lacy, who claimed 17 of the total, fell to an excellent catch at square-leg. A. A. Burgess was bowled at 25, but the slump was stopped with Capt. Beauford and B. W. Rought-Rought together, the partnership being uninterrupted when the sides came in for lunch, with the score at 99. Beauford having just previously passed his half-century. A separation was effected three overs after the resumption, when Rought-Rought was caught at short slip with the total at 112. Without any addition, Beauford, who claimed 63 of the 91 added during his stay, and had hit six 4's, was bowled, and the three following batsmen were sent back without scoring, two from leg-before decisions and E. J. Lancaster as the result of a slip snap by Abruenniel, E. R. Heywood left at 122, and Abrahams finished off the innings in the same over by dismissing Girkin. Abrahams' five wickets were obtained in sixteen overs, and Levey's four in three overs less. The only extras came from a wide ball.

Against the bowling of Heywood and Covill, the visitors made slow progress, only 19 runs coming in thirty minutes, during which time Covill had disposed of L. Abrahams and W. N. D. Hitchins. Heywood gave place to A. C. Bailey, and 13 came off his first over, although two palpable chances in the slips went begging. With A. A. Burgess on at Covill's end, the 50 was up after forty-five minutes. Although C. H. Girkin relieved Bailey, runs continued to come, and the total had reached 76 before the next wicket fell, following an lbw appeal. At the tea adjournment, the score was 86 for three. Covill and Heywood bowled on resuming, but the hundred was passed with S. Levey and L. d'Aubrenniel together. Eight runs later the latter was out to Heywood, and at 116 Levey was well caught in the slips off Bailey. Having seen 103 added during his stay, Levey had six 4's in his 61. The runs were hit off without further loss, but play was continued, at the request of the visitors, to mark their appreciation of the ground.

COLCHESTER AND EAST ESSEX v. B. K. CASTOR'S XI

Some prominent figures in the cricket world were at the Colchester Castle Park yesterday when Colchester and East Essex entertained a team selected by Mr. B. K. Castor, the popular secretary of the Essex County Club. Mr. Castor's eleven included such well-known personalities as F. St. G. Unwin (the Essex amateur), Mr. H. M. Morris (a former Essex skipper), and Messrs. A. R. Tanner, J. Dainty, H. F. Piper, and T. P. Laine. In addition to Mr. Castor himself.

The conditions at first looked dismal, rain did not materially affect the match, apart from a short delay after the lunch interval, and in the afternoon the sun broke through the clouds to complete the pleasure of an interesting all-day match.

Battling first, Colchester and East Essex did not fare too well against the bowling of Piper and Willis, and wickets fell with depressing regularity. The situation of Brooks at the sixth wicket, the wicket-keeper took a turn for the better, and when he was joined by Crowther a stand ensued in which the score was carried from 81 to 118, before the latter played a ball from Piper on to his wicket, after having scored a bright 17. With the addition of only six runs, the last wicket fell, and the home side thus showed the quite creditable total of 124, of which Brooks scored 40 without the loss of his wicket, he hitting six boundaries. Piper bowled consistently well for the visiting side, his analysis showing four wickets for 25 runs in eleven overs, five of which were maidens. Willis took four wickets for 41 runs, and Tanner two for 18.

The visiting side opened their bats, and their first three wickets, which included that of F. St. G. Unwin, had fallen with only six runs on the board, but when Lawrence was joined by Tanner which looked like a catastrophe was averted, and 54 invaluable runs were put out, a spinner who had scored 37, went at 60, and with one more run added, Lawrence followed. Morris and Piper, however, contrived to add a further 47 runs, and Piper settled down to the bowling and delighted the spectators with some fine hitting all round the wicket, subsequently giving his side victory with a spectacular "sixer." Before falling victim to a ball from Crannis, he scored a rousing 55, hitting nine boundaries, two of which were for "sixes." The side was eventually dismissed for 148 runs.
