Do YOU Agree That— CLUB CRICKET Lacks Personalities?

Is club cricket as attractive to watch to-day as it was a decade ago?

I apologise for treading this well-worn path of controversy (writes "Cassio") but I hand on an interesting opinion—that of an ex-Herts batsman, who has forsaken the playing arena for the spectators' benches.

As keen and enthusiastic as ever for the welfare of the game, he is seriously perturbed. "Where are the personalities in the sides to attract the crowds?" he asks.

The reason, he submits, for the alleged falling off in interest amongst the public,

is due to the style of play adopted by young players.

Safety Measures

Blaming the cricket schools run by professionals, his words are interesting. He says:

"Most young players coached at these schools in London learn to adopt safety measures. Their style of play is built on the foundations of defence, and they argue, quite correctly, that runs will come if they stay at the wicket. This may be true of county cricket, but I am certain that it does not pay in club matches.

"It is the same with the bowlers. They bowl to keep runs down, and if they begin to get hit, trundle balls down outside the off-stump.

"I am not claiming that we were better cricketers, but the game a decade or so ago was far more attractive. Of that I am certain."

Cricket Notes.

A. KING'S 102 IN 88 MINUTES

Time Thwarts Hitchin at Bedford

A brilliant century by Tony King, of Hitchin, was the outstanding individual feat in North Herts and South Beds cricket circles on Saturday. His score of 102 was compiled in eighty-eight minutes, and it included sixteen 4's and nine 2's.

Opposing Bedford, on the latter's ground, Hitchin had an early shock when J. D. Waters was lbw to Kenney for a duck with only one run on the score-board. W. V. Stanley then helped King to take the score to 132 before being caught, and when King left four runs later he had made 102 out of the 136. Subsequently Sid Brown made 35 (which included six boundaries) and Barker hit five four's in a useful contribution of 26, so that Hitchin finally totalled 222.

D. D. Audley, who opened for Bedford with R. Kenney, played a grand fighting innings of 52 before being run out with the score at 109 for four wickets, but five more wickets fell while 15 runs were being added, and Hitchin looked like snatching a thrilling victory. However, they were thwarted by a last-wicket stand by R. Hawkes and R. Ferriman, and had to be content with a draw, though they held the overwhelming lead of 83 runs when stumps were drawn.

REVENGE FOR THREE COUNTIES

Visiting Leavesden without Eric Birchumshaw on Wednesday last week, Three Counties Hospital squared accounts with their hosts, who had already won at Three Counties. After dismissing Leavesden for 167, Three Counties had lost six wickets for 60 and eight for 102.

Then Fogmore joined Mayes, and these two set about their job with grim determination and eventually won the game for their side.

Both played grand cricket, and deserved every credit for a great victory.

HENLOW RECOVER.

Another good recovery, though not quite so thrilling because it came in the first innings of the match, was that of Henlow against the Cardington Airmen. After losing five wickets for 28 runs, Henlow were saved by a sixth wicket partnership of 51 by Jordan and R. V. Lynn, and eventually made 123.

The Airmen had scored 52 by the time their third wicket fell, but after that they steadily lost ground and were out for 92.

Russell had his best day for the Henlow Club, taking seven wickets for 18 runs in 8.7 overs.

Henlow II also won their match against Three Counties "A" at Arlesley, and here again two players changed the whole complexion of the game. Batting most disappointingly, Henlow had seven wickets down for 47 when R. Russell and R. Leggatt came to the rescue, and they were chiefly responsible for the total reaching 93. Russell had five fours in his 28 not out.

With a lowly total up against them, Three Counties collapsed sensationally against the bowling of Mayes, who took the first seven wickets for 22 runs, and the side were skittled out in under the hour for 69. Of these, Bramall was responsible for no fewer than 47, carrying his bat right through the innings. He had a most fortunate existence, however, being missed six times.

CLARKSON AGAIN

Once again P. Clarkson has been the saviour of the Stevenage side. At Broxbourne on Saturday, he played a fine innings of 56 not out and thus helped his club to put together the respectable total of 132.

Midway through their innings, Broxbourne appeared certain to pass this score, but the tail failed to wag, and they fell short by nine runs. L. Watson took five of their wickets for 32 runs, and G. Field 3 for 28.

Stevenage II completed a "double" for the club by an overwhelming victory at home against Little Wymondley. The villagers were put out for 88, C. Minnis taking 6 for 20 in nine overs, and the early Stevenage batsmen soon exceeded this total, J. Allison making 58, and J. Boorman and D. Walker 32 and 38 respectively.

NARROW VICTORIES

Thanks to Dearden's innings of 51, a sterling solo effort when the other batsmen were coming and going all too quickly, Knebworth Park totalled 120 against Hertford II at Hertford, after being 42 for 5.

Dearden also bowled with success at the start of the Hertford innings, and he and Scott had dismissed eight men for only 80 when Clibbon and Ellis made a stand which carried the home side to a one-wicket win.

Another one-wicket victory was that of Hitchin United at Graveley in a match featured by big hitting.

Seven 6's and forty 4's were recorded during the day. For the United, Alf. Wingate hit three 6's and six 4's in his 47, and Les Armitage seven 4's in his 43 not out, and W. Pettit (Graveley) made seven 4's in his 44.

The United's victory was an exciting one, being principally due to a last-wicket stand by Armitage and B. Bridges, the latter making an invaluable 13 not out. A Mead, of the Hitchin team, was the most successful bowler, with 6 for 37.

KIMPTON'S POOR SEASON.

In their last home game, Kimpton suffered a heavy defeat against Luton Boys' Club, and from a results point of view they have had an unusually poor season. Bowling unchanged for the visitors, Matthews and Jones ran through the Kimpton team for the meagre score of 45, and only Gerald Cain, who hit a six, got double figures. Slack fielding was partly responsible for the Luton team making 80 for five wickets, although two of their players were run out in attempting to steal short runs.

KING'S WALDEN WIN.

With eight second eleven players in the side, King's Walden triumphed over Barclays Bank by two wickets, after a good fighting finish, the scores being 142 and 148 for eight wickets. For the winners, J. Parkyn hit up 57, and H. Maltby 35.

E. Harper captured seven wickets for 21 runs in helping Offley to beat Luton Hoo by 95 to 62. For the losers, Brammer also took seven wickets, at a cost of 39 runs.

S. WRAY AGAIN IN FORM.

S. Wray, of Preston, was again in form with the ball against Weston, who were defeated on their own ground by 135 to 49, but the best all-round performance of the game—and one of the best of the day in the district—was that of B. Lubbock, of Preston, who scored a half-century before being run out, and then took six Weston wickets for only 24 runs.

THE ICKNIELD WAY!

For a pleasant game of skittles, however, the match at Old Hale Way, Hitchin, between Ransom's C.C. and the Icknield C.C., takes the biscuit this week.

Ransom's were out for 55, Massey taking 5 for 28 and Darlow 5 for 12, and the Icknield lads were then disposed of for a mere 25, J. Swerder (who, incidentally, made top score of 17 for his side) taking 6 for 6, and J. Chappelle 2 for 10. Seven of the 11 players got ducks!
